

Dear Parish Family

Thank you to everyone who contributed in so many ways to a wonderful thanksgiving service on Wednesday evening for the life of Her Late Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II. Special thanks to Peter Smith and the office volunteers, Graham Vimpani and our team of welcomers, Matt Whatson our vergers, Suzanne Evans who ensured the flowers were spectacular, our serving team, and David Banney and our Cathedral Choir and members of the Christ Church Camerata for profoundly beautiful music.

The Cathedral is open (as it is daily) for private prayer and remembrance. There is a condolence book near the Baptistry, and floral tributes may be left there too. It has been very moving to see the tributes grow daily. The Royal Family have asked that we might consider making a donation to our favourite charity in memorium. I remain very thankful to Pettigrew Family Funerals for the very generous provision of the condolence book.

The condolence book will remain in place until after the National day of Mourning.

On Saturday, 17th September, the Synod of the Diocese will meet at NEX, and I am sure that there will be more to report following Synod. Please pray for David Atherton, Robert Sharpe, and Ann Taylor who are our Synod representatives.

Please continue to pray for and with our LGBTQIA+ community in this very hurtful and painful time where their validity and integrity is challenged and questioned.

You may have noticed some new posters and signage appearing around the Cathedral and St Peter's. This is part of our ongoing work as a parish, a Diocese, and the national Anglican Church, about increasing our education and information about safety. Over the next few months, Veronica Butcher and I are going to be leading Safe Ministry Training sessions for our volunteers, and updating information and requirements. We're not alone in this: this is part of a programme by the General Synod Office, to strengthen training, knowledge, and standards, across the National church. There's also lots of work happening around ensuring we meet all the compliance standards necessary for WH&S. Please speak with myself or Veronica if you'd like more information.

Sharon Dyett has been away on a much deserved holiday this week, so my apologies if the pewslip isn't up to its usual standard! Sharon returns on Tuesday. Matt Whatson is away for the next two weeks.

MISSIONS



Papua New Guinea is one of the most culturally diverse countries in the world. Over 800 languages are spoken throughout the islands, and the national population of 8 million are comprised from over 1,000 distinct ethnic groups.

It is also a country undergoing rapid change, as people move away from their villages to seek work and education in the cities. Because of the complexities of land tenure and the lack of employment opportunities, many end up living in settlements on the edges of the towns.

ABM and AID have had a long relationship with the Anglican Church of PNG (ACPNG) to address many of these challenges.

The Anglican Province of PNG is made up of five dioceses – Aipo Rongo, Dogura, New Guinea Islands, Popondota and Port Moresby. Around 3% of Papua New Guineans identify themselves as Anglican, although in some provinces such as Oro, this figure is as high as 60%.

Beginning in 1885, Australian missionaries were first sent to support the church to deliver its mandate, before a partnership model was adopted with ACPNG to empower local, community-based development. Today, AID works with both the church and Anglicare PNG, the church's social and development arm, to support the building of sustainable communities.

More than 38% of Papua New Guineans live in below the poverty line (receiving less than US\$1.90 per day.) There is also high level of gender inequality, with PNG ranking 140 on the Gender Inequality Index among the 155 countries surveyed in 2014. Almost 40% of people over 15 are illiterate (35% are male and 42% female). Only 10% of women and 12.5% of men have received some secondary education. The average number of years a child spends at school is 5.5 years for males and 4 years for females, mostly in primary school.

The current focus of the AID partnership is on building capacity to serve communities in especially rural communities and urban settlement communities in the areas of literacy and numeracy, social inclusion, safeguarding and disaster management. AID also works with the Anglican Church of PNG as it equips itself to provide leadership in addressing social and economic challenges. We also currently support work by Anglicare and ACPNG to address COVID-19, especially in schools and rural and remote communities. Your support of AID enables this important work to take place.

In addition to the work of AID in building sustainable communities, ABM supports ACPNG's Newton Theological College, contributing to building a church to serve Papua New Guineans in the 21st Century.

Chamber Music at the Cathedral

Spring into Chamber Music at the Cathedral with an optimistic program of chamber music for flute, strings and piano. An energetic pastoral theme ties together a series of works from the Baroque to the 21st century. Starting with a bouncy Italian baroque trio by Giordani, we move to a set of neo-classical miniature dances by Shostakovich. At the centrepiece of the program are four Slavonic Dances by Dvorak: a Sousedská, a Furiant, a Polka, and a Scherzo.



The Library Lounge Presents Acts Of Cruelty by Aileen Crowe

Join us for the live launch of 'Acts Of Cruelty: Australia's Immigration Laws and experiences of people seeking protection after arriving by plane' by Aileen Crowe.

The book will be launched by Professor Ian Kerridge Professor of Bioethics and Medicine at Sydney Health Ethics, School of Public Health, University of Sydney and member of the Palaver books advisory group, followed by author Aileen Crowe in conversation with Prof Kerridge and physician and ethicist Prof Paul Komesaroff. Copies of the book will be available for sale and signed by the author.

Acts of Cruelty documents in detail the lived experiences of numerous people and families seeking refuge in Australia as they attempt to navigate the legislative, legal and bureaucratic frameworks and processes that, over two decades, have created an inhumane system confronting those who seek our protection after arriving by plane. Acts of Cruelty also makes important recommendations for improving the system, and cautions that its deliberate cruelty is at risk of poisoning our society.




