Organ recital, Saturday 29 January at 5.30pm

Jonathan Hellyer Jones is Precentor, College Organist and Director of College Music at Magdalene College, Cambridge. He has established an international reputation, both in this country and abroad, as a baroque specialist and performer, on both organ and harpsichord, of the music of the 17th and 18th centuries. He has performed on the organ and harpsichord in France, Germany, Sweden, Austria, Italy, Mexico, the USA, and Japan. Jonathan is also Director of the Cambridge Baroque Camerata and has toured widely in the UK, in France and Mexico, appearing on TV and radio.

Parish Administration Ordinance, Parish Electoral Roll

A new ordinance is implemented for the 2011 AGM. This requires that an electoral roll is completed, with each eligible parishioner signing a declaration. The roll is closed two weeks before the AGM. The declaration is "I declare that I am a baptised and communicant member of the Anglican Church of Australia, aged at least 18 years old, that I regularly attend worship in this parish and that I am not an elector of another parish."

To be a communicant member of the Anglican Church of Australia, you must have received communion in an Anglican Church on three occasions during the last twelve months, one of which must have been Easter. In 2011, as part of the introduction of the new Ordinance, the Bishop proposes to take a wide meaning of Easter to include all the Sundays up to Pentecost (4 April 2010-23 May 2010). In 2012, the more traditional understanding of the Octave of Easter (being Easter Day and the following seven days, 24 April 2011-1 May 2011) will be used.

Please take time today to check that you are eligible, and to sign the roll. If you are not listed on the 2011 electoral roll, and you are eligible to be on the roll, please complete the separate form and place in the wall safe. The electoral roll will be available on Sundays in January and on Sunday 6 February. Forms will be available at the back of the cathedral during the week, please complete one and place in the wall safe.
