Finally, this week's poem is by Luke Patterson, a Gamilaroi poet, folklorist and musician living on Gadigal lands. My choice of poem each week is usually inspired by the readings for the weekend to come, and this weekend we hear a wonderful passage from Joel, about sons and daughters prophesying, dreaming dreams and seeing visions. Patterson's poem captures that moment when we are neither fully awake nor asleep (even though the poem title says it is while we sleep). Here the conscious and subconscious dance and meld, and truth is often clearest, as is the vision of the way ahead.

Night Vision (while we sleep)

Beyond the eyelid's flickering light, strange
how you teeter. Marsh frogs in their homes shake
the shallow waters of these hours. Their song
across space naked spills through an opened window.

Here, in this half-sleep dulcet rhythm, lifted,
your mind drifts along currents patterned by gentle
moth wing flutters. Everything abuzz, you float,
dance, fathom amongst sweet-lipped night flowers.

Colourful quiet, at furthest point from day, the stars
brighten, blanketing. A sugar glider slides down
a moonbeam to gnaw and sip on summer softened
fruit, radiant wattle nectar. You nestle, cozy

within a nook-hollow of the great river red gum,
swaying, protected by the boobook owl. Tender hoots
remind you of the vastness connecting earth and sky.
The whole circus hooped within you, dreamer.

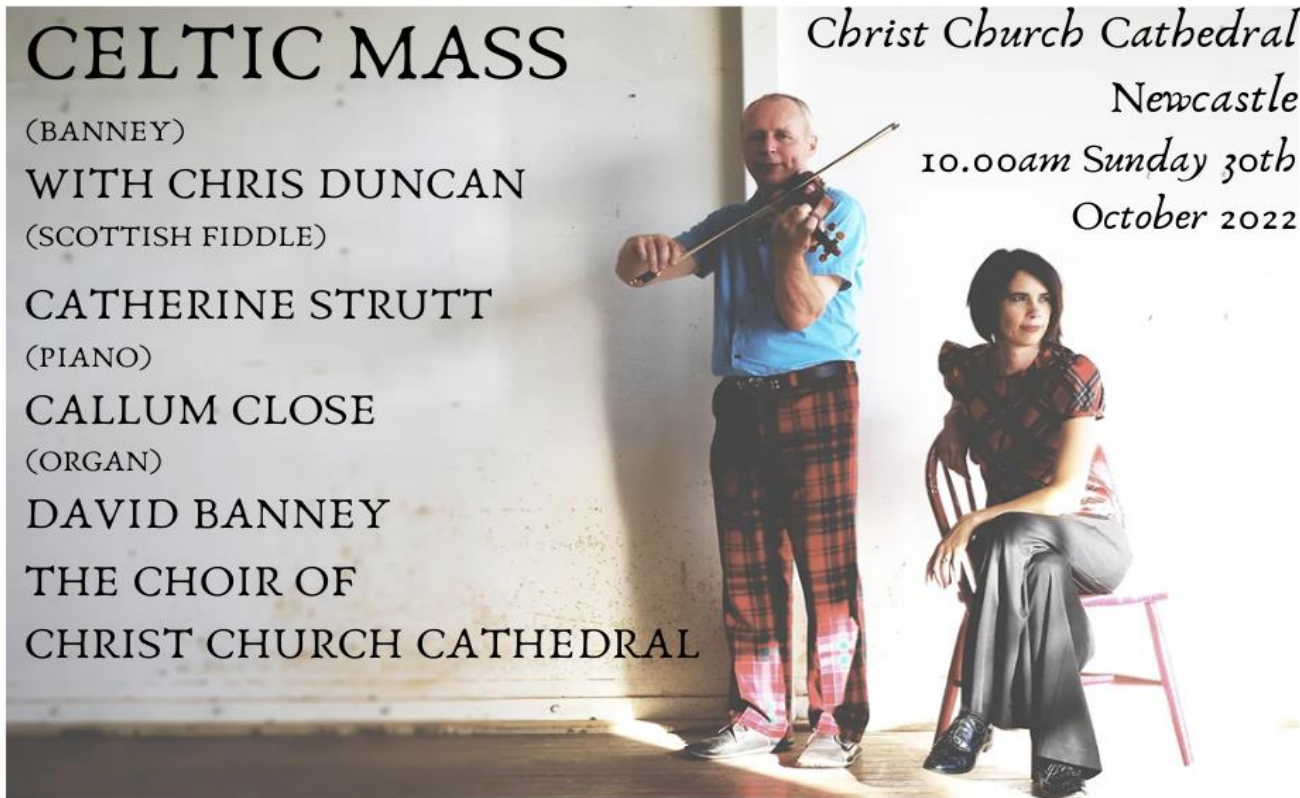

Aboriginal deaths in custody continues to be an ongoing injustice facing Aboriginal families and communities. Over 500 Aboriginal people have died in custody since the Royal Commission into Aboriginal Deaths in Custody released their report in 1991, with 339 recommendations. We grieve the lack of implementation of these recommendations by the Australian Government and the compounded grief that First Nations peoples continue to experience.

We are committed to partnering with God to see the flourishing of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and communities:

- To see a society, and a justice system that pursues true justice - where all people are supported, valued and empowered.
- Where structural racism is a thing of the past.
- Where all people are given opportunities to flourish, rather than languishing in prison.
- And where children as young as 10 receive love and care rather than incarceration. Please join us in vision, prayer and action.

Taking them home



An exhibition at Toronto Library, by Create and Connect art group and Nikinpa ,with a focus on culturally appropriate sorry business.

The beautiful painted leaves are messages, colours and stories that connect back to country and help people in the grieving process. Each artist has developed a different style in painting leaves and has chosen the colours and patterns that connect with their own artist expression and story.

The leaves are created by the Create and Connect art group which is partnership program between Nikinpa Aboriginal Child and Family Centre and Relationships Australia. Painting the leaves is a partnership between the art group and Forensic medicine team which is part of NSW Health Pathology.

Now when an Aboriginal person passes, a gum leaf is selected for the family to take home and to go with the person who has passed away. These beautiful leaves as well as other art works the Nikinpa art group have created will be displayed as part of the taking them home exhibition.
