Dear Parish Family,

This weekend we celebrate our Feast of Title, Christ the King. Like Peter Guy in his Notes this week, I too find it ironic that due to the change last year in the date of the Supercar event in Newcastle, this year we were looking forward to observing our Patronal Festival with great celebration. Instead this year our celebrations are somewhat less than we had hoped, but our joy and thanksgiving will be undiminished.

This week we heard the sad news that Beryl Wafer had died. Some may remember Beryl and her husband Eric as faithful members of the Sunday 7.00am congregation. In the past couple of years, they have worshipped closer to their home in the parish Belmont North-Redhead. Beryl was a very faithful and prayerful member of Mothers' Union, and we give thanks for Beryl's life and contribution to the life of the Cathedral.

In the pewslip this weekend, you'll see information about a wonderful Advent Prayer Resource. As it says in the resource, it "was compiled, by the grace of God, as a gift to the church, by members of St John's Anglican Church, Newcastle." Not only will you find daily reflections on Scripture, but also notes and family ideas, and suggested music to listen to each day. Finally, as I pondered a poem for this week, I remember Percy Bysshe Shelley's poem 'Ozymandias' Shelley's famous poem depicts the desolation of a forgotten empire, and, in the context for this week, a reminder that earthly power is transient ('My name is Ozymandias, king of kings:/ Look on my works, ye Mighty, and despair!'/ Nothing beside remains.), but the reign of God is eternal. Less well known is that Shelley's poem was written as part of a friendly competition with Horace Smith, who also wrote a poem with the same title and theme. Smith's poem, like Shelley's makes us also wonder what legacy we leave behind.

In Egypt's sandy silence, all alone,
Stands a gigantic Leg, which far off throws
The only shadow that the Desert knows:—
"I am great OZYMANDIAS," saith the stone,
"The King of Kings; this mighty City shows
The wonders of my hand."— The City's gone,—
Naught but the Leg remaining to disclose
The site of this forgotten Babylon.

We wonder,—and some Hunter may express
Wonder like ours, when thro' the wilderness
Where London stood, holding the Wolf in chace,
He meets some fragment huge, and stops to guess
What powerful but unrecorded race
Once dwelt in that annihilated place.



From the Cathedral's Director of Music, Peter Guy...

I suspect that many of you reading these notes might not have grown up in the 1990s, but may still be familiar with the pop song "Ironic" by Canadian artist, Alanis Morisset. I can't help but be drawn back to my teenage years and hear this song when I think that this week, for the first time in four years, we should be celebrating our first non-V8-Supercar-impacted Feast of Title. There would have been an orchestral mass, trumpets, soloists, choir, loud organ... And then there was Coronavirus... Isn't it ironic?

I am grateful, however, for some gentlemen from the choir who will once again be singing some plainsong for us this morning. This offers a different space for us to worship in, but one which (I hope!) will draw us into communion with God through our Universal Christ who, by the spirit, connects us to all creation and each other. I hope that this morning's music may assist in you in experiencing that reality.

I'm also grateful for the continued collaboration I enjoy with David Banney which results this morning in 5 of the cathedral choristers singing a(nother!) premiere of a mass setting at St John's Cooks Hill. This is the spirit of the hub in action, and I'm thankful for the invitation from St John's for us to be part of their worship in this way.

Further to the Report from the Parish Council in last week's pew sheet, some more information on the financial position of the Parish is provided below.

The COVID-19 restrictions have been crushing for the plans envisaged at the start of the year for the new merged Parish and existing income streams. We have been able to recover a lot from the mid-year financial position, reducing the deficit for the year by the end of October to \$10,341. This has been achieved through JobKeeper payments, offertory giving (many have changed to online giving) and donations, especially from the Cathedral Shop and for flowers. In the last 2 months the Shop has donated \$2,500 which is amazing considering the period that the Church doors have been closed!

It is difficult to forecast our end of year financial position given we are now in the extended JobKeeper program and it is not yet known what restrictions may be in place in December, our busiest month. The net extended JobKeeper payment for this month was 40% down on the average net JobKeeper payments received so far. At best we are expecting the end of year income and expenses to match, but there could be some debt from the previous year still to be cleared.

Assets Register - Coping with Copes!

A cupboard has revealed some wonderful copes which we started on sorting and now need to document. We have had a peep into other drawers and this is a wonderful stole found amongst other to be documented.

Celtic Design Goldwork Stole

This magnificent goldwork stole features beautiful Celtic designs, using images of the wild goose, which is Celtic symbol of the Holy Spirit. There are intricate knotwork designs which end with stylised Wild Goose heads – knotwork designs in Celtic imagery are symbols of eternal life or eternity or infinity. At the base of the stole is an interesting depiction of a pelican – again a Celtic symbol, this time of Christ. The pelican was believed to feed its young by plucking at its breast and the young were fed by the pelican's blood. (Another example of this imagery is found in the centre of the altar cross in the St Michael or Warrior chapel.) At the top of the stole we find more intricate knotwork, this time three linked circles, representing the Trinity, and eternity.



We will do more documentation this month and thank the volunteers who have now joined the group. No experience is necessary and we have all the silver and many other precious articles and items to record. 

FACT SHEET No.6 SAFE ENTRY AND EXIT OF THE CHURCH BUILDING

COVID-19 SAFE RETURN TO CHURCH FRAMEWORK STEP TWO

The **health and safety** of all workers, volunteers and participants attending our sites is paramount. The increase in the numbers of parishioners that are now able to attend sites brings some additional complexities in moving people safely into and out of our buildings.

Requirements of the Parish:

Entry

- ✓ The church site will not open until 15 minutes before the service. Any access to the site should remain closed until this time.
- On booking, parishioners must be advised that they should proceed directly to the entry point of the building and not to gather in the carpark or waiting area.
- ✓ A designated entry point should be established, and parishioners asked to social distance while
 moving into the building.
- ✓ An authorised representative must be designated to direct parishioners to their seats. This will ensure that social distancing is complied with and only the allocated seating is used.
- ✓ The parish must develop a plan to move parishioners safely into their allocated seating. This plan must include details of what order seats will be filled to avoid pushing past occupied seating.

Exiting

- ✓ At the conclusion of the service the Incumbent, Churchwarden or Authorised Representative must direct parishioners on how to safely leave the building.
- ✓ The whole congregation should not leave the building at the same time, small groups should be asked to leave with the groups closest to the exit point leaving first.
- ✓ The church site will be closed 15 minutes after the service. A reminder must be provided to leave the
 site directly after the service. This should be monitored by the Churchwarden or Authorised
 Representative.



CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

Our concern is for the health and wellbeing of all people who come to this church. Together we can help make our community and our church COVID-19 safe.

By entering this church, you acknowledge that there remains a risk that you may contract COVID-19.

We ask that you:

- Please do not attend if you are feeling unwell.
- Please do not attend if you have returned from overseas within the last 14 days.
- Please do not attend if you have returned from a Government listed COVID-19 hotspot within the last 14 days.
- Please do not attend if you have been in contact with a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19 in the last 14 days.
- Please consider your personal situation including any pre-existing medical conditions or whether you fall within a high-risk category to determine if additional personal precautions should be taken.

Information on how to attend worship is found below. Pre-registration is encouraged or register on arrival. We are required to keep a register of those attending. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

Please contact Dean Katherine 0407 201 693 if you have any questions or concerns. Those attending worship are strongly encouraged to wear a face mask. In the Cathedral, the maximum size of a congregation at this time is capped around 180, which also includes adherence to the rule of four-square metres of space for every person present. At St Peter's Hamilton, the maximum congregational size is 50.
