



Dear Parish Family,

I trust you had a happy and holy Christmas, and I pray that this New Year, though we continue to face uncertainties and huge challenges, will be also a time in which we will know afresh God's blessing.

As I write, it's hard not to be overwhelmed with today's numbers in NSW, even bearing in mind that they include catch up figures. As I have written before, I try to remember that each one of those numbers is not an anonymous statistic, but a person with a name, and who is loved by God. Thank you for your ongoing prayers. This Sunday we are keeping the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord, and Bishop Peter Stuart will be with us at 8.00am and 10.00am.

Thank you for understanding that it is now mandatory to wear face masks at worship, and for understanding our COVIDSafe requirements at this time. I remain very thankful that we are able to offer our livestream each Sunday morning: https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCXyas2uhJUNOnDetOpPdUOg During January, only Morning Prayer is pre-recorded Monday-Friday, with Morning and Evening Prayer available online on Saturday. #CHANGETHEHEART: January 26 is a difficult time for many people across these lands now called Australia. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples are feeling many emotions and are hurting, grieving, mourning, and commemorating survival, on this day. That's why gathering together to listen and learn and pray for a nation built on truth, justice, love and hope is so important.

On January 25 at 7.30pm, the Cathedral is going to be a livesite, hosting a broadcast of the National Prayer Gathering led by Aboriginal Christian Leaders to #ChangeTheHeart of Australia, hosted by Aunty Jean Phillips, Senior Aboriginal Christian Leader. There's more information about how you can be involved in the pewslip, and how you can sign up individually to watch at home.

I'm not going to lie – I may have committed the sin of pride! (And also totally agree with the discernment of the author!).

Finally, this week's poems are by Jan Richardson and Robert Frost. If you worshipped in the cathedral or online last Sunday, you'll know that I spoke about Rae Richards' magnificent artwork *The Magi – Adoration* which usually hangs in the servers vestry. You can hear what I said, and see the painting here: https://youtu.be/I37XFT5qXNA There's also more information about the work in the pewslip, and the painting is going to remain on display at the High Altar until The Feast of the Presentation. Frost's poem starts with the unsettling line "A voice said, Look me in the stars". We're used to someone saying 'Look me in the eyes and tell me that'. Frost melds these images. We also know the idiom "the eyes are a window to the soul", and there is much to reflect on as we think about Epiphany and the Magi and The Star (and stars in general – my astronomical hobby is showing).

My reflection led me to look in the poems of Jan Richardson, where I found 'A Blessing for Epiphany'. I've used a Jan Richardson's work a bit lately, quoting one of her poems at the conclusion of my Advent IV sermon 'On Saying Yes to God' (https://youtu.be/yOV7zrofgwc), and Fr Scott Dulley used one of her poems in his sermon for Evensong for Advent I (https://youtu.be/VhzVgFW8JCI). Richardson too invites us to contemplate the stars, understanding the light which is our eternal guide.

WHERE THE MAP BEGINS A Blessing for Epiphany

This is not any map you know. Forget longitude. Forget latitude. Do not think of distances or of plotting

the most direct route. Astrolabe, sextant, compass: these will not help you here.

This is the map that begins with a star. This is the chart that starts with fire, with blazing, with an ancient light that has outlasted generations, empires, cultures, wars.

Look starward once, then look away. Close your eyes and see how the map begins to blossom behind your lids, how it constellates, its lines stretching out from where you stand.

You cannot see it all, cannot divine the way it will turn and spiral, cannot perceive how the road you walk will lead you finally inside, through the labyrinth of your own heart and belly and lungs.

But step out and you will know what the wise who traveled this path before you knew: the treasure in this map is buried not at journey's end but at its beginning.

A voice said, Look me in the stars And tell me truly, men of earth, If all the soul-and-body scars Were not too much to pay for birth.

Assets Register - The Magi Adoration

On Sunday 9 January commemorating the Feast of The Epiphany on 6 January, Dean Katherine spoke about Rae Richard's painting of the Magi.

Bronwyn Orrock's research and recording of this painting states:

"A figurative painting of the three wise men (the Magi) described in the New Testament Gospels, visiting the newly born Messiah after following the star. The work is in brilliant hues demonstrating the richness and jewel like colours associated with the exotic origins of the Magi who came from the East — reputedly from Persia and Asia Minor. They stand looking at the infant below who is not shown, but we observe the brilliant glow-like sunlight — the aureole, emanating from the base of the work. A festive joyful painting it is house in the Servers' Vestry and is publicly displayed at Christmas."

It continues:

"Significance: A late career work of a working artist of national repute and 18 solo shows and more than 40 group shows to her credit.

Mrs Richards has completed three works of similar scale depicting the Magi. The first is in Gouache and ink (in the University collection), the second in oils and third in acrylic. The last of the three used the bold thick marks of the palette knife in a very abstract work, and it was exhibited at Christ Church in 2010 as part of the *Feast for the Senses Exhibition*.

Born and educated in Melbourne, Rae trained at the National Art School, Newcastle from 1956-61 and the Alexander Mackie College of Advanced Education for post graduate studies. She established the first Art-as-Therapy class at William Lyne Hospital and the first W.E.A. Art Classes in Newcastle. Rae has been a prominent and widely collected artist in the hunter for more than five decades. She is best known for her painting but has been very prominent in textile artworks and has also painted ceramics, produced in collaboration with a ceramicist. Four banners are in the Newcastle University collection, the AMP Society (Noah's Flood Series) and BHP as well as Reserve Bank, Maitland City and Newcastle Region Gallery and many private collections. She has commissions at St Patrick's College Manly, Church of St Mark at Chester Hill, Women's College at the University of Sydney and was for three years a Wynne prize finalist. She exhibited in London with sponsorship from Qantas Australia."

Her many banners hang in Christ Church Cathedral.
