# Dear Parish Family,

As I wrote last week, our choir have been one of the groups most deeply impacted during these years of pandemic, and I am profoundly thankful for their giftedness and prayerful commitment.

**CONTACTING THE PARISH OFFICE:** Sometimes I hear that it's hard to contact the Parish Office. One of the joys of our reopening is an increased amount of phone calls to the office, as well as people calling into the office or the Cathedral with questions. There's a reminder in the pewslip about the office hours, during which the office is staffed. Emails are monitored regularly outside these hours, and the answering machine lists my phone number as well. Finally, this week's poem is by Graham Kings. I first discovered his poetry during the 'Poem a Day through Lent' project I wrote about last week. I shared one of Kings' poems before, which has a similar theme to that of Wendell Berry's which I shared last week, in that both focussed on being present in God's time. This poem uses the familiar cadences of John 1, weaving the familiar words about The Word, into poetry which describes music and song. Music reaches places words cannot, and moves us in ways that words cannot express. In music, we catch a glimpse of the glory of the Divine, and we are transformed.

#### <u>The Gospel of the Song</u>

In the beginning were the Words, And the Words were the Poet's, And they were part of Him: Lively and brilliant.

And the Words became music, And were sung, Full of beauty and freedom.

We have heard the Song, And have been utterly moved, Again and again.

We had read poetry before, But beauty and freedom Came through this Song.

No-one has ever seen the Poet: This one Song, which is in His heart, Has shown Him to us. Graham Kings 1953-



# **Assets Register**

### **Crucifix – St Christopher Chapel**




Here again the Artist/Designer and Manufacturer are unknown. Also unknown is the donor, faculty date, dedication date or any particular significance details. The following information comes from Bronwyn Orrock's Research 2010.

'This Christus is mounted on a plain wooden cross. The Christus is carved – apparently in one piece and is three dimensional but it has the effect of an Icon, having a very flat motionless appearance. This gives the Icon a meditative quality and is well suited for its location in the children's chapel of St Christopher. The Christus wears a kingly crown and the robes of a Medieval Archbishop with chasuble, dalmatic, stole and alb. This indicates he is the Risen King of Heaven. The hands and feet have timber 'nails' affixing the work to the cross. This work has charm and naivety. It has the appearance of a piece from an area such as South Africa, where devotion to statuary is still an integral facet of everyday life, as is the devotion of their religion. The painting of the sculpture is following the tradition of a thousand years ago – we know the sculpture in Chartres Cathedral was originally all painted but the paint has worn off over time, to the more recognisable white/grey finish we see and expect today.



The St Christopher Chapel was completed in the depths of the Great Depression, known as the 1928 Stock Market crash, however the devasting unemployment and social upheaval lasted a further six years in the Hunter Region. As a direct result, very little money was available for furnishings in the chapel. The very generous act of the Artist to donate the memorial reredos means this Children's Chapel was a beautiful and valuable focal point.'

In further reports, information will be given about the Artist of the Diptych, Daphne Constance Allen (1899-1985) United Kingdom, but it is interesting to note the photo below in Bronwyn's Research shows a different Altar Cross.

### **EMERGENCY APPEAL FOR TONGA**

## **Donate Now**

ABM AID has mounted an emergency appeal for the people of Tonga, following the volcanic eruptions and tsunami waves which hit on Saturday, 15 January.

We have been on the phone with Pacific partners, including Anglican Missions New Zealand, to obtain a clearer picture of the situation.

Electricity and mobile phone networks have been re-established on the main island of Tongatapu, but communications with the outer islands are intermittent.

A joint effort between the New Zealand and Australian Government has sent flights to Tonga to conduct survey reconnaissance to collect aerial data on the impacts of the volcanic ash and tsunami in Tonga.

The Tongan Navy has reported major damage in the Ha'apai group where waves were estimated to be 5-10 metres in height, reaching 500 metres inland. Pending assessments, damage in the northern more isolated islands could be significant and would likely include contaminated water and food supplies as a result of ashfall as well as damage to buildings and crops caused by flooding.

Anglican Missions NZ had previously ensured that NZD 80,000 worth of pre-positioned emergency supplies were in place at four Anglican churches in Nuku'alofa. Funds raised will first be used to replenish this stock, and to respond to other initial requests. Maintaining the pre-positioned supplies is especially important during the cyclone season. Other activities will depend on an assessment of needs which should be available over the next few days.

All funds raised by AID will go to Anglican Missions who are working closely with the Anglican Diocese of Polynesia.

We will provide updates as they come in, on our website and on our Facebook page. You can donate to this appeal now.


