

ABOUT THE MUSIC....

This morning our Introit (*Morning has broken*) celebrates the arrival of Spring – text that rejoices in the miracle of new life. Our Psalm chant was composed by one of the legends of the organ world – George Thalben-Ball. Thalben-Ball was born in Sydney in 1896, but soon moved to England, where he developed prodigious musical skills. One of the remarkable aspects of his career was his performance, at the age of 19, of Rachmaninoff's fiendishly difficult Piano Concerto No 3 – the first performance of the work by an English-trained musician. Closer to home for us, there is a wonderful story of an improvising contest between Thalben-Ball, during a visit to Australia, and Robert Boughen OBE, who was at that time the Director of Music of St Johns Cathedral, Brisbane. The story goes that the loser was to buy a carton of beer for the winner – no doubt to be enthusiastically shared in the days that followed. Robert Boughen went first,

and on descending from the organ loft was greeted by an astounded George Thalben-Ball who simply said, 'The beer is yours'. As if to recreate this wonderful meeting of great musical minds, our final hymn is a magnificent melody by Robert Boughen, setting a text that celebrates the coming of Jesus and calls us to be God's agents of love in the world.

Our anthem for Evensong is one of the most beautiful choral works ever composed – the *Cantique de Jean Racine* of Gabriel Fauré, composed in 1866 by the 19-year-old Fauré for a competition. History doesn't always agree with the judges of music competitions, but on this occasion they got it right – Fauré won the first prize, and the piece has been treasured by choirs and audiences ever since:

Word of the Highest, our only hope, Eternal day of earth and the heavens, We break the silence of the peaceful night; Saviour Divine, cast your eyes upon us!

Pour on us the fire of your powerful grace, That all hell may flee at the sound of your voice; Banish the slumber of a weary soul, That brings forgetfulness of your laws!

O Christ, look with favour upon your faithful people Now gathered here to praise you; Receive their hymns offered to your immortal glory; May they go forth filled with your gifts.

The Flowers in the Cathedral today have been given by Jennifer and Howard Benson giving thanks for the lives of the New Guinea Martyrs.

The red flowers, the liturgical colour of martyrdom.

The 12 Birds of Paradise representing the 12 New Guinea Martyrs.

The Gymea leaves symbolic of spears that the Papuans would use for protection when attacked.

The Monstera leaves for shields, representing the Papuans who were loved and cared for by the martyrs as they worshipped and worked together.

Greenery for the jungle that gave shelter and protection in the last weeks of the lives of the martyrs.


The Martyrs of New Guinea Day - 80 years this year

This Sunday the Anglican Diocese of Newcastle will be commemorating these saints of the church. Please join us at Evensong, 6pm in Christ Church Cathedral

Anglican missionaries, Fr Albert McLaren and Fr Copland King, began work in New Guinea on St Lawrence's Day 10th August 1891 arriving on the north coast of eastern New Guinea, at a place near Dogura. Teaching and medical missions were gradually established along the north coast and in the inland mountain villages. ("Albert McLaren was on the Feast of the Conversion of S. Paul, 25th January 1884, inducted to take temporary charge of S. Paul's, West Maitland for three years. In West Maitland he is chiefly remembered for his work amongst young men and children, amongst the prisoners in the East Maitland gaol, and amongst the poorest of his parishioners." Albert MacLaren – A Pioneer Missionary in New Guinea – Frances M Synge 1908)

When the Japanese Imperial Army invaded the north coast of Papua in March 1942, Bishop Philip Strong (Bishop of New Guinea from 1936 to 1962), and many mission staff elected to stay with their people. It is estimated that some 333 church workers of all denominations died for their faith in Papua New Guinea during the Second World War. Of these, twelve were associated with the Anglican Missions, coming mostly from around Popondetta — at the villages of Gona, Sangara and Isivita.

Almighty God, we remember before you this day the blessed martyrs of New Guinea, who, following the example of their Saviour, laid down their lives for their friends; and we pray that we who honour their memory may imitate their loyalty and faith; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen

Chamber Music at the Cathedral

Spring into Chamber Music at the Cathedral with an optimistic program of chamber music for flute, strings and piano. An energetic pastoral theme ties together a series of works from the Baroque to the 21st century. Starting with a bouncy Italian baroque trio by Giordani, we move to a set of neo-classical miniature dances by Shostakovich. At the centrepiece of the program are four Slavonic Dances by Dvorak: a Sousedská, a Furiant, a Starodávný and a Kolo, in their original sonorous format of piano 4-hands. A virtuosic trio by Edgar Girtain continues the dance theme in quintessential American style. The concert ends with Haydn's "Gypsy" Piano Trio, so-named because its beautiful early movements are followed by a mad-cap finale incorporating a series of rustic Hungarian dances. A highlight of the concert is our cellist's own composition, "Wind in the Pines".


