

Music notes

Our music today features the tenors and basses of the Cathedral Choir, in music spanning 1700 years. Much of today's music is plainsong - music from the very earliest centuries of the church, characterised by unaccompanied melodies, with rhythms that follow the rhythms of the text rather than having a beat. Pérotin's 'Viderunt omnes', composed late in the 1100s, is one of the most famous examples of a style of music that built on plainsong. In this music, each notes of a plainsong melody is stretched, becoming a drone over which a complex series of voices interweave. It is from this style of music that some important musical terms emerged. The 'tenors' were those who 'held' the tune (*tenere* = to hold), while the three voices above were described as altos (think of 'altitude'). It might be said that altos have altitude and tenors have attitude, but you didn't hear that from me!

To make things a little confusing, but to prove the real meaning of the terms, in this music, the 'tenor' part is sung by the basses, while the 'alto' parts (sometimes called the 'counter-tenor' parts) are sung by the tenors. The musical function of the parts is more important than who sings them. In other parts of today's music, including the Psalms and the Magnificat and Nunc dimittis, plainsong alternates with harmony.

Around the world the church, and church music, face unprecedented challenges. How do we balance the needs and expectations of today's congregations with the call for the church to be counter-cultural and for our worship to be sacred? While musical styles and languages come and go, it is extraordinary that plainsong continues to inspire us and to serve our worship in new and beautiful ways.

Pancake Day

Pancake Day or Shrove Tuesday is the traditional feast day before the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday. Lent

 the 40 days up to Easter – was traditionally a time of fasting and on Shrove Tuesday, Anglo-Saxon
 Christians went to confession and were "shriven" (absolved from their sins). A bell would be rung to call
 people to confession. This came to be called the "Pancake Bell" and is still rung today.

Shrove Tuesday always falls 47 days before Easter Sunday and was the last opportunity to use up eggs and fats before embarking on the Lenten fast and pancakes are the perfect way of using up these ingredients Shrove Tuesday falls on the 21st February this year.

A pancake is a thin flat cake, made of batter and fried in a frying pan. A traditional pancake is very thin and is served immediately. Golden Syrup or lemon juice and caster sugar are the usual toppings for pancakes.

The pancake has a very long history and featured in cookery books as far back as 1439. The tradition of

tossing or "flipping" them is almost as old. "And every man and maide doe take their turne, And toss their Pancakes up for feare they burne" (Pasquil's Palin, 1619)


