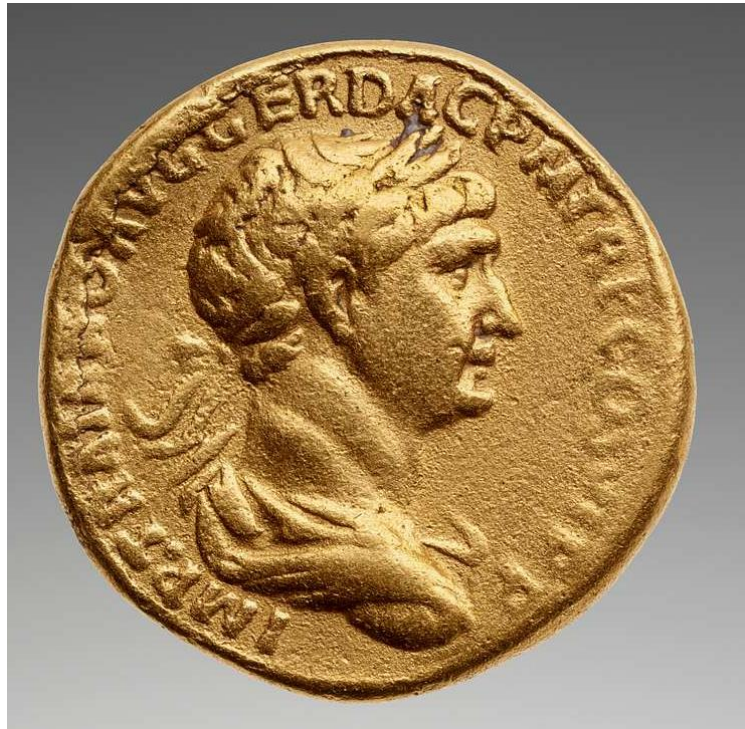

The death of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth, causes us deep sorrow. Generations have delighted at her visits to Australia, and especially for us, in Newcastle.

Flowers may be left in tribute to Her Majesty in the Cathedral, near the prayer desk in front of the Nave Altar. The Royal Family has noted that instead of leaving floral tributes, Australians may wish to make a donation to a charity of their choice in Her Majesty's honour.

Prayers will be offered for Her Majesty the Queen, King Charles III, and the royal Family, at all services across the weekend. Further details of services of commemoration will be made in accord with requests from Buckingham Palace in due course.



Statement from the Bishop of Newcastle, Dr Peter Stuart, on the Death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

Like all aspects of her life, the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II is an event which takes in the public eye. We are reminded of our own mortality and the passing of people we love. I encourage people to take moment to remember Her Majesty's dignified service and to call to mind the things that give purpose and direction to their lives.

Anglicans in our region join with all Australians in mourning her passing. We remember her visits to our nation and especially to this region.

In her 2021 Christmas message, Her Majesty said, "Jesus whose teachings have been handed down from generation to generation, have been the bedrock of my faith." We claim with her the faith that "In Christ, all will be made alive." (1 Cor 15: 22)

We give heartfelt thanks to God for her and offer our condolences and prayers for the Royal Family as they mourn.

The Cathedral, and many parish churches, will be open for private prayer. There will be an official memorial service at the Cathedral prior to the State Funeral in the United Kingdom.

Dear Parish Family

We have woken this morning to the deeply sad news of the death of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II. The Queen's life and reign were remarkable, and a steadying and constant point throughout decades of change. The Queen's strong personal faith was something that she drew upon and sustained her throughout this time. We pray also for King Charles III, and for the members of the Royal Family at this time of grief.

The Cathedral is open for private prayer and remembrance. There is a condolence book in the Cathedral, and floral tributes may be left near the prayer desk in front of the nave altar. The Royal Family have asked that we might consider making a donation to our favourite charity in memorium. My thanks to Pettigrew Family Funerals for the very generous provision of the condolence book.

Prayers will be offered throughout the weekend at all services, and there will be an official Memorial Service in accord with requests from Buckingham Palace in due course.

We also give thanks for the life, work and witness of Terry Kerr, longtime Dean's Secretary. Terry loved the Cathedral and her work here, and she is remembered with much love and respect.

I'm sorry I missed writing to you last week, as I look forward to sharing the news of the week with you. Diocesan Leaders Conference was very good, with input from our Bishops and also updates on what's happening around the Diocese re Reconciliation, EcoCare, SRE (Scripture), and Domestic and Family Abuse. Bishop Peter also spoke with us about the recent events within the Anglican Church of Australia, and a commitment to Comprehensive Anglicanism. Please continue to pray for and with our LGBTQIA+ community in this very hurtful and painful time where their validity and integrity is challenged and questioned.

Next Saturday, 17th September, the Synod of the Diocese will meet, and I am sure that there will be more to report following Synod. Please pray for David Atherton, Robert Sharpe, and Ann Taylor who are our Synod representatives.

You may have noticed some new posters and signage appearing around the Cathedral and St Peter's. This is part of our ongoing work as a parish, a Diocese, and the national Anglican Church, about increasing our education and information about safety. Over the next few months, Veronica Butcher and I are going to be leading Safe Ministry Training sessions for our volunteers, and updating information and requirements. We're not alone in this: this is part of a programme by the General Synod Office, to strengthen training, knowledge, and standards, across the National church. There's also lots of work happening around ensuring we meet all the compliance standards necessary for WH&S. Please speak with myself or Veronica if you'd like more information.

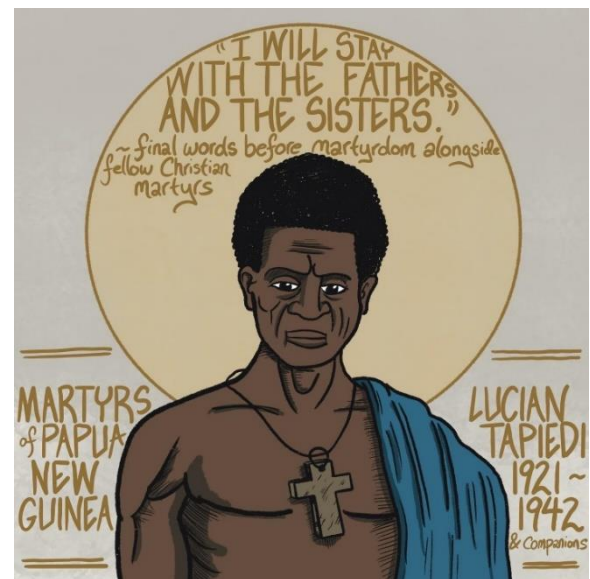
MASKS: A number of COVID cases at the recent Diocesan Leaders Conference meant that I've had a week of hyper vigilance, caution, and lots of RATs! Please strongly consider wearing a mask in places, including church, where you feel you are not able to adequately maintain physical distancing.

Finally, this week's poem is the result of a search inspired by this weekend's gospel of two parts of the 'lost things' trilogy. Sometimes when I am searching for a poem (see what I did there?), my search takes me to unexpected places and discovering new treasures. I had not previously encountered Elizabeth Bishop's poetry, and this poem, *One Art*, is regarded as one of her finest. Deceptively comic, Bishop's poem takes us into the depths of what it is to lose, and being lost. As we contemplate our 'lost things', so we remember, as the parables remind us, that we are not lost to God.

One Art

The art of losing isn't hard to master;
so many things seem filled with the intent
to be lost that their loss is no disaster.
Lose something every day. Accept the fluster
of lost door keys, the hour badly spent.
The art of losing isn't hard to master.
Then practice losing farther, losing faster:
places, and names, and where it was you meant
to travel. None of these will bring disaster.
I lost my mother's watch. And look! my last, or
next-to-last, of three loved houses went.
The art of losing isn't hard to master.
I lost two cities, lovely ones. And, vaster,
some realms I owned, two rivers, a continent.
I miss them, but it wasn't a disaster.
—Even losing you (the joking voice, a gesture
I love) I shan't have lied. It's evident
the art of losing's not too hard to master
though it may look like (Write it!) like disaster.

ABOUT THE MUSIC.... This morning's music spans 1500 years, from the glorious Renaissance sound world of Orlando di Lasso (regarded by many as the greatest of all Renaissance composers), to the extraordinary music of the Estonian composer Arvo Pärt. Pärt is one of the most successful of all contemporary composers. Inspired by his devotion to the Orthodox Church, his musical language has been nicknamed 'Holy Minimalism' and has inspired composers across many genres. A fascinating technique that can be found in many of his works, including *Da pacem Domine*, has the delightful label *tintinabuli*. This onomatopoeic word suggests the sound of bells, and for those with some technical knowledge of music, it involves including a note of the tonic chord of the music, in this case d minor, at all times. In other words, at all times in the piece, one or other of the voices will be singing either a D, an F, or an A.

This evening's music includes Canticles by our extraordinary visiting organist, David Drury. And if you don't recognise the Postlude, that maybe because it is an improvisation – one of many of David's amazing list of skills.

Chamber Music at the Cathedral

Spring into Chamber Music at the Cathedral with an optimistic program of chamber music for flute, strings and piano. An energetic pastoral theme ties together a series of works from the Baroque to the 21st century. Starting with a bouncy Italian baroque trio by Giordani, we move to a set of neo-classical miniature dances by Shostakovich. At the centrepiece of the program are four Slavonic Dances by Dvorak: a Sousedská, a Furiant, a Starodávný and a Kolo, in their original sonorous format of piano 4-hands. A virtuosic trio by Edgar Girtain continues the dance theme in quintessential American style. The concert ends with Haydn's "Gypsy" Piano Trio, so-named because its beautiful early movements are followed by a mad-cap finale incorporating a series of rustic Hungarian dances. A highlight of the concert is our cellist's own composition, "Wind in the Pines".

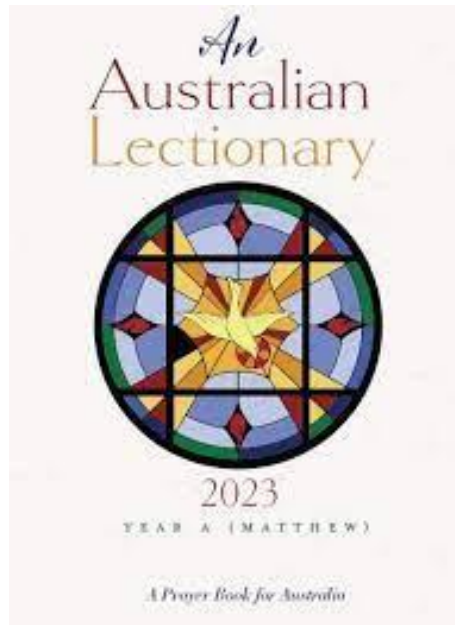
