Dear Parish Family,

This has been quite the week for us all, I'm sure, as we come to terms with the surge of COVID-19 infections in our Newcastle and Hunter community. At a time when we were looking forward to relaxed restrictions and gatherings with family and friends, it seems everything is uncertain once more.

With all of that in mind, the Parish Council has agreed this week that we delay the return of the common chalice, and also, that we ask people attending worship to wear a mask. As Dr Kerry Chant said yesterday, I am strongly recommending we keep masks and I'm asking the community to do so," Dr Chant said. He who frees from the old poem turtle-dove and snake, who gets death forgiven who puts the apple back.

Dogs, less enslaved but as starving as the poorest human there, crouch, agog at a crux of presence remembered as a star.

St Nicholas Icon and Sanctuary Lamp

A Sesquicentenary Gift of the Greek Orthodox Community

Northern Transept





This icon representation of the head and shoulders of St Nicholas in traditional monk's robe, is painted in the one dimensional style of early Greek and Eastern Orthodox icons.

This Icon replaces the Eastern Orthodox (Russian) icon of St Nicholas which had earlier been given by Mrs Nadia Pitts of St Ives, through Mr Michael Erickson, and came from Our Lady of Vladimir Shanghai, China, circa 1940. It was stolen along with a set of William Mark candlesticks in late 1975 from the St Nicholas Chapel.

It is believed to be gifted by the Greek Orthodox Church in Newcastle who gave the sanctuary lamp hanging with the item. It may have been a sesqui-centenary gift.

This is significant as a cultural link with the Newcastle Greek Orthodox community who used the Cathedral in the early years of the 20th century as a place to worship, until their church was built in the mid 20th century.

St Nicholas is the patron saint of children, (also referred to in western culture as Santa Claus) known as patron of sailors, merchants, pawnbroker and archers. Patron Saint of no less that five European nations and six cities around the world he is perhaps the most widely revered Saint in Christendom.


ANNUAL REPORTS

It is with great pleasure that I present the 2020/21 Annual Report of the Anglican Board of Mission – Australia Ltd.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank our many donors and supporters for their unfailing generosity throughout this past year.

For ABM, as for everyone, this has been a year marked by uncertainty and by significant political, social and economic challenges. COVID-19 has impacted all parts of our work and has required additional resources for our partners who work in contexts where the pandemic has exposed great vulnerability. In Myanmar, where we have worked with the Church of the Province of Myanmar for many years, the military coup and the resulting political turmoil has impeded not only the response to COVID-19 but also other essential social development activities.

During the year ABM continued its special appeal to assist our partners during these unprecedented times. Thanks to the ongoing support from ABM's donors, who responded most generously, and the willingness of the Australian Government Aid



Program to be flexible with their funding, we have been able to support most of the partner requests.

Many provided basic education about the virus and vaccination, as well as vital hygiene messages and handwashing equipment to remote communities. Some provided emergency food when lockdowns and travel restrictions prevented people going to market. These responses are ongoing, and I ask you to continue to keep our partners and their communities in your prayers.

While the direct impact of COVID-19 in most places can now be seen fairly clearly, the indirect consequences are harder to measure. Most programs have slowed as implementation and the acquitting of funds have been delayed. The design of new activities and the monitoring and evaluation of existing ones have also been adversely affected. Yet, in the midst of these challenges, our partners have continued to display enormous resilience and resourcefulness, and their work with and for all of God's people has remained a source of joy and hope.

On-line giving – Name: Missions Account BSB: 705-077 Account: 00041087 Although the proposed celebration of the 150th anniversary of the Coming of the Light to the Torres Strait was impacted by the restrictions on travel, the response to ABM's Lenten study, 'God was on Both Sides of the Beach', was most heartening. However, it did also serve as a timely reminder that our journey towards reconciliation is an ongoing one.

In Australia, ABM staff have generally worked remotely throughout the year. While the proverbial silver lining has not always been easy to discern in respect of COVID-19, it has been pleasing to see how the challenges have begun to generate new and more effective ways of engaging with our supporters and other stakeholders.

It is also important to note that ABM was blessed during the year with several significant bequests which will help us to strengthen the work we do with partners, both in Australia and overseas and ensure that it will continue into the future.

As always, our work would not be possible without our staff, volunteers and partners, so I am thankful for all their efforts. I commend the report and continue to ask for your prayers and support for ABM's work.

WELCOME BACK, WELCOME HOME

• Please remember to maintain social-distancing inside and outside our church buildings.

REGISTERING ATTENDANCE

- Please use the QR Code to register your attendance.
- After scanning the QR code, please show the green tick to the sidesperson, who will invite you to take an order of service.
- If you are not using the QR code, please identify yourself to the sidesperson, who will record your name and phone number (in accordance with NSW Health regulations).

ENTERING THE CHURCH

- The Public Health Order requires masks to be worn in places of worship.
- Social distancing is to be maintained when seated, with 1 person per 2 square metres, except for family groups.

HOLY COMMUNION

- Holy Communion will be administered in one kind (no chalice) in the first stage of our return to church.
- Holy Communion will be distributed at Nave Sanctuary steps.
- Please remain in your pew until an usher invites you to come forward for Holy Communion and please maintain social distancing in the aisle.
- Please remove your face mask just before you receive Holy Communion.

SINGING

• Fully vaccinated congregation members are able to sing whilst wearing a mask. Please show your vaccination certificate to the sidespeople in order to be given a hymn book. At this stage, only Sunday services at the Cathedral will have congregational singing.

WEEKDAY SERVICES

- Weekday Eucharists have recommenced at the Cathedral and St Peter's, subject to all of the regulations listed above. Service times are listed in the pewslip.
- Entrance to all weekday services at the Cathedral will be through the St Christopher transept door (opposite the middle driveway).
- Evensong will recommence on Sunday 28th November.
