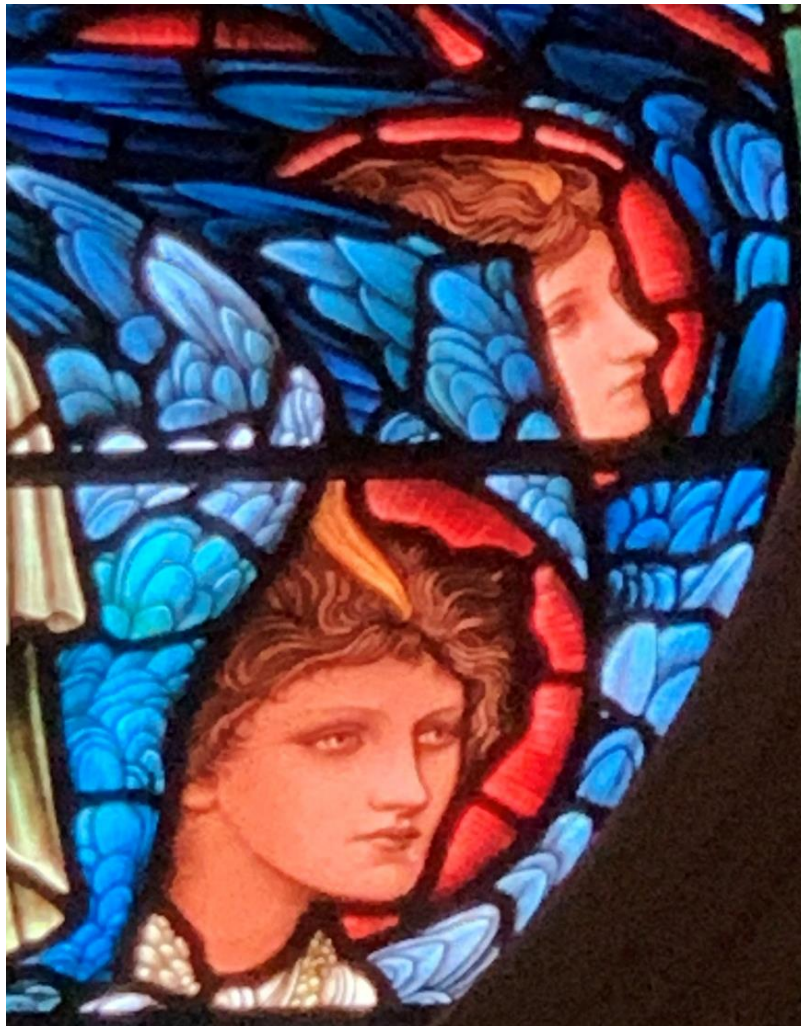

Dear Parish Family,

It has been wonderful to gather in person this week for worship. Thanks to everyone who joined in the livestream, and sent me messages to say that I was 'beaming'. As Bishop Peter said at 10.00am, we could have powered the city on Sunday with the sheer level of my excited energy at being back together. It was wonderful to hear ten of our choristers once more too!

Amidst all the excitement, is a really strong awareness that it is important that we ensure high levels of safety for all who are attending, and as we move around our communities. The last thing any of us want is a snap lockdown. As I write this today, we have seen a rise once more in the infection figures for the Hunter and New England. If you have any concerns or questions about our COVID-19 Safety plan, please contact me.

Thank you to everyone who cheerfully came prepared last week with vaccination certificates! One of the changes, with NSW reaching 80% fully vaccinated last weekend, is there is no longer an obligation to show your vaccination certificate, nor to be fully vaccinated to attend worship. Our choristers, and our clergy and servers, are all fully vaccinated.

I continue to monitor the changes carefully. Our next major change will happen when NSW reaches 90% fully vaccinated. At that point, we can all sing without masks, and we will be able to receive from the chalice once more. As we move carefully and safely to in person worship, I can't wait to welcome you back home to the Cathedral and St Peter's, when you feel it's right for you.

As I said last week, I'm thankful to Fr Daniel Dries at Christ Church St Laurence for this helpful summary of NSW Health and legal requirements for returning to worship in person.

WELCOME BACK, WELCOME HOME

- Please remember to maintain social-distancing inside and outside our church buildings.

REGISTERING ATTENDANCE

- Please use the QR Code to register your attendance.
- After scanning the QR code, please show the green tick to the sidesperson, who will invite you to take an order of service.
- If you are not using the QR code, please identify yourself to the sidesperson, who will record your name and phone number (in accordance with NSW Health regulations).

ENTERING THE CHURCH

- The Public Health Order requires masks to be worn in places of worship.
- Social distancing is to be maintained when seated, with 1 person per 4 square metres, except for family groups.
- Please sit in the pews marked 'Please sit here' which will be arranged to reflect social distancing requirements.

HOLY COMMUNION

- Holy Communion will be administered in one kind (no chalice) in the first stage of our return to church.
- Holy Communion will be distributed at Nave Sanctuary steps.
- Please remain in your pew until an usher invites you to come forward for Holy Communion and please maintain social distancing in the aisle.
- Please remove your face mask just before you receive Holy Communion.

SINGING

- The current Public Health Order does not permit congregational singing, although we expect this to change early in December.
- At 10.00am singing will be provided by our choristers. Thankfully, the revised Public Health Order permits groups of up to 10 fully-vaccinated, socially-distanced singers in places of worship.

REFRESHMENTS AFTER SERVICES

- Refreshments will not be served after any services, although we hope this will change in the coming weeks.

WEEKDAY SERVICES

- Weekday Eucharists have recommenced at the Cathedral and St Peter's, subject to all of the regulations listed above. Service times are listed in the pewslip.
- Entrance to all weekday services at the Cathedral will be through the St Christopher transept door (opposite the middle driveway).

Survey Update

You may remember that there was a letter from the Wardens in the pew sheet, on 19th Sept 2021, about building our future and regrowing our community post COVID. We indicated that we were keen to hear ideas from people and that we would, as a Parish Council, work on a Survey Monkey questionnaire for this purpose. We drafted and trialled questions with a sample of parishioners with a view to evaluating the calibre of questions. Thank you to those of you who provided us with such honest and valuable input. Your feedback will be discussed in more detail at our next Parish Council meeting.

Since embarking on this project there have been significant changes to Public Health orders regarding places of worship. As a result, we are reconsidering how to best design a survey which will inform a future strategic plan. Learnings from our trial questionnaire have provided us with valuable information for a more useful way for us to hear the voices of everyone who wishes to participate and share ideas for the future. 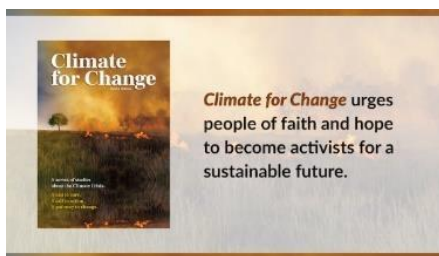

The next Community lunch take away will be this Sunday, October 24.

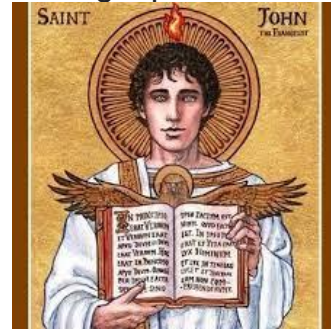

THE EAGLE LECTERN

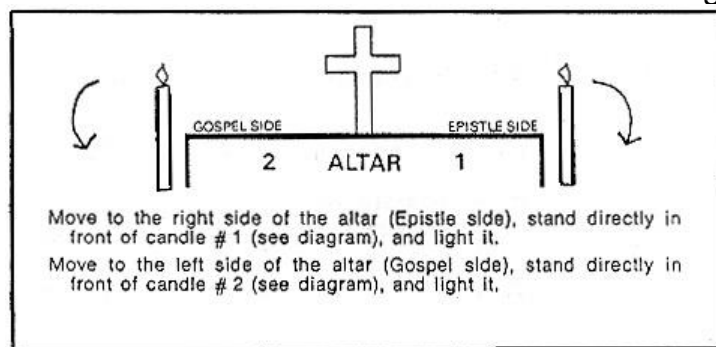


An eagle lectern is a lectern in the shape of an eagle on whose outstretched wings the Bible rests. ... The symbolism of the eagle derived from the belief that the bird was capable of staring into the sun and that Christians similarly were able to gaze unflinchingly at the revelation of the divine word.

The eagle is also **the symbol used to depict John the Apostle**, whose writing is said to most clearly witness the light and divinity of Christ. In art, John, as the presumed author of the Gospel, is often depicted with an eagle, which symbolises the height to which he rose in the first chapter of his gospel.



When the Bible is on the Altar, the Epistle is read on the right side (when facing the altar) and the Gospel on the left. The candles are lit and extinguished in an order so that the Gospel Candle never stands alight alone.

Afghanistan Emergency

19 October update:

Thank you for your heartfelt support! We're coordinating the best and safest way to send the funds to our local partner as they face the complexities of sanctions from the Taliban regime. Since August, many communities have left their hometowns for safer areas within Afghanistan while others have crossed the border into Pakistan seeking refuge. It is estimated that over 300,000 people have now been internally displaced and over 10,000 more have arrived in Pakistan looking for shelter, food and safety.

Our local partner on the ground is now supporting refugees arriving in Pakistan while continuing to work towards supporting communities displaced within Afghanistan.

They are currently preparing to provide emergency cash assistance to families so they can buy food and other essential needs. In the weeks and months ahead, they will continue to protect the lives and dignity of the many families affected by this crisis.

In August, Taliban forces took control of all Afghanistan's major cities. Almost 390,000 people have been displaced, and tens of thousands now need urgent humanitarian assistance. They are in crisis.

Families have hurriedly left their homes, bringing almost nothing with them. They're now in cramped, unsanitary camps that lack even the most basic medical and water facilities.

Despite the dangers involved, Act for Peace's local partner on the ground is working round the clock to meet the needs of uprooted families, but they need our help to do it.

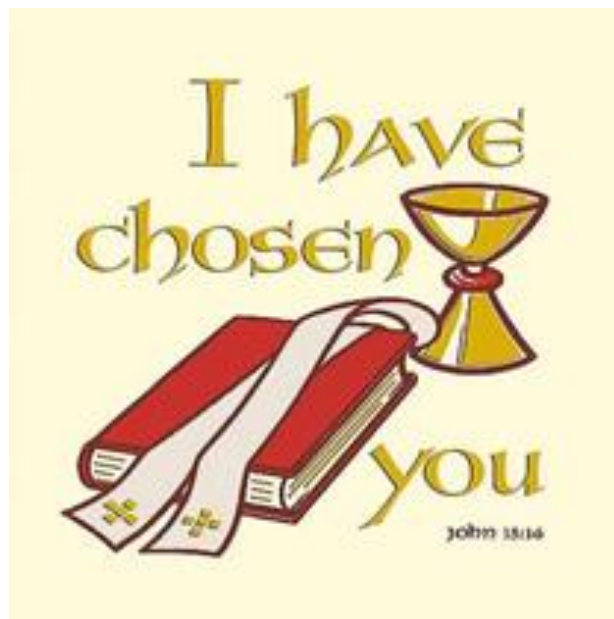

Summary of matters discussed at Parish Council meeting held on Zoom on 13 October 2021

- The PC sought quotes for updating and improving our website.
- Including Indigenous artwork in the cathedral is seen as important and members of PC are investigating this in consultation with local Awabakal elders.
- Discussions continues as to how to plan activities and connection with our parish family and the wider community as we emerge from Covid times. Different groups are meeting and coming up with plans. A survey is being devised to help decision making.
- Installation of defibrillator in the cathedral being investigated.
- The Dean reported on all the new arrangements for services and Covid safe return (elsewhere in pewsheets). The shop will open once 90% of state has been double vaccinated.
- Mr. Robert Gummow will be retiring at the end of the year after thirteen faithful years of service and the Dean and PC are reviewing the job description. More information to follow.
- Maintenance/Board matters - Leaking roofs at the Cathedral and St Peter's are being addressed. Several long outstanding problems in the Deanery are to be resolved. Hopefully, the peal of bells will be restored soon when a part is located.
- The Spirituality Group (14 members) under the leadership of Dr Julia Perry met on Zoom with Canon Andrew Eaton to learn more about the Diocesan Eco Group of which he is Chair. The group is enthusiastic to implement many of the recommendations that we can do in the parish. We are looking for any enthusiastic Eco Warriors!
- The Hub/Cluster Council (St John's, St Augustine's, and CCC/St Peter's) has been meeting on Zoom to plan for post-Covid getting together. Pam Brydges is our representative.

The net asset position continues to improve, largely due to the St Peters Hall rent and ServiceNSW payments. The debt to the Diocese is reducing and was \$36,497.68 at 30 Sep.

The Affinity Bookkeeping engagement is progressing well, and Lambourne Partners have nearly completed the 2020 audit and comments have been provided on their initial draft report. A final draft report is expected in the next 2 weeks for consideration by the Parish Council.



The team at the Refugee Hub, Catholic Care Social Services Hunter- Manning are working with Afghani families. From discussions, an opportunity has been created for Churches to mobilise their communities to support these families by way of blessing. The project is called 'Hampers of Hope'.

Supporting Afghan Refugees

In addition to the Hampers of Hope, we have received this request from the Hunter Social Justice Committee.

“A number of the Afghani evacuees have arrived in Newcastle recently and more are expected. They left their homes abruptly, and unable to bring anything with them.

There is an urgent need for support. While they have been provided with accommodation and practical support, there are some extra hurdles in setting up bank accounts so that they can begin receiving Centrelink payments. In the meantime, gift vouchers from Woolworths and Coles will enable them to buy food and clothing. Due to COVID19 restrictions it is difficult to receive goods at this time.

If you would like to donate please take gift vouchers to Adamstown Uniting Church, where Dianne will be in the office. Arrangements have been made for regular collection from the church and distribution to Settlement Services International in Newcastle who are responsible for settling in new arrivals.
