Dear Parish Family

During the week someone said to me that it feels busier around the parish – and it certainly is! After two and a half years of COVID-19 (and let's be clear here: COVID-19 is still with us, it hasn't gone away), it is lovely to welcome back many groups to the Cathedral for services and concerts, and lots of baptisms and weddings within the parish too. As I've said over the last few weeks, we have a wonderful group preparing for baptism and confirmation. Please pray for them, and it would be great if you could attend Families@Five on Saturday 5 November at 5.00pm.

We have some very special services this month. On Saturday at 7.00pm we are hosting the Wave of Light service for the Annual Remembrance Day for Early Pregnancy and Infant Loss. On Sunday 30th October at 3.00pm we will host the Mental Health Candlelight Vigil, with music from the Under Construction Choir. Sunday 30th October we are blessed to have ARIA Award winning musicians Chris Duncan and Catherine Strutt lead us in a Celtic Mass for the great feast of All Saints. Our annual All Souls Day Remembrance will be on Wednesday 2nd November at 6pm.

Newcastle Pride month started on October 7 and runs through till November 6. As I wrote last week, our Parish Council, on 1 September this year, reaffirmed our commitment to being a place of inclusion, moving that: "That Parish Council affirms and commits to Christ Church Cathedral Newcastle and St Peter's Hamilton be a places of welcome, inclusion, affirmation, and safe spaces. Individually, and corporately as the Body of Christ, we have a responsibility to enable and sustain this commitment in our community, ensuring all are welcome." Sadly, not every place welcomes everyone. Please continue to pray for and with our LGBTQIA+ community.

PARISH PANTRY: Some of you may have heard me tell the story last Sunday of the gentleman who came into the cathedral close to 6.00pm on Saturday, looking for something to eat. Fortunately, we were able to give him some food to tide him over till Community Lunch the next day, where he was assured of a warm welcome and a wonderful meal and food to take away as well. Please consider an extra item for the parish pantry or the Samaritans basket.

About the music...

At Evensong this week we sing an extraordinary anthem by Tchaikowsky, whose church music is a wonderful part of the Orthodox tradition. The text is tailor made for Evensong:

Let my prayer be as incense before You; I lift my hands as an evening sacrifice. Our morning service begins with a beautiful introit by a Dutch Renaissance composer with an unusual name – Jacob Clemens non Papa. The origin of 'non Papa' is mysterious – some have suggested that it was used by his publisher to distinguish him from either Pope Clement VII or a contemporaneous poet, but it is more likely that it was a humorous nickname.


And speaking of curious names, this morning's Mass setting translates as 'Hunter's Mass'. Orlando di Lasso was unquestionably one of the greatest figures of the Renaissance. The story goes that his employer, a Bavarian Duke, was an enthusiastic hunter, and never happy if an overly lengthy Mass interrupted his hunting plans. Hence this Mass, shorter than other Masses of Lasso, but no less exquisite.



Taking them home



An exhibition at Toronto Library, by Create and Connect art group and Nikinpa, with a focus on culturally appropriate sorry business.

The beautiful painted leaves are messages, colours and stories that connect back to country and help people in the grieving process. Each artist has developed a different style in painting leaves and has chosen the colours and patterns that connect with their own artist expression and story.

The leaves are created by the Create and Connect art group which is partnership program between Nikinpa Aboriginal Child and Family Centre and Relationships Australia. Painting the leaves is a partnership between the art group and Forensic medicine team which is part of NSW Health Pathology.

Now when an Aboriginal person passes, a gum leaf is selected for the family to take home and to go with the person who has passed away. These beautiful leaves as well as other art works the Nikinpa art group have created will be displayed as part of the taking them home exhibition.

ANGELINA NOBLE – 19 OCTOBER

Angelina Noble was born in a Queensland Indigenous community around 1879. Abducted as a child she was disguised as a boy and working for a horse dealer when she was noticed by Queensland police and taken to Yarrabah mission outside Cairns. She thrived at the mission school and by 1904 had married Indigenous lay reader James Noble.

Although Angelina's subsequent career tends to be subsumed by that of her husband, her considerable skills were evident in the supporting role she played as he helped the Rev Ernest Gribble to establish a series of missions across Northern Australia. In 1904 the couple travelled together to choose a site for the Mitchell River mission, and from 1908 to 1910 pioneered a mission on the Roper River. In 1914 they were sent to revive the Forrest River mission where they remained until 1932. For the first three years Angelina was the only female missionary on the station. She treated the sick, taught in the mission school, acted as both baker and cook and on occasions overlanded cattle. The Aboriginal women on the mission knew her as 'Mamma'. At the commission of inquiry established in 1927 to investigate the Forrest River massacre, Angelina, fluent in at least five Aboriginal languages, acted as interpreter.

The Nobles returned to Yarrabah in 1932. Apart from a short period at Palm Island, they were to remain there for the rest of their life. Angelina died in 1964, having been a widow for 23 years. The couple's six children survived them.
