Dear Parish Family,

This week, we celebrate two of the most beautiful feasts of the Church – All Saints and All Souls. These are beautiful opportunities for us to remember and give thanks for the holy people who have shaped our lives.

Did you see the news on Sunday night? Thanks to NBN News, there was some lovely coverage of the return to in-person worship. If you missed it, you can catch up here: https://www.nbnnews.com.au/2021/10/24/hunter-learning-to-live-with-covid-19/ It continues to be wonderful to welcome you back to worship. This week, with the All Souls Requiem on Tuesday 2nd November at 6.00pm, and the Ordination to the Priesthood on Friday 5th November at 5.00pm, we have some very special opportunities to gather.

I was thankful that one of the shots in the NBN coverage showed all our COVIDSafe signage. We are taking our COVIDSafe provisions very seriously, especially at this time of concern within the Hunter and New England. One of the good things about both our church buildings is that there is plenty of space, and places to sit where you can maintain physical distancing, and still be part of the whole. Also, all choristers, clergy, and servers leading worship are fully vaccinated. If you have any worries about returning to in-person worship, please contact me so that I can hear your concerns. Once again, I'm thankful to Fr Daniel Dries at Christ Church St Laurence for this helpful summary of NSW Health and legal requirements for returning to worship in person.

ENTERING THE CHURCH

- The Public Health Order requires masks to be worn in places of worship.
- Social distancing is to be maintained when seated, with 1 person per 4 square metres, except for family groups.
- Please sit in the pews marked 'Please sit here' which will be arranged to reflect social distancing requirements.

HOLY COMMUNION

- Holy Communion will be administered in one kind (no chalice) in the first stage of our return to church.
- Holy Communion will be distributed at Nave Sanctuary steps.
- Please remain in your pew until an usher invites you to come forward for Holy Communion and please maintain social distancing in the aisle.
- Please remove your face mask just before you receive Holy Communion.

SINGING

- The current Public Health Order does not permit congregational singing, although we expect this to change early in December.
- At 10.00am singing will be provided by our choristers. Thankfully, the revised Public Health Order permits groups of up to 10 fully vaccinated, socially-distanced singers in places of worship.

• Refreshments will not be served after any services, although we hope this will change in the coming weeks.

NEW CHAPLAIN FOR BISHOP TYRRELL ANGLICAN COLLEGE

"Bishop Tyrrell is Jacqui's first Chaplaincy role in a school, and she says it was this community's faith story and holistic approach to learning that inspired her to consider a move to a school like Bishop Tyrrell.

"School for me was a time of questioning the meaning and purpose of everything. It's a privilege to join a school like this that values critical thinking and assists students in their own journey of asking the big questions at this stage in their lives."

"Young people are growing up in a world that has lost the sense that the dignity and purpose of human life are found in being made in the image of God. Instead, young people feel under enormous pressure to be 'winners' in life to believe they are worthwhile. This hinders their confidence and their willingness to learn by making mistakes."

"But shame and fear do not lead to flourishing human life; the message of the gospel is that care and dignity bring out the best in people. Every child needs to know that they are accepted and valued, not just for their achievements, but for the wholeness of who they are."

Jacqui hopes to nurture a healthy Christian community through Bishop Tyrrell's shared understanding that faith creates wholeness and balance in the community by giving students the confidence to pursue their unique gifts.





AUSTRALIA: NUNGALINYA COLLEGE

Nungalinya College in Darwin is a Combined Churches Training College for Indigenous Australians. The College is formally supported by the Anglican, Uniting and Catholic churches of the Northern Territory. Established in 1974, Nungalinya College equips men and women for leadership roles in churches and communities. Training programs explore the Christian faith contextually through courses in Foundation Studies, Bible Overview, Media, Music and Discipleship, Christian Ministry and Theology, and Bible Translation.

COVID-19 meant that students were unable to attend classes during part of 2020, but classes recommenced in Term 3 which was a busy and, at times, difficult season as there were many deaths and funerals and other sad happenings. College Principal, Ben



van Gelderen, reflects, "God is faithful to supply all our needs, and much deep learning and sharing was undertaken in the second half of the year. Some of the most memorable times were students sharing their learning through art, Testimony Tuesdays on Facebook, the inaugural Men's Class studying the life of Peter, and the Certificate IV in Theology/Ministry graduation. As always, our daily morning chapel services, featuring various languages and clans, were precious and unique times and a true taste of heaven."


In 2021 Nungalinya College is looking forward to introducing a new Faith and Family course focused on family well-being and domestic violence prevention, a new Art course focused on working in the Aboriginal art industry and integrating traditional artistic expressions with Christianity, the first Certificate II in Old Testament Overview, and the graduation of the first Diploma of Translating cohort.




ROBERT IS RETIRING!

Survey Update

You may remember that there was a letter from the Wardens in the pew sheet, on 19th Sept 2021, about building our future and regrowing our community post COVID. We indicated that we were keen to hear ideas from people and that we would, as a Parish Council, work on a Survey Monkey questionnaire for this purpose. We drafted and trialled questions with a sample of parishioners with a view to evaluating the calibre of questions. Thank you to those of you who provided us with such honest and valuable input. Your feedback will be discussed in more detail at our next Parish Council meeting.

Since embarking on this project there have been significant changes to Public Health orders regarding places of worship. As a result, we are reconsidering how to best design a survey which will inform a future strategic plan. Learnings from our trial questionnaire have provided us with valuable information for a more useful way for us to hear the voices of everyone who wishes to participate and share ideas for the future.
