Dean Katherine continues to be on leave until midweek.



Poem for Easter: All the blond Jesuses March 29, 2018

All the blond Jesuses

You see them wriggle free of windows, lithe as silver fish, but golden-haired. These Jesuses, blond sons of blond Marys, head out the door to play cricket, with leather and willow in sudden whites. St Dorothy joins in, and its all fruit and flowers and UK May, as Jesuses bloom like jonquils on the soft field. Sometimes a Jesus will stop for a while, and an almost-frown appear. He recalls another day, when he was darker skinned, darker haired, and his reaching hands caught iron, not the ball flicked to slip like an idea. Oranges smile like cut suns. The stumped Jesus reconciles himself to this easier gig, amongst teammates all as blond and as quick as wit itself. He scampers between wickets, wood kinder than when he cried, and slumped and died, before the dark cave, and its inconstant rock.

From the Director of Music ...

The beautiful thing about the Eucharist (well, one of the beautiful things about the Eucharist) is that it connects us with the church beyond time and space; it is not only a sacramental action within the present moment, but draws us into the communion of saints that have gone before and that are yet to come. Our liturgical texts provide that same connection with the church that has run the race before us, and our rich history of music serves only to amplify that. Such is the reason that we can sing Palestrina's Missa Brevis on a Sunday morning in 21st century Newcastle, and it speaks to us in both old and new ways.

If one of the great results of the English reformation was Cranmer's work on creating the liturgy of Evensong, one of the down sides was perhaps that a lot of Latin music for the Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis fell into obscurity. On a trip to England in 2018 I was quite taken by a contemporary setting of the Magnificat (in Latin) by David Bevan... I was disappointed that it was in 8 parts and just a stretch beyond our choir. But if necessity is the mother of invention, it's also the mother of composition, and it inspired me to write the setting that we hear at Evensong. Based on plainsong tones, the setting serves to colour the text without the music "getting in the way". I hope that it assists you in uniting your prayers this Sunday evening with all the saints beyond our temporal and geographical limitations.



ABM - Partners in Mission PRAYER SUPPORT FOR THE PEOPLE OF MYANMAR

Like others around the world the **Anglican Board of Mission** was profoundly saddened to learn about the Myanmar military taking control of government on 1 February 2021 and abandoning the country's path to full democracy. At the time, phone lines were cut but the internet remained connected. Since then communication has been sporadic with phone lines and the internet sometimes working, sometimes not.

On the day of the coup, the Archbishop of the Church in the Province of Myanmar (CPM), the Most Rev Stephen Than Myint Oo, requested CPM staff to restrain themselves in using social media with messages critical of the situation. Instead, His Grace asked the church to be calm and pray that the situation may improve. Since then, however, the situation has worsened with the ongoing killing of protesters.

The Church of the Province of Myanmar had its beginnings when the Church of India, Burma and Ceylon was established in 1813. On 28 August 1966 Bishop Francis Ah Mya became the first native bishop in the country and four years later the Church became an independent Anglican province.

Today the Church is made up of six dioceses (Hpa-an, Mandalay, Myitkyina, Sittwe, Toungoo and Yangon) and two missionary dioceses (Pathein and Pyay, both recently carved out of Yangon Diocese). The Archbishop is also Bishop of Yangon. ABM's work with CPM began about thirty years ago. And in the last fifteen years or so, because of generous supporters throughout Australia, we have been able to support CPM through our Church to Church and Community Development programs in a variety of ways – from small-scale projects such as Motorbikes for Mission, textbooks for discipleship training, and hymn books in Burmese and Karen languages, to transformative, large ongoing projects such as Church Capacity Development, Sustainable Agriculture, and Water and Sanitation.

ABM is continuing to send project funds to the church in Myanmar as and when we are able. ABM has also conducted several pilgrimages to church projects in Myanmar, the most recent of these in early 2020, just before COVID-19 hit.

The Myanmar Council of Churches released a statement calling for release of the President of Myanmar U Win Myint and State Counsellor Daw Aung San Suu Kyi. It also urges a spirit of reconciliation, and for all to be treated equally. It asks people of all faiths to pray for the peace, development, justice and hopes of all the people of Myanmar.

of what the future might bring.



Assets Register The Last of the old White/Gold Copes



If there are any experts in this field, we would love to hear from you. The detachable shield-shaped hoods have applied sacred monograms (IHS and cross; chalice and host on a cloud).

QR Codes – Frequently Asked Questions

What is the QR Code?

QR codes are a common of electronic check-in system which operate like barcodes, with information that can be read by a smartphone camera.

Why do I need to use it?

It is a hygienic, contactless way of recording your attendance for faster contact tracing. At the moment, it is mandatory for attendees at weddings and funerals. We expect that it will soon be mandatory for places of worship.

How does the QR Code work?

Open your smartphone camera and point it at the code square. A notification should come up on the top of the screen on your phone, taking you to the Service NSW App. Login with your details and follow the prompts.

How do I get the App?

You can download the Service NSW App from the App Store.

I've checked in. It says I need to show a member of staff. What do I do now?

Please show your phone screen to a sidesperson, who will mark your name off the list if you have pre-registered or note your attendance for tally purposes.

Can I register multiple people on my device?

Yes. You can register dependents. If you register other people with you, if contact tracing is required, you will be contacted on behalf of these people.

I don't have a smartphone. My smartphone doesn't recognise the QR Code. What do I do? Please see one of the sidespeople who will record your attendance on the online form. Thanks for your patience as we learn the new system.

Do I still need to register to attend worship?

It's helpful if we have an idea beforehand about numbers attending services. We'd hate for you to turn up and for there not to be a space for you!

I forgot to check out! Is that a problem?

No. :)

What happens to my personal information?

Your information is sent directly to Service NSW. This means it is readily available for NSW Health to access if it becomes necessary.

Where can I find more information? This website is helpful, https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/covid-safe/customer-record-keeping/qr-codes with a handy video at the end of the page. Please ask the Dean, a Warden, or a Parish Council member if you have any concerns.
