Dear Parish Family,

It's been very exciting and encouraging to welcome more and more people home to the cathedral and St Peter's over the past few weeks. As fully vaccinated levels continue to rise, so regulations are being relaxed. As I said last week, the latest update to the NSW Roadmap has a change which I know will bring much rejoicing! **From this Sunday, fully vaccinated people are able to sing whilst wearing a mask.**

I know that this will bring great joy, and equally I am aware that for some it will also bring a measure of concern. To this end, at the moment, the only services which will have congregational singing will be 8.00am and 10.00am on Sundays at the cathedral, and Evensong when it returns on 28th November. This is to ensure that there are services available for any who would prefer to attend a Mass without congregational singing. **On Sunday, if you would like to sing, please show your vaccination certificate to the sidespeople in order to be given a hymnbook.**

Evensong will recommence on Sunday 28th November at 6.00pm. This will be the First Sunday in Advent, and I encourage you to mark the date now, and come along to celebrate the start of the new church year, and the recommencement of Evensong. If you have any worries about returning to in-person worship, please contact me so that I can hear your concerns.

As in previous weeks, here is a summary of NSW Health and legal requirements for returning to worship in person. My thanks to Fr Daniel Dries at Christ Church St Laurence for this.

WELCOME BACK, WELCOME HOME

• Please remember to maintain social-distancing inside and outside our church buildings.

REGISTERING ATTENDANCE

- Please use the QR Code to register your attendance.
- After scanning the QR code, please show the green tick to the sidesperson, who will invite you to take an order of service.

• If you are not using the QR code, please identify yourself to the sidesperson, who will record your name and phone number (in accordance with NSW Health regulations).

ENTERING THE CHURCH

- The Public Health Order requires masks to be worn in places of worship.
- Social distancing is to be maintained when seated, with 1 person per 2 square metres, except for family groups.

HOLY COMMUNION

• Holy Communion will be administered in one kind (no chalice) in the first stage of our return to church.

- Holy Communion will be distributed at Nave Sanctuary steps.
- Please remain in your pew until an usher invites you to come forward for Holy Communion and please maintain social distancing in the aisle.
- Please remove your face mask just before you receive Holy Communion.

SINGING

• Fully vaccinated congregation members are able to sing whilst wearing a mask. Please show your vaccination certificate to the sidespeople in order to be given a hymn book.

WEEKDAY SERVICES

• Weekday Eucharists have recommenced at the Cathedral and St Peter's, subject to all of the regulations listed above. Service times are listed in the pewslip.

- Entrance to all weekday services at the Cathedral will be through the St Christopher transept door (opposite the middle driveway).
- Evensong will recommence on **Sunday 28th November**.



Assets Register SANCTUARY LAMP - In memory of Dean Blow 9th Dean In many Christian churches there is an altar lamp, also known as a sanctuary or chancel lamp, which is found in the chancel (sanctuary), either hanging or fixed. In Anglican, Old Catholic and Roman Catholic churches, the chancel lamp burns before a tabernacle or ambry* to demonstrate the belief that Christ is present there through His Real Presence, as the Blessed Sacrament is reserved in these denominations.





* Items kept in an ambry include <u>chalices</u> and other vessels, as well as items for the <u>reserved sacrament</u>, the consecrated elements from the <u>Eucharist</u>. (The ambry is found in St Michael's Chapel)



PROJECT UPDATE: GOOD FRIDAY GIFT - HOLY LAND INSTITUTE FOR THE DEAF IN SALT, JORDAN

November, 2021

Your Good Friday Gift* in 2021 has enabled the Holy Land Institute for the Deaf in Salt, Jordan to offer affordable or free quality education to six deaf and blind children who can't afford to pay for these vital educational services. Your Gift has a snowballing effect, as it has also reduced the financial burden on six very low-income families and enabled them to keep their children at the school. Thus, the whole family, including other children, have benefited.

Strict eligibility criteria were applied to enable the six students to have significantly improved access to high quality education.

The school is located in a hillside town near Amman, the capital of Jordan. Founded in 1964, the Institute has been in an almost continual state of expansion, trying to meet some of the great needs in Jordan, Israel/Palestine and the wider Middle East. It has eight specialist departments which provide K to 12 education leading to university and other further education.

The Institute's Deaf-Blind unit is the only such facility in the Arabicspeaking Middle East.

Enabling these six children to remain in school and eventually have the opportunity to transition to higher levels of education such as college and university will mean they can achieve their dreams and improve their own and their families' quality of life in the future.

In a broader sense, our gift will also make a small contribution to national cohesion and peace building efforts. As more members of the community (scholarship beneficiaries and their families) experience the value of education and the importance of peaceful and harmonious co-existence with other members of the community, seeds of sustainable peace and stability will have been sown.

Significantly, it has also contributed to expanding educational space for vulnerable, orphaned, and marginalized children in the whole Anglican Province of Jerusalem and the Middle East.

In 2021 the Good Friday Gift sent a total of \$25,000 to the Diocese of Jerusalem for this project.

Continuous cuts and freezes to Medicare has forced Hunter Primary Care (HPC) to make the difficult decision to close the GP Access After Hours Service (GPAAH) at the Calvary Mater Hospital from Christmas Eve and reduce opening hours at the remaining four clinics across the region.

This reduction in services will be devastating news for up to 15,000 people who will be left without access to vital medical care.

The GPAAH Service reduces unnecessary emergency department presentations and hospitalisations, saving the health system approximately \$21.7 million every year.

This has been an essential service for tens of thousands of Newcastle families who rely upon bulk-billing GP services to access the healthcare they need, when they need it.

These changes will dramatically increase pressure on our already over stretched and under resourced emergency departments.
