Finally, this week's poem is by Christina Rossetti. This week's readings include a call to remember, and this past week we have remembered the holy people of God, and this week, we anticipate Remembrance Day on Friday 11th November. Rossetti's more famous poem about remembering is "Remember me when I am gone away" (https://www.poetryfoundation.org/poems/45000/remember-56d224509b7ae) but this poem talks of a different remembrance, a remembrance of a beginning rather than an end. Frank Herbert in *Dune* writes that "A beginning is the time for taking the most delicate care", and yet beginnings of things often slip by unnoticed, as this poem captures beautifully.

I Wish I Could Remember

I wish I could remember that first day,
First hour, first moment of your meeting me,
If bright or dim the season, it might be
Summer or Winter for aught I can say;
So unrecorded did it slip away,
So blind was I to see and to foresee,
So dull to mark the budding of my tree
That would not blossom for many a May.
If only I could recollect it, such
A day of days! I let it come and go
As traceless as a thaw of bygone snow;
It seemed to mean so little, meant so much;
If only now I could recall that touch,
First touch of hand in hand—Did one but know!

About the music.

Our music this week is a feast on the English tradition, with Harold Darke's beautiful Communion Service and Elgar's popular Ave verum in the morning, and in the evening one of the best-loved of all settings of the Magnificat and Nunc dimittis by a composer with a fabulous name - T. Tertius Noble. There is also Australian music - at Evensong we sing part of Michael Leighton Jones' setting of the Responses. 'MLJ' as he is known, was a member of the choir of Kings College Cambridge, before building an extraordinary career in Australia, which included being the singing teacher of yours truly at the University of Queensland. With no other teacher that I have ever had was the gap between the efforts of student and teacher so vast! And our music begins with an Introit of Novacastrian Ross Fiddes.

Taking them home



An exhibition at Toronto Library, by Create and Connect art group and Nikinpa, with a focus on culturally appropriate sorry business.

The beautiful painted leaves are messages, colours and stories that connect back to country and help people in the grieving process. Each artist has developed a different style in painting leaves and has chosen the colours and patterns that connect with their own artist expression and story.

The leaves are created by the Create and Connect art group which is partnership program between Nikinpa Aboriginal Child and Family Centre and Relationships Australia. Painting the leaves is a partnership between the art group and Forensic medicine team which is part of NSW Health Pathology.

Now when an Aboriginal person passes, a gum leaf is selected for the family to take home and to go with the person who has passed away. These beautiful leaves as well as other art works the Nikinpa art group have created will be displayed as part of the taking them home exhibition.


