

# Dear Parish Family,

I am very excited for the celebration of our Feast of Title on Sunday – the Feast of Christ the King. This will be my fifth Feast of Christ the King since I became the Dean – but my first one without Supercars and my first with our full choir! It will also be a bittersweet moment as we give thanks for Robert Gummow's faithful service as the Dean's Verger. As I've said over the past weeks, Robert has served as Dean's Verger for four Deans, three Bishops and two Sub-Deans, and has assisted countless members of the parish and beyond as they came to the cathedral to worship. I hope that you can join us on Sunday at either 8.00am or 10.00am for worship, and at The Cricketers Arms Hotel on Sunday at 6.00pm to wish Robert well as he moves into retirement.

I am also very excited about the return of Evensong, appropriately on Advent Sunday, the beginning of the new Church Year. Evensong is one of the liturgical jewels of Anglican worship and is a beautiful and prayerful way to commend the week to God.

It is always an honour to be involved with the Remembrance Day service in Civic Park each year, and then to be with the members of the War Widows Guild as they sprinkle the ashes from the crosses of remembrance on the Field of the Remembrance at the cathedral following this service. It was very moving to see Kevin Claydon lay a wreath with his daughter, Sharon Claydon MP, Member for Newcastle.





It was wonderful to be able to sing, albeit for those fully vaccinated behind masks, last Sunday. Our next change will occur when NSW reaches 95% fully vaccinated. As I have said previously, being vaccinated is a way in which we can share our care for the most vulnerable within our community. As part of ensuring that we are in line with the Public Health Orders, on Sunday, if you would like to sing, please show your vaccination certificate to the sidespeople in order to be given a hymnbook.

If you have any worries about returning to in-person worship, please contact me. Information about our COVID-Safe return to worship is found further in the pewslip.

I was saddened to hear over the weekend of the deaths of Bishop Bill Wright, Bishop of Maitland Newcastle, and of Bob Berghout, who with his wife Anita, were regular worshippers at the Cathedral. I know that you will join me in surrounding in prayer all mourn at this time. Rest eternal grant to them, O Lord, and let light perpetual shine upon them.



#### Dear Cathedral Parish family,





# **Assets Register Sanctuary Lamps**


Last week the memorial sanctuary lamp to Dean Blow was featured. Why he was only Dean for such a short time is explained in the media reports below from Dean Katherine.

In June 1950 the Australian National Airways Skymaster Amana, the flagship of the company's fleet, crashed into a wooded hillside northwest of York. Of the twenty-four passengers and five crew, only one man managed to get out alive. His name was Edgar W. Forwood, aged sixty-seven. Unfortunately, his condition steadily deteriorated and he died on Saturday of the same week. This crash is the worst aviation disaster in Western Australia's history.

'Dean Blow died in the 'Amana' plane crash in Western Australia in 1950. The Bishop of Riverina The Rt. Rev. Bishop C. Murray, Bishop of the Riverina also died in this accident. Dean Blow died at the site of the crash.'

### Return to Worship November 2021

#### WELCOME BACK, WELCOME HOME

• Please remember to maintain social-distancing inside and outside our church buildings.

#### REGISTERING ATTENDANCE

- Please use the QR Code to register your attendance.
- After scanning the QR code, please show the green tick to the sidesperson, who will invite you to take an order of service.
- If you are not using the QR code, please identify yourself to the sidesperson, who will record your name and phone number (in accordance with NSW Health regulations).

#### **ENTERING THE CHURCH**

- The Public Health Order requires masks to be worn in places of worship.
- Social distancing is to be maintained when seated, with 1 person per 2 square metres, except for family groups.

#### **HOLY COMMUNION**

- Holy Communion will be administered in one kind (no chalice) in the first stage of our return to church.
- Holy Communion will be distributed at Nave Sanctuary steps.
- Please remain in your pew until an usher invites you to come forward for Holy Communion and please maintain social distancing in the aisle.
- Please remove your face mask just before you receive Holy Communion.

#### **SINGING**

• Fully vaccinated congregation members are able to sing whilst wearing a mask. Please show your vaccination certificate to the sidespeople in order to be given a hymn book. At this stage, only Sunday services at the Cathedral will have congregational singing.

#### **WEEKDAY SERVICES**

- Weekday Eucharists have recommenced at the Cathedral and St Peter's, subject to all of the regulations listed above. Service times are listed in the pewslip.
- Entrance to all weekday services at the Cathedral will be through the St Christopher transept door (opposite the middle driveway).
- Evensong will recommence on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> November.



There is a plan to close both the King Street and Mayfield Centrelink offices. Centrelink has provided critical support to many Australians over the course of the pandemic. Any decision to close or reduce access to Centrelink shop-fronts impacts the most vulnerable in our community.

Continuous cuts and freezes to Medicare has forced Hunter Primary Care (HPC) to make the difficult decision to close the GP Access After Hours Service (GPAAH) at the Calvary Mater Hospital from Christmas Eve and reduce opening hours at the remaining four clinics across the region.

This reduction in services will be devastating news for up to 15,000 people who will be left without access to vital medical care.

The GPAAH Service reduces unnecessary emergency department presentations and hospitalisations, saving the health system approximately \$21.7 million every year.

This has been an essential service for tens of thousands of Newcastle families who rely upon bulk-billing GP services to access the healthcare they need, when they need it.

These changes will dramatically increase pressure on our already over stretched and under resourced emergency departments.
