



Dear Parish Family,

What a difference a week makes! I think it's fair to say that we all had hoped that 2021 would have started somewhat differently to the way that it has. Overwhelmingly, though, I am heartened by the majority of comments I've heard which have been giving thanks for the strong community response to care for one another, and equally voicing prayers and concerns for places throughout the world where the experience of COVID-19 has not been the same as ours.

Thank you for your understanding as we move back into COVID-19 restrictions. I too am saddened that we are not able to sing together at the moment, and I know you will join with me in prayer and support for Peter Guy, our Director of Music, Organist and Master of Choristers, and the members of our choirs at this time. By following these directions at this time, we join in showing leadership in caring for the wider community so that we may once again sing and hear our choirs in full again.

I also strongly encourage you to wear masks whilst attending worship.

In the last few weeks we have seen the importance of rapid contact tracing. This is facilitated through electronic registration using the NSW Health App which sends the registration details directly to the Health Department. We have been told that within the next two weeks, the government will make QR Codes mandatory for places of worship. I know that using the QR Code is sometimes time consuming and frustrating, but I ask your patience as we navigate this next stage of registration. For those without a smartphone or whose phone isn't compatible, you will be able to register electronically using an online form. Thank you for your understanding, especially with your fellow parishioners as we learn this new system.

Angela and I have both received lovely feedback this week about sermons we've preached which people have viewed online. One person rang from Canada to share their thanks! Our online ministry reaches people and places we've never had the opportunity to connect with before. Finally, this week's poem by James McAuley uses wonderful baptismal imagery, whilst drawing on the story of Naaman (2 Kings 5) who has a strong response to being asked to immerse himself seven times. The second part of the sonnet reminds me of G.K. Chesterton's 'The Convert' with its magnificent final line "Because my name is Lazarus and I live." Our baptism calls us to live fully. No matter what 2021 holds for us, may we always live fully.

QR Codes – Frequently Asked Questions

What is the QR Code?

QR codes are a common of electronic check-in system which operate like barcodes, with information that can be read by a smartphone camera.

Why do I need to use it?

It is a hygienic, contactless way of recording your attendance for faster contact tracing. At the moment, it is mandatory for attendees at weddings and funerals. We expect that it will soon be mandatory for places of worship.

How does the QR Code work?

Open your smartphone camera and point it at the code square. A notification should come up on the top of the screen on your phone, taking you to the Service NSW App. Login with your details and follow the prompts.

How do I get the App?

You can download the Service NSW App from the App Store.

I've checked in. It says I need to show a member of staff. What do I do now?

Please show your phone screen to a sidesperson, who will mark your name off the list if you have pre-registered or note your attendance for tally purposes.

Can I register multiple people on my device?

Yes. You can register dependents. If you register other people with you, if contact tracing is required, you will be contacted on behalf of these people.

I don't have a smartphone./ My smartphone doesn't recognise the QR Code. What do I do?

Please see one of the sidespeople who will record your attendance on the online form. Thanks for your patience as we learn the new system.

Do I still need to register to attend worship?

It's helpful if we have an idea beforehand about numbers attending services. We'd hate for you to turn up and for there not to be a space for you!

I forgot to check out! Is that a problem?

No. :)

What happens to my personal information?

Your information is sent directly to Service NSW. This means it is readily available for NSW Health to access if it becomes necessary.

Where can I find more information?

This website is helpful, https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/covid-safe/customer-record-keeping/qr-codes with a handy video at the end of the page. Please ask the Dean, the Sub Dean, a Warden, or a Parish Council if you have any concerns.

We have taken measures to ensure that the Cathedral is a safe environment for all.

FACT SHEET No.6 SAFE ENTRY AND EXIT OF THE CHURCH BUILDING

COVID-19 SAFE RETURN TO CHURCH FRAMEWORK STEP TWO

The **health and safety** of all workers, volunteers and participants attending our sites is paramount. The increase in the numbers of parishioners that are now able to attend sites brings some additional complexities in moving people safely into and out of our buildings.

Requirements of the Parish:

Entry

- ✓ The church site will not open until 15 minutes before the service. Any access to the site should remain closed until this time.
- On booking, parishioners must be advised that they should proceed directly to the entry point of the building and not to gather in the carpark or waiting area.
- ✓ A designated entry point should be established, and parishioners asked to social distance while
 moving into the building.
- ✓ An authorised representative must be designated to direct parishioners to their seats. This will ensure that social distancing is complied with and only the allocated seating is used.
- ✓ The parish must develop a plan to move parishioners safely into their allocated seating. This plan must include details of what order seats will be filled to avoid pushing past occupied seating.

Exiting

- ✓ At the conclusion of the service the Incumbent, Churchwarden or Authorised Representative must direct parishioners on how to safely leave the building.
- ✓ The whole congregation should not leave the building at the same time, small groups should be asked to leave with the groups closest to the exit point leaving first.
- ✓ The church site will be closed 15 minutes after the service. A reminder must be provided to leave the
 site directly after the service. This should be monitored by the Churchwarden or Authorised
 Representative.
