#### Dear Parish Family

Two years ago, we were in lockdown for Palm Sunday, and last year, we were excited that we were able to sing without masks. This year, as I said last Sunday, I was excited to remove the 'please register to attend' from our Easter worship flyers. Of course this does not mean that COVID-19 has gone, nor has the pandemic ended. We still need to take wise precautions, and be mindful of our own health and vulnerabilities as well as those in our community.

I encourage you to attend the liturgies over the Triduum – The Great Three Days. The liturgy from Holy Thursday to Easter are one liturgy: there is no dismissal until Easter. Worshipping on each of the days immerses us in the passion, death, and resurrection. The Good Friday 8.00am liturgy will be livestreamed, as will Easter Day 8.00am. A little bit about what's happening:

**PALM SUNDAY RALLY:** Updated information about the Rally is in the Pewslip. *Please* **note:** there is no March before the Rally this year.

**HOLY WEEK AND EASTER WORSHIP:** Holy Week and Easter worship times are in the pewslip, and flyers are available at the Cathedral and St Peter's. Unlike last year, there is no need to register to attend. Our usual COVIDSafe community practices apply. Please share these times widely.

This week at St Peter's there will be services on Tuesday at 11.00am; Good Friday at 9.00am; and Easter Day at 9.00am.





#### **Assets Register – Lent 6 Palm/Passion Sunday**

Thanks to several people, more information has been found pertaining to the crucifix in the St Christopher Chapel and the beautiful pall. Two former rectors of Cardiff Parish, Keith Dean-Jones and Bruce Hoare have filled in some of the missing history for us.



**KD-J** The "Christus Rex" that is in the St Christopher's Chapel was formerly used at Hawkins Masonic Village Edgeworth. When I became Rector of Cardiff there was a weekly Sunday Eucharist in the Community Hall in what was known as the Church of Christ the King. I do not know the origin of the work and I think that it may have been acquired when Bruce Hoare was the Rector.

**BH** - Keith is correct that he inherited Christ The King masses at Hawkins Village. When the provisional area of Mount Sugarloaf was attached to Cardiff parish, I

placed the worshipping community under the Patronage of Christ The King to give them identity. From my memory the Christus Rex was already there hence my concept for the patronage. The "Christus Rex" was given to the Cathedral.

#### The pall was completed in March 1929, by the sisters at St Peter's Home In Kilburn London\*

Simon Adam participated in the pall's restoration when David Lloyd Funerals donated the cost of restoring the pall. The work was carried out in Sydney by International Conservation Services over several months. (The founder of ICS is Julian Bickersteth who was also involved in the restoration work in the cathedral after the earthquake and the Birdwood Flag.)

In 2008, the Pall was officially returned on Advent Sunday 2008. Simon Adam has found the hard copy photographs of the restoration. Every tear and thread are photographically documented. They show every step, the stripping down and repairing.





This card was found sewn in the pall with the signatures of the sisters who made the pall. It has been placed back inside the pall.

St Peter's Home and sisterhood, a religious community of women dedicated since the Victorian era to a Rule of Life entered on prayer and nursing the sick, was formerly closed as a charity (20 March 2020 Church Times).

Anglican orders of Nuns were in many Anglican communities. A well-known one is the one that inspired "Call the Midwife," an Anglican religious order of nuns within the Church of England. The series is based on the experiences the Anglican sisters of the Community of St John The Divine, in Alun Rock in the 1950s. John the Divine (CSJD) is an Anglican religious order of nuns within the Church of England founded in London in 1848.

**COMMUNITY OF ST PETER'S IN 2000** 



'The Home was run by the Sisters of the Community of St Peter, an Anglican religious order which was devoted to Nursing. The Community had been founded in 1861 in Brompton by Benjamin Lancaster, a wealthy businessman and a Governor St George's Hospital, and his wife Rosamira. The Lancasters were concerned about ladies who had been discharged from the hospital but were still in 'bad health and narrow circumstance' and in need of convalescent care. It admitted only women and children. The Sisterhood also undertook mission work for the poor in the locality and taught young girls how to be domestic servants.

Visit the website to find out more fascinating facts as in 1892, a group of the Sisters went out to Korea to set up an orphanage and a mission there.

### Your gift will change the lives of many communities living in poverty

In a busy wing of the Al Ahli Hospital in Gaza, little Manna is being weighed by Hanan, a general nurse working in the hospital's paediatric unit. Like all too many babies in Gaza, Manna was born severely underweight. Her mother, Heba, says, "I took Manna to many doctors and nurses before, but she didn't improve." Now, aged seven months, Manna has made good progress since she was taken into the Ahli's Child Nutrition Program a month ago. After four visits to the program, she's doing well. Her weight has improved, and she's now moved from "severely" to "moderately" underweight. Heba says, "Here at the Ahli, the nurse measured my child and gave me some advice, and now she has benefitted. I'm very happy."

Hanan says the key success factors in helping the babies put on weight are the mother's cooperation and being able to buy more nutritious food for the family. In Gaza, long afflicted by sanctions and war, it can be a huge challenge for families to buy nutritious food. Many are dependent on refugee rations (some have been refugees since 1948) which are often high in calories but low in nutrition.

As well as educating the mothers in nutrition, encouraging breast-feeding, and keeping a close eye on the babies' progress, the hospital gives the mothers fortified biscuits and multivitamins to supplement the babies' regular diet. Eighty percent of children who participate in the program improve. And when they don't, they can participate for a further three months – if crucial funding can continue...

Our Al Ahli Child Nutrition Project is just one of the many AID Sustainable Communities projects which will benefit from our Lent and Good Friday Gift Appeal this year. Other projects include strengthening communities in the Philippines by teaching them vital skills or supporting women in Kenya to raise poultry for improved family nutrition. Or your gift can support AID's partners to gain training themselves so that they can continue to provide much-needed support to their local communities.
