Dear Parish Family,

Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen indeed! Alleluia!

It was simply glorious to gather in the Cathedral and St Peter's and keep the Triduum – The Great Three days. Sunday in particular was a day of rejoicing, as I reflected on how different Easter 2020 had felt. We owe enormous thanks to Peter Guy, our director of Music, our choristers, for their exquisite music. Thanks also to Veronica Butcher, Naomi Johnson and the Family Ministry Team lead a wonderful and memorable Family Service on Good Friday. Suzanne Evans once again excelled in filling the Cathedral with spectacular floral arrangements – and our thanks goes to Suzanne and those whose generosity enabled such a joy-filled display. Thanks also to our serving team, assisting clergy, to Robert Gummow, our readers, those who cleaned, and our tireless sidespeople who assisted with our worship.



I know that for many, it was emotional to once again receive the sacrament in both kinds. As I wrote last week, “No one is obliged to receive from the chalice – the fullness of the sacrament is fully present in one kind. You are asked to refrain from intinction (dipping the host into the consecrated wine) please. As always, I encourage you to maintain good hand hygiene, using hand sanitiser and keeping physical distancing where practicable.” As restrictions continue to ease, you will notice that the physical distancing “ties” have been released in the Cathedral. We are still encouraged to maintain appropriate physical distancing where practicable – and – after a year of doing so, I think we are all well experienced!

Likewise, with our increased capacity, there is no longer a need to pre-register

to attend. Please scan the QR Code when you arrive at St Peter's or the Cathedral, and, if you are unable to scan the code, please record your attendance and contact details on the sheet provided.

On Sunday we recommence our 7.00am *Book of Common Prayer* Eucharist. This Eucharist will be celebrated in the St Michael or Warrior Chapel. On Sunday evening, following Evensong, I'm delighted that we are able to host the launch of Fiona Pfennigworth's *Psalms Illuminated*.

Please join me (and invite others!) for the book launch, the exhibition of some of the original artworks, and the opportunity to hear the Hunter Handbell Ringers as part of the evening. Copies of the book will be available for purchase on the night (\$60). There is more information about this even in the pewslip.

Next week, our family Ministry Team are also holding a three day Kids Club with the theme "What happens after Easter?". There is information about this in the pewslip as well, and flyers at the Cathedral and St Peter's. Please share with any families you know.

Finally, this week's poem reflects that during this Easter week, at Morning Prayer and at the Eucharist, we hear resurrection appearance stories. The witness of the women cannot be denied, especially as first witnesses. And yet, over time, their agency has been diminished, despite the clarity of the Scriptures. Elizabeth Jennings poem writes from the perspective of those who were first to see and believe, balancing despair and delight.

The Resurrection

I was the one who waited in the garden
Doubting the morning and the early light.
I watched the mist lift off its own soft burden,
Permitting not believing my own sight.

If there were sudden noises I dismissed
Them as trick of sound, a sleight of hand.
Not by a natural joy could I be blessed
Or trust a thing I could not understand.

Maybe I was a shadow thrown by one
Who, weeping, came to lift away the stone,
Or was I but the path on which the sun,
Too heavy for itself, was loosed and thrown?

I heard the voices and the recognition
And love like kisses heard behind thin walls.
Were they my tears which fell, a real contrition
Or simply April with its waterfalls?

It was by negatives I learnt my place.
The Garden went on growing and I sensed
A sudden breeze that blew across my face.
Despair returned but now it danced, it danced.

From the Director of Music ...

It is our usual custom that The Second Sunday of Easter, or "Low Sunday", would be an opportunity for the choir to have a well-deserved rest. After Christmas last year the choir had a weekend off, and then we realised that restrictions had changed and we were once again prevented from singing. So as to avoid tempting fate, the choir will be with us for the 10am and 6pm liturgies on Sunday, for which I am grateful. After the "extravaganza" that was Holy Week and Easter, the music is a little lighter, but no less significant, this week. The settings for the Eucharist and Evensong are Wood's Short Setting in the Phrygian Mode and Tallis's Short Service in the Dorian Mode, respectively. Both of these are excellent examples of these masters of composition and liturgical music understanding the need for the music to be the "handmaid of the liturgy".

The postludes on Sunday contain a definite French flavour. At the Eucharist, Vierne's Hymne au Soleil punctuates the morning with its vibrant, dance-like rhythms and musical ideas. It is perhaps a little "pagan" to suggest that it is evocative of a tribal ritual dance at the coming of the new light. At Evensong, the liturgy concludes with the Fantasia Alla Marcia of Denis Bédard. Bedard, a French Canadian organist, has gained quite an international reputation in the past decade for his accessible, yet colourful and dramatic, organ compositions for performance and liturgy alike.

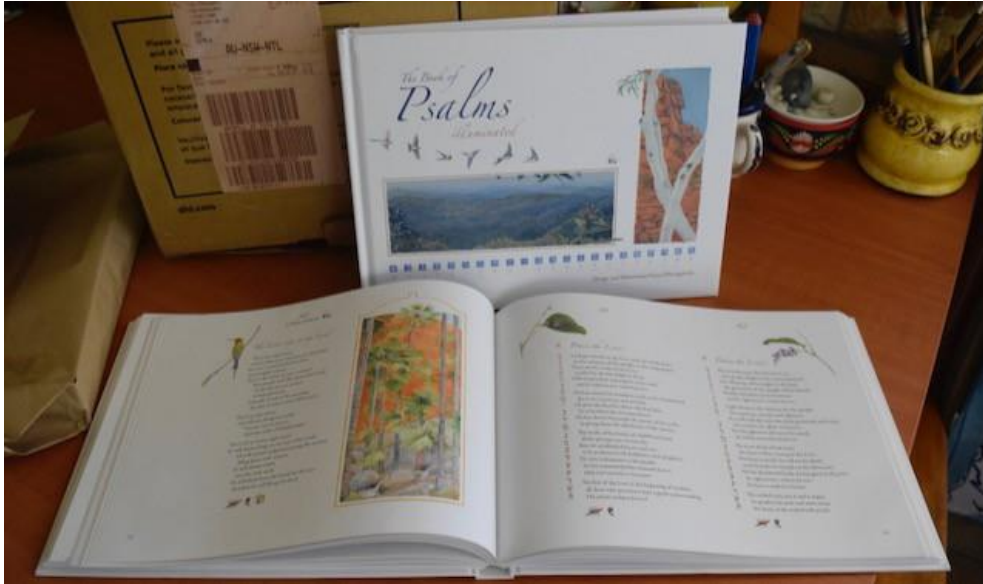

The Book of Psalms illuminated

Newcastle book event and painting exhibition

Christ Church Anglican Cathedral after Sunday Evensong 11 April
7.15pm & ongoing exhibition of original works



In joy and grief, doubt and shining trust in the LORD their God, the ancient Hebrew poets expressed in their psalms the experience of those on the journey of faith. This book is a window inviting you to see them afresh and sing them today: the poets' images transplanted into Australian soil, and their poetry celebrated in the patterns of the text.

In hardcover, 208 pages, *Psalms illuminated* elegantly presents the entire collection in the English Standard Version, with over 250 full-colour illustrations of Tasmania, the Kimberley WA, Gariwerd (The Grampians) Victoria, the Red Centre NT, and the Hunter, NSW.

The volume concludes discussing the artist's exploration of the psalms and their commonly-used words, and for each psalm, (very) brief notes and title of its illustration connecting it to the text.

Chrism Eucharist 2021

Every year at the Chrism Eucharist on Maundy Thursday, there is an invitation issued to all bishops and clergy to the Mother Church of the Diocese, Christ Church Cathedral, to renew their ordination vows and their commitment to the Good News of Jesus Christ. At this service, oils are blessed for use across the Diocese; the oil for the sick, anointing with the healing presence of Christ; the oil of baptism, anointing with the victory of Christ over sin and death to those He calls by name.



These are the copes which our three bishops wear and the chasuble for the celebrant or presider. The shield shaped hood at the back of the cope has an **ophrey which is an embroidered band.**

QR Codes – Frequently Asked Questions

What is the QR Code?

QR codes are a common of electronic check-in system which operate like barcodes, with information that can be read by a smartphone camera.

Why do I need to use it?

It is a hygienic, contactless way of recording your attendance for faster contact tracing. At the moment, it is mandatory for attendees at weddings and funerals. We expect that it will soon be mandatory for places of worship.

How does the QR Code work?

Open your smartphone camera and point it at the code square. A notification should come up on the top of the screen on your phone, taking you to the Service NSW App. Login with your details and follow the prompts.

How do I get the App?

You can download the Service NSW App from the App Store.

I've checked in. It says I need to show a member of staff. What do I do now?

Please show your phone screen to a sidesperson, who will mark your name off the list if you have pre-registered or note your attendance for tally purposes.

Can I register multiple people on my device?

Yes. You can register dependents. If you register other people with you, if contact tracing is required, you will be contacted on behalf of these people.

I don't have a smartphone./ My smartphone doesn't recognise the QR Code. What do I do?

Please see one of the sidespeople who will record your attendance on the online form. Thanks for your patience as we learn the new system.

Do I still need to register to attend worship?

It's helpful if we have an idea beforehand about numbers attending services. We'd hate for you to turn up and for there not to be a space for you!

I forgot to check out! Is that a problem?

No. :)

What happens to my personal information?

Your information is sent directly to Service NSW. This means it is readily available for NSW Health to access if it becomes necessary.

Where can I find more information? This website is helpful, <https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/covid-safe/customer-record-keeping/qr-codes> with a handy video at the end of the page. Please ask the Dean, the Sub Dean, a Warden, or a Parish Council if you have any concerns.
