The three days at over this weekend – All Hallows Eve on Saturday, All Saints on Sunday, and All Souls on Monday, are some of my favourite celebrations in our Church Year. From the Cathedral's Director of Music, Peter Guy...

It's interesting to see that some small choral concerts are starting to pop up again in NSW. Perhaps you'll be fortunate to see the Song Company perform this week in Newcastle, or be able to get to a performance in Sydney. What I find fascinating is that two upcoming concerts in Sydney feature choral groups returning to singing with a setting of the Requiem - one by Faure and the other by Durufle. Beautiful music, nourishment for the soul, and a divine prayer to rescue us from the "lion's mouth" and the "deep lake". I think that says something about how musicians are feeling about the current restrictions!

In the normal course of events, Monday evening's All Souls Requiem would have seen the choir singing Durufle's hauntingly beautiful setting based on the ancient plainsong melodies. Singing this momentous work with only five people would be impossible, so I'm grateful that five of the gentlemen of the Cathedral Choir will gather to sing the Missa pro Defunctus to the Gregorian Chants on which Durufle bases his work. Our worship is different at the moment, but I am excited to experience in our worship these ancient melodies which link us to countless generations of saints who have gone before us. I hope that you can join us in prayer and worship as we remember those near to us who have died, give thanks for their life, and pray for their souls. Requiem aeternam dona eis, Domine, et lux perpetua luceat eis.

Assets Register - Coping with Copes!

On Monday, 19 October four parishioners met in the Bishops' Vestry to start recording many of the wonderful textile treasures held in cupboards and drawers. It was decided to start with the cope cupboard and amongst the new ones were found many others. The one of great interest was Bishop Batty's. When it was described to us by former Canon Residentiary Fr Laurie McIntyre, we realised the shield-shaped "hood" depicting the Virgin and Child was not attached. After more searching, it was located. The back shows where the cope has faded in the area outside where the "hood" sits. It will need some repairs but on the whole is still in good order.

FACT SHEET No.6 SAFE ENTRY AND EXIT OF THE CHURCH BUILDING COVID-19 SAFE RETURN TO CHURCH FRAMEWORK STEP TWO

The **health and safety** of all workers, volunteers and participants attending our sites is paramount. The increase in the numbers of parishioners that are now able to attend sites brings some additional complexities in moving people safely into and out of our buildings.

Requirements of the Parish:

Entry

- ✓ The church site will not open until 15 minutes before the service. Any access to the site should remain closed until this time.
- On booking, parishioners must be advised that they should proceed directly to the entry point of the building and not to gather in the carpark or waiting area.
- ✓ A designated entry point should be established, and parishioners asked to social distance while moving into the building.
- ✓ An authorised representative must be designated to direct parishioners to their seats. This will ensure that social distancing is complied with and only the allocated seating is used.
- ✓ The parish must develop a plan to move parishioners safely into their allocated seating. This plan must include details of what order seats will be filled to avoid pushing past occupied seating.

Exiting

- ✓ At the conclusion of the service the Incumbent, Churchwarden or Authorised Representative must direct parishioners on how to safely leave the building.
- ✓ The whole congregation should not leave the building at the same time, small groups should be asked to leave with the groups closest to the exit point leaving first.
- ✓ The church site will be closed 15 minutes after the service. A reminder must be provided to leave the site directly after the service. This should be monitored by the Churchwarden or Authorised Representative.



CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

Our concern is for the health and wellbeing of all people who come to this church. Together we can help make our community and our church COVID-19 safe.

By entering this church, you acknowledge that there remains a risk that you may contract COVID-19.

We ask that you:

- Please do not attend if you are feeling unwell.
- Please do not attend if you have returned from overseas within the last 14 days.
- Please do not attend if you have returned from a Government listed COVID-19 hotspot within the last 14 days.
- Please do not attend if you have been in contact with a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19 in the last 14 days.
- Please consider your personal situation including any pre-existing medical conditions or whether you fall within a high-risk category to determine if additional personal precautions should be taken.

Information on how to attend worship is found below. Pre-registration is encouraged or register on arrival. We are required to keep a register of those attending. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

Please contact Dean Katherine 0407 201 693 if you have any questions or concerns. **Those attending worship are strongly encouraged to wear a face mask.** In the Cathedral, the maximum size of a congregation at this time is capped around 180, which also includes adherence to the rule of four-square metres of space for every person present. At St Peter's Hamilton, the maximum congregational size is 50.
