

Finally, this week's poem is by Evelyn Underhill, a great modern Anglican mystic. This weekend we, with many places, celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi, also known as Thanksgiving for Holy Communion. Underhill's poem bears reading and rereading. The cosmic, mystic, vision takes us to the heart of the Divine, embracing all creation, and then, finally, an understanding of the offering – and sacrifice - of our lives "He on our altars, we on the world's rood." The final image, that of being a living Eucharist, reminds us that not only are we called to be people of thanksgiving (eucharisto εὐχαριστῶ - I give thanks) but also that we are called to bear the bread of life to a hungry world.

## **Corpus Christi**

Come, dear Heart! The fields are white to harvest: come and see As in a glass the timeless mystery Of love, whereby we feed On God, our bread indeed. Torn by the sickles, see him share the smart Of travailing Creation: maimed, despised, Yet by his lovers the more dearly prized Because for us he lays his beauty down-Last toll paid by Perfection for our loss! Trace on these fields his everlasting Cross, And o'er the stricken sheaves the Immortal Victim's crown. From far horizons came a Voice that said, 'Lo! from the hand of Death take thou thy daily bread.' Then I, awakening, saw A splendour burning in the heart of things:

The flame of living love which lights the law

Of mystic death that works the mystic birth.

I knew the patient passion of the earth,

Maternal, everlasting, whence there springs

The Bread of Angels and the life of man.

Now in each blade I, blind no longer, see The glory of God's growth: know it to be An earnest of the Immemorial Plan. Yea, I have understood How all things are one great oblation made: He on our altars, we on the world's rood. Even as this corn, Earth-born, We are snatched from the sod; Reaped, ground to grist, Crushed and tormented in the Mills of God, And offered at Life's hands, a living Eucharist.



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# ABM - Mission News

#### THE REV'D GLORIA SHIPP HAS MOVED!

After many years of tireless ministry in Dubbo, Gloria and her husband, Eddy, have moved back to Nyngan, where Gloria grew up. But last night Gloria's former Anglican parish of Dubbo held a special celebration of thanksgiving for her ministry there since the time she was ordained in 1996. The parish has named the main room in their church hall "The Gloria Shipp Room" (see photo).

Gloria continues her Walkabout Ministries work from Nyngan and remains in touch with her Elders group and ministry friends in Dubbo. Invitations have already been sent for an Elders' Outreach Reconciliation Luncheon in Nyngan in July, and for a Women of the Bible discussion later this month.

ABM's Executive Director, Rev'd Dr John Deane, sent a special letter of appreciation to Gloria: "Your pioneering ministry and commitment to the people God has placed around you are an inspiration to many. ABM give thanks for the thoughtful, wholehearted, and generous ways that you have served God and made Christ manifest through your ministry in Dubbo."

We know you will join us in giving thanks for Gloria's extraordinary ministry in Dubbo, and in wishing her well for the years ahead in Nyngan.



# **Our own missionary**

On Wednesday at a Eucharist, we celebrated the life of a faithful priest and missionary. Fr Philip Thirlwell offered himself to ABM and in 1961 he entered The House of the Epiphany at Stanmore to train for missionary service. He and Margaret served in Fiji from 1962 to 1973.

In 2018 both he and Margaret were given The Coaldrake Medal. The Coaldrake Medal, named after the Rev'd Canon Frank Coaldrake, who served as a missionary and later as Chairman of the ABM Board, is a means to recognise the valuable contribution of former ABM missionaries and staff members.



His love for the church and people in Fiji was ever present. He often spoke of St Christopher's Orphanage in Fiji – which the students at Newcastle Grammar School had visited and supported. He was a man of strong faith, social justice and peace. We thank God for all his support for the work of ABM at the cathedral.

# Assets Register – Stoles

The stoles in the drawer below have some exquisite embroidery. The origins of these are yet to be found out.

Stoles, like many vestments, went out of favour in the English Reformation but saw a revival in the 19<sup>th</sup> Century. Only clergy wear stoles. Deacons wear them on their left shoulder crossed diagonally over the chest and Priests and Bishops wear them over the neck, each end hanging parallel. They are in liturgical colours.



Below a deacon and priest wear stoles – it is generally considered the unique badge of the ordained ministry and is conferred at Ordination – hence its wearing distinguishing between deacons and priests.

## ABM EMERGENCY APPEAL FOR GAZA

#### ABM EMERGENCY APPEAL FOR GAZA

Conflict in Gaza has escalated this week, with at least 67 Gazans killed during Israeliair attacks. At least seven people have also been killed by Hamas rockets fired into Israel. Hundreds more have been injured and many homes destroyed.

The escalation was triggered by two recent developments. Firstly, Israeli settlers have lodged a case in Israel's Supreme Court to evict a number of Palestinian families from their homes in Sheikh Jarrah, a mainly Palestinian neighbourhood of East Jerusalem. Secondly, Palestinians and Israeli police clashed at a Muslim holy site, al-Aqsa Mosque, last Monday.

The escalation of conflict occurs as Gaza struggles with a new wave of COVID, reaching 1000 new cases per day in April. As ABM partner Al Ahli Hospital observed, 'There are not enough beds or oxygen for patients.'

For those ABM supporters wishing to assist families affected by the latest conflict, ABM has launched an appeal. Funds will go to ABM's partner, the Al Ahli Hospital, for services for those affected in Gaza.

# **QR Codes – Frequently Asked Questions**

#### What is the QR Code?

QR codes are a common of electronic check-in system which operate like barcodes, with information that can be read by a smartphone camera.

#### Why do I need to use it?

It is a hygienic, contactless way of recording your attendance for faster contact tracing. At the moment, it is mandatory for attendees at weddings and funerals. We expect that it will soon be mandatory for places of worship.

#### How does the QR Code work?

Open your smartphone camera and point it at the code square. A notification should come up on the top of the screen on your phone, taking you to the Service NSW App. Login with your details and follow the prompts.

#### How do I get the App?

You can download the Service NSW App from the App Store.

#### I've checked in. It says I need to show a member of staff. What do I do now?

Please show your phone screen to a sidesperson, who will mark your name off the list if you have pre-registered or note your attendance for tally purposes.

#### Can I register multiple people on my device?

Yes. You can register dependents. If you register other people with you, if contact tracing is required, you will be contacted on behalf of these people.

#### I don't have a smartphone./ My smartphone doesn't recognise the QR Code. What do I do?

Please see one of the sidespeople who will record your attendance on the online form. Thanks for your patience as we learn the new system.

#### Do I still need to register to attend worship?

It's helpful if we have an idea beforehand about numbers attending services. We'd hate for you to turn up and for there not to be a space for you!

#### I forgot to check out! Is that a problem?

No. :)

#### What happens to my personal information?

Your information is sent directly to Service NSW. This means it is readily available for NSW Health to access if it becomes necessary.

Where can I find more information? This website is helpful, <u>https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/covid-safe/customer-record-keeping/qr-codes</u> with a handy video at the end of the page. Please ask the Dean, a Warden, or a Parish Council member if you have any concerns.
