Evensong on Sunday 22 May 2022 at 6 pm



Assets Register St Nicholas

Triptych by John Montefiore, a Memorial to the Hon. Lester Saddington MLC



Panel 1 (LHS) depicts two men and two women's souls being rowed across a waterway with lost souls in the waters underneath alluding to his role as Bishop of the third century Church converting souls to Christianity and to the accreditation of St Nicholas saving sailors lost at sea in a storm. (The allusion to Greek mythology and the rowing of souls across the Styx River to the Elysian Fields is noticeable). Four virgins representing purity are depicted against the background of a rainbow.

The Centre Panel depicts St Nicholas, dressed in Bishop's robes with a mitre and a silver cross, inset with four gemstones. His cape is held by two naked males. Three tubs of brine represent another act accredited to St Nicholas, when he resurrected children who had been murdered and put into brine by a butcher in preparation for making ham during a severe famine. The spirits of the children can be seen leaving the brine and their bodies kneel in thanksgiving before St Nicholas. This act led to his honouring as the Patron Saint of Children in an era when children were unvalued except for their future earning capacity. It led to the giving of presents to children to honour his memory on the Saint's Day (December 6th) in medieval Europe, becoming known in the western world as Santa Claus and combined in the last century with the celebration of Christmas.

Panel 3 (RHS) is of a young boy observing three virgins, each holding a golden ball – an allusion to the Holy Trinity and, to St Nicholas' most famous accreditation – that of anonymously providing dowries for three poor girls who would have not been able to marry because of their father's poverty. As females they were valueless in the society of the third century city Myra, Lycia (part of modern day Turkey) and would have been sold into slavery or prostitution if they could not be married, which significantly adds to the poignancy of his deed. Flowers adorn bare trees. Underneath, the viewer looks past an awning and through the window of a building onto a domestic scene of a couple at a table, the worried parents of the girls, discussing their options and unaware of the generous act of St Nicholas.

Written across the top of the Triptych is written - **O Lord, in thee have I trusted, let me never be confounded -** this_is from the Te Deum.

As patron saint of children, St Nicholas is revered as the **patron of sailors, merchants, pawnbrokers and archers.** St Nicholas is Patron Saint of no less than five European nations and six cities around the world. He is perhaps the most widely revered Saint in Christendom.

This painting was commission by the Saddington Family and a Faculty was given 17 April 1977 **This is a Memorial** to Lester Birkenhead Saddington OBE, MLC (27.7.1912, Mayfield – 26.9.1962, Newcastle) member of the NSW Legislative Council 1952-1962. Synod Representative 1960-1962 and Chair of Diocesan Liaison Committee, he was also a Freemason, Chairman of the Newcastle Chamber of Commerce, Board member of Hunter Valley Research Foundation and Council Member of Newcastle University as well as a recreational yachtsman and lawn bowler. He was made an Officer of the Order of the British Empire in 1960. Mr Saddington was educated at Cooks Hill High School.

The Artist – John Montefiore was born in Sydney in 1939, attended the Cranbrook School Sydney, studying painting with Justin O'Brien. After the National Art School Sydney (1954-58) he won the prestigious NSW Travelling Art Scholarship (1964). Based in London for three years he worked at the Byam Shaw School of Painting and Drawing and travelled to major European galleries. From 1968 he taught at the National Art School, Newcastle, later moving to the Hunter Institute of Higher Education retiring in 1997.

His +40-year exhibiting career included other commissions; the Mural for the concert Hall in the Refurbished City Hall, Newcastle and three Stained Glass windows installed for the 1983 Centenary of All Saints Anglican Church Kempsey NSW. In 1993 he won the **Sulman Prize** with his Life Series painting, a large multi panelled work developed over a number of years.

The style is very typical of work of this period by John Montefiore and is simar to the wall frieze around the stage of the refurbished concert hall in Newcastle city Hall, commissioned not long after this work. In two dimensional in style, it is reminiscent of early Christian icons emanating from Orthodox Christian Churches in the first millennia AD.

In June 2010, Dean James Rigney closed the Triptych (during the time of the Royal Commission) in case the viewer might not understand the artist's intend and might see the images of nude children as offensive. *
