Dear Parish Family,

Fittingly, it was wonderful to welcome a large congregation to Evensong on Sunday, as we began the new church year with the season of Advent, and rejoiced in the return of this choral worship jewel. Throughout Evensong this Advent, our guest preachers are reflecting on what it means to say 'Yes' to God. Fr Scott Dulley last week challenged us about Gabriel and saying yes to bearing a message (you can read the poem he quoted here: https://www.journeywithjesus.net/poemsandprayers/2432-gabriel-s-annunciation).

This Sunday evening, I am delighted to welcome Fr Andrew Doohan, the Dean of Sacred Heart Cathedral, as he leads us in reflecting on Joseph, and his 'Yes'. Please invite your friends to join with you this Advent for Evensong.

It was also good to welcome Mr Matthew Whatson to the Cathedral Staff team as the Dean's Verger. Matt has been worshipping at the Cathedral throughout the year, and in the last month has sung with the choir. Please introduce yourself to Matt. Matt will be formally commissioned for this ministry at both 8.00am and 10.00am on Sunday.

Our next major change with COVID-19 regulations occurs on December 15. From that date, we will no longer need to wear masks indoors, but we will still need to check in with the QR code. As the humidity rises, I'm sure we're all looking forward to signing without masks! However, at the moment, only those who are fully vaccinated are able to sing, albeit behind masks. As part of ensuring that we are in line with the Public Health Orders, on Sunday, if you would like to sing, please show your vaccination certificate to the sidespeople in order to be given a hymnbook. If you have any worries about returning to in-person worship, please contact me. Information about our COVID-Safe return to worship is found further in the pewslip. Here are a few highlights from this week's pewslip:

FAMILY FUN DAY: On the afternoon of Saturday 4th December, there's a Family Fun Day at the Cathedral, concluding with an outdoor eucharist with music from our St Nicholas Choir, and a BYO Picnic in the Cathedral grounds. *We have a wet weather plan, which we're hoping not to need!* Information is in the pewslip, and flyers are available to share with family and friends. ADVENT: There are lots of resources for Advent – individual, in-person, and online. Copies of PRAY Advent are available at St Peter's Hamilton and at the Cathedral. The Spirituality group begins their Advent study their week on, and Garratt Publishing has an online Advent talk series.

SAMARITANS: I have noticed increased use of the Free Parish Pantry in the cathedral grounds and have had more people knocking on the Deanery door asking for food assistance. The Samaritans provides a vital, compassionate service for those in need this Christmas. In the pewslip you can find ways to assist with gifts, food, and by financially supporting the lunch on Christmas Day.

Finally, this week's poem is by U.A Fanthorpe. Fanthorpe is well known and acclaimed in the United Kingdom, but less well known here (in my opinion). I feel this is a great pity, because as Richard Hendin told *The Guardian* in 2009 when Fanthorpe died, "You might find yourself in some provincial English market town, and happen upon a member of the W[omen's] I[nstitute] with a little stall selling marmalade, and that woman would look precisely like UA [Fanthorpe] – but what she was selling was not marmalade. What you got from her was amazing poetry that quietly de-centred you and made you think." That Fanthorpe's poetry does, through deceptively simple verse and direct language. The three final words of *I am Joseph* hang in the air: Joseph's gift and also his gift received.

I am Joseph

I am Joseph, carpenter, Of David's kingly line, I wanted an heir; discovered My wife's son wasn't mine.

I am an obstinate lover, Loved Mary for better or worse, Wouldn't stop loving when I found Someone Else came first.

Mine was the likeness I hoped for When the first-born man-child came. But nothing of him was me. I couldn't Even choose his name.

I am Joseph, who wanted To teach my own boy how to live. My lesson for my foster son: Endure. Love. Give. U.A.Fanthorpe 1929-2009

Summary of matters raised at Christ Church Cathedral Parish Council Meeting held on Zoom 10 November 2021 at 6pm

Website redesign – a proposal is to be taken to the Board for funding (1 December 2021).

Indigenous Artwork – An Awabakal Lake Macquarie elder has been consulted about the presence of an artwork in the Cathedral which was well received. The Cultural Engagement Office for Newcastle Council is to be consulted by The Dean and members of Parish Council. The idea of a group something like '**Friends of the Cathedral**' be formed to develop ideas to promote the cathedral in the wider community.

The purchase of a **Defibrillator** is being pursued at the moment.

Banners in the Quire – The rehanging of a few banners to be completed this month.

Robert Gummow – His farewell- 21 November Feast of Christ the King .The Dean and Parish Council acknowledged and thanked Robert Gummow for his many years of faithful service to four Deans and to the parish community. We owe a great debt of gratitude to Robert Gummow for his tireless work at the Cathedral. The verger's job description and his replacement are being acted upon.

The Dean's report included that the 7.00am will resume later in December. There is no Advent Carol service this year. **Christmas Services** – Two 'Nine Lessons and Carols' services in the week before Christmas. On Christmas Eve there will be two Family services (3.00pm and 5.00pm) and a Choral Vigil Mass at 7.30pm. On Christmas day there will be 7.00am and 9.00am at the Cathedral, and 8.00am at St Peter's. They will be ticketed events.



Safe Ministry/Children Ministry - Online training happening for our volunteers. 4th December – Family Fun Day.







More Sanctuary Lamps – St Christopher Chapel

Michael Erickson Memorial *

(Artist and manufacturer unknown)



This small sanctuary lamp is molded and hand finished silverware. The whole lamp is supported by three cherubim who have attached a trefoil at the nape of their neck through which three chain supports attach and then suspend from a domed cap and circlet. This attaches to a support bracket on the wall of the St Christopher Chapel. The lamp is engraved:

To the Glory of God and in memory of Michael Erickson, donor of this icon.

The lamp presented by Cathedral Parishioners

The Sanctuary Lamp was originally hung in the St Nicholas chapel prior to Montefiore Triptych being installed. It was installed above the icon of St Nicholas on the altar wall of the Chapel. The icon was organised by keeper of the Toc H Lamp, Mr Michael Erickson through the generosity of Mrs Nadia Pitts, an item she brought with her from the Monastery of Our Lady of Vladimir, during the Sino/Japanese war.

Unfortunately, the icon was stolen along with a set of William Mark candlesticks from the St Nicholas Chapel in the early 1970s.

Mr Michael Erickson was a Georgian immigrant to Australia who from 1929 faithfully came to the cathedral, lit the Toc H Lamp and maintained it every day. He was a single man and would also visit the wards of Newcastle Hospital to give cheer to those who did not have family members or friends to visit them. He did many jobs around the cathedral including stripping and re-finishing all the F Menkens designed red cedar pews in the cathedral which had been fashionably stained almost black when they were built for the Pro-Cathedral in 1884.

The St Michael's Chapel Sanctuary Lamp and Aumbry information*

Aumbry Door - Bas-Relief - Sterling Silver Material: 1926

Physical Description: The hand chased bas-relief sculpture forms the door of the Aumbry. The design is hammered with the central design of a Communion Chalice and Wafer, set on an aureole representing the Holy Trinity. Surrounding this large central motif, are foliated designs at the base, and clouds around the top edge. The whole motif is surrounded by a geometric 'frame' of annulated silver with a patterned edge, after the style of a geometric leadlight window.





The design of the Chalice represented is like the Chalice commissioned for the Warriors Chapel by William Mark. This is perhaps serendipitous, but it may mean that the door was commissioned after the William Mark chalice was received in 1926 and the design was supplied to the sculptor. The item is hallmarked with what appears to be the 1926/27 year mark of a gothic "I," consistent with the faculty. Traditionally placed in the north wall of a Cathedral's Sanctuary, an Aumbry may have

originally been located there, but moved when that wall was pierced and archways inserted, as part of the construction of the St Michael Chapel (Warriors' Chapel).

Sanctuary Lamp – Bronze 1924 - Artist/Designer – William Mark (1868-1956)

The hand wrought hexagonal bronze sanctuary lamp was commissioned for the Chapel along with the ten other pieces created and manufactured by William Mark. Of plain design with a double domed cuspoid finial and a flared lip at the top of the oil container it has little other decoration, leaving the beauty of the hand worked metal and the classic geometry of the Art Deco design to speak.

It hangs from the ceiling on bronze chains to a distance three metres above the floor of the Chapel's Apse. The original burner fittings appear to be intact, and it is still used as a perpetual flame.'

The Jeweller/Artist William Mark, who trained in Melbourne and worked in the United Kingdom in the most important metalworking shop of the Arts and Crafts period, returned home to become a major figure in his profession in Australia, thus warranting his work to be of national and international significance, although it is noted that his time is not in its original state.

On Monday 29 November 2021, Anglican Alliance and the Anglican Communion UN Office hosted a climate webinar: 'Beyond COP26 – Outcomes and Next Steps for the Anglican Communion'. ABM was there, and we heard speakers from around the world reflect on climate challenges and on the outcomes of the recent 'Conference of Parties' in Glasgow.

Some expressed disappointment that voices of faith-based organisations had been largely sidelined at COP26 and that some governments, including the Australian Government, had watered down global agreements on climate. Others were more positive, noting that representatives of vulnerable groups had been given a voice in COP26 and that the challenge for Anglicans is to keep mobilising.

The Anglican climate webinar included a video recording from Aboriginal Pastor, Ray Minniecon. He spoke about caring for the environment as part of the Christian identity.

Return to Worship November 2021

WELCOME BACK, WELCOME HOME

• Please remember to maintain social-distancing inside and outside our church buildings.

REGISTERING ATTENDANCE

- Please use the QR Code to register your attendance.
- After scanning the QR code, please show the green tick to the sidesperson, who will invite you to take an order of service.
- If you are not using the QR code, please identify yourself to the sidesperson, who will record your name and phone number (in accordance with NSW Health regulations).

ENTERING THE CHURCH

- The Public Health Order requires masks to be worn in places of worship.
- Social distancing is to be maintained when seated, with 1 person per 2 square metres, except for family groups.

HOLY COMMUNION

- Holy Communion will be administered in one kind (no chalice) in the first stage of our return to church.
- Holy Communion will be distributed at Nave Sanctuary steps.
- Please remain in your pew until an usher invites you to come forward for Holy Communion and please maintain social distancing in the aisle.
- Please remove your face mask just before you receive Holy Communion.

SINGING

• Fully vaccinated congregation members are able to sing whilst wearing a mask. Please show your vaccination certificate to the sidespeople in order to be given a hymn book. At this stage, only Sunday services at the Cathedral will have congregational singing.

WEEKDAY SERVICES

- Weekday Eucharists have recommenced at the Cathedral and St Peter's, subject to all of the regulations listed above. Service times are listed in the pewslip.

- Evensong will recommence on Sunday 28th November.
