

# Dear Parish Family

It has been a joyous season of reflection and preparation, with some highlights especially in the past week of a Cathedral filled with guests for Community Lunch on Sunday, and then filled with children at a wonderful Kids' Club this week. My enormous thanks to Veronica and the Family Ministry Team for this ministry. Some visitors to the Cathedral on Tuesday afternoon remarked that it was a real joy for them to see the Cathedral filled with vibrant activity. Volunteering at Community Lunch and with our Family Ministries bring invaluable rewards. Please pray about how you can assist in 2023.

Over the past few years, the number of people attending the 7.00am Eucharist at the Cathedral has steadily been declining. There are numerous reasons for this, and COVID lockdowns have also had an effect. On a number of occasions, it has been only myself and Gordon, who serves at this Eucharist, in attendance. Consequently, the difficult decision has been made to no longer hold a 7.00am Eucharist on Sundays at the Cathedral. This decision has not been made lightly, and I give thanks for the faithfulness of all who have made this service their home over many years.
