

Dear Parish Family,

As the weather has turned decidedly wintry this week, I am thankful for your generous support of the Community Lunch Programme, the Samaritans, especially the Samaritans winter Appeal, and of course the Free community Pantry in the Cathedral grounds. This is a practical expression of the living of our faith, and our care for the most vulnerable in our community.

During this week, the report of The Anglican Church of Australia's first known national research into family violence within faith communities was released. The National Anglican Family Violence Project (NAFVP) investigated the prevalence, experience, and impact of family violence for those who identify as Anglicans in Australia. Brochures are also available at both the Cathedral and St Peter's about Family and Domestic violence.

Parish Council met this week, and our discussions covered a wide range from finances, appointing a bookkeeper (as we do not have a Treasurer), purchasing defibrillators for our church buildings and hall, maintenance, to ways to further engage with the community, and much else besides. Please speak with one of the members of Parish Council for more information.

Finally, this week's poem is by R S Thomas. I have a feeling I may have shared this poem with you before, so please forgive me if I feel it bears reading once more. The parable of the mustard seed challenges us to think about the kingdom, and Denise Levertov's poem about the mustard seed (https://www.saltproject.org/progressive-christian-blog/2018/6/12/on-the-parables-of-the-mustard-seed-by-denise-levertov) lead me to remember this poem of R S Thomas, in which the kingdom is both a long way off and here, and subverts the accepted order. (And, in unrelated, this week on Tuesday, we give remember Evelyn Underhill, who was the author of last week's poem. Maybe search out some of her poems to read on Tuesday!)

The Kingdom

It's a long way off but inside it
There are quite different things going on:
Festivals at which the poor man
Is king and the consumptive is
Healed; mirrors in which the blind look
At themselves and love looks at them
Back; and industry is for mending
The bent bones and the minds fractured
By life. It's a long way off, but to get
There takes no time and admission
Is free, if you purge yourself
Of desire, and present yourself with
Your need only and the simple offering
Of your faith, green as a leaf.



ABM - Mission NewsTHE COMING OF THE LIGHT



LIGHT CAME, LIGHT CONTINUES TO COME, AND THE LIGHT WILL CONTINUE TO SHINE.

1 July, 2021 marks the 150th anniversary of The Coming of the Light to the Torres Strait Islands. The London Missionary Society with Melanesian leaders landed on the shores of Erub (Darnley Island) and introduced the Bible to the people who lived there. This event, The Coming of the Light, is an integral part of cultural identity to Torres Strait Islander peoples and there is much joy on the anniversary each year.

When the ship, Surprise, landed on Erub in 1871 it brought with it the message of Jesus, who heralded a way of peace and non-violence. The Revd Canon Victor Joseph says, "The best thing it brought is that violence began to cease among the islands." These visitors to the Torres Strait were welcomed in peace. The tribal leaders called for no weapons, receiving them in peace, open to what they were bringing.

It must be stated that the LMS missionaries did not bring God to the Torres Strait, rather the message of Jesus, through the Bible. God was on both sides of the beach that day, and since time immemorial.

Aunty McRose Elu recounts a story of when she was a child, asking her father, "Why they talking about the light, weren't our people already in the light? Why are they saying it was a coming of the light to the Torres Strait?" She goes onto say, "They explained to me it wasn't in the way of thinking that we were in the darkness, that we came out of darkness into light, it was like them bringing the light to us and we, bringing the light to them, and we also tell them, we have a light in our own surroundings, we have a spirituality, we have things that we believe in."

The celebration Coming of the Light is an important anniversary for the national Anglican church. It invites us to reflect on our national history, on the good and the bad. It invites us to celebrate mission and ministry, particularly within the Torres Strait, and it invites us to listen to the church in the Torres Strait, which is made up of vibrant communities of hope.

As Rev'd Victor says, "The light continues to come", and the 150th anniversary of the Coming of The Light is an opportunity for us to look for the Light, welcome it, and celebrate in joy.

QR Codes – Frequently Asked Questions

What is the QR Code?

QR codes are a common of electronic check-in system which operate like barcodes, with information that can be read by a smartphone camera.

Why do I need to use it?

It is a hygienic, contactless way of recording your attendance for faster contact tracing. At the moment, it is mandatory for attendees at weddings and funerals. We expect that it will soon be mandatory for places of worship.

How does the QR Code work?

Open your smartphone camera and point it at the code square. A notification should come up on the top of the screen on your phone, taking you to the Service NSW App. Login with your details and follow the prompts.

How do I get the App?

You can download the Service NSW App from the App Store.

I've checked in. It says I need to show a member of staff. What do I do now?

Please show your phone screen to a sidesperson, who will mark your name off the list if you have pre-registered or note your attendance for tally purposes.

Can I register multiple people on my device?

Yes. You can register dependents. If you register other people with you, if contact tracing is required, you will be contacted on behalf of these people.

I don't have a smartphone./ My smartphone doesn't recognise the QR Code. What do I do? Please see one of the sidespeople who will record your attendance on the online form. Thanks for your patience as we learn the new system.

Do I still need to register to attend worship?

It's helpful if we have an idea beforehand about numbers attending services. We'd hate for you to turn up and for there not to be a space for you!

I forgot to check out! Is that a problem?

No. :)

What happens to my personal information?

Your information is sent directly to Service NSW. This means it is readily available for NSW Health to access if it becomes necessary.

Where can I find more information? This website is helpful, https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/covid-safe/customer-record-keeping/qr-codes with a handy video at the end of the page. Please ask the Dean, a Warden, or a Parish Council member if you have any concerns.
