

175th ANNIVERSARY OF THE ARRIVAL OF BISHOP WILLIAM TYRRELL: Evensong at 6.00pm on Sunday will mark the 175th Anniversary of the Installation of the Right Reverend Dr William Tyrrell, D.D, as first Bishop of Newcastle. Bishop Charlie Murry will be the Preacher. We will also bless the beautiful artwork by the Reverend Canon Aunty Di Langham and her family, which is their gift to the cathedral. Finally, this week's poem is by Philip Larkin. Written for Sally Amis, the daughter of Kingsley Amis and Hilary Bardwell. Larkin writes a 'blessing' of ordinariness, so that this newborn child, not caught by celebrity or status, might know happiness. In researching this poem, I discovered that Sally Amis' life was sadly short and tragic. Perhaps Larkin was prophetic in his poem, in much the same way that Simeon and Anna foretell prophesy of joy and sadness.

Born Yesterday For Sally Amis

Tightly-folded bud, I have wished you something None of the others would: Not the usual stuff About being beautiful, Or running off a spring Of innocence and love— They will all wish you that, And should it prove possible, Well, you're a lucky girl. But if it shouldn't, then May you be ordinary; Have, like other women, An average of talents: Not ugly, not good-looking, Nothing uncustomary To pull you off your balance, That, unworkable itself, Stops all the rest from working. In fact, may you be dull— If that is what a skilled, Vigilant, flexible, Unemphasised, enthralled Catching of happiness is called.



Music notes

Today is a big day at Christ Church Cathedral! This morning we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple, recalling the moving account of Simeon, recognising the Saviour of the World - the promised Messiah - in the child Jesus. Our music is a joyful celebration of this story. The introit uses an ancient texts that summarises these events, while the anthem is a setting of Simeon's song, and our Mass setting is simply splendid - Haydn's 'Little Organ Mass' (though not so little!) This evening we celebrate the 175th Anniversary of the arrival in Newcastle of Bishop Tyrell, and receive an extraordinary gift of indigenous artworks. Our music begins with Markapmirr - an indigenous hymn that reminds us that long before Bishop Tyrell, this was Aboriginal land. Much of the other music traces the period of Bishop Tyrell's arrival and the time that has passed since then.

Samuel Sebastian Wesley was the most important English composer of church music at the time that Bishop Tyrell left England, and his beautiful anthem, 'Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on Thee', surely captures the spirit of the man who we remember tonight. The Magnificat and Nunc dimittis come from periods between then and now - Stanford's Nunc dimittis, composed early in the 20th century, and David Banney's Magnificat for lower voices, composed in 2023 - a reminder that Bishop Tyrell's work goes on in the faithful service of Anglicans in Newcastle today.

175th Anniversary of the Installation of the Right Reverend William Tyrrell D.D., First Bishop of Newcastle

At Evensong on Sunday 29th January (6.00pm), we will mark the 175th Anniversary of the installation of William Tyrrell as first Bishop of Newcastle. Tyrrell's almost thirty-three year episcopate set the shape of the Diocese of Newcastle. Indeed, at the time of his death on 24th March 1879, the boundaries of the Diocese had become very close to our current shape.

We will also bless a magnificent indigenous artwork, the work of the Reverend Canon Aunty Di Langham, and members of her family, Belinda and Bonny Roberts. The artwork, created largely with painted gum leaves, depicts Biriban, or in Aunty Di's language, Bunjil, the eagle who watches over us. We give thanks to Canon Aunty Di Langham, Belinda and Bonny Roberts, and family, for this compelling gift.

Pancake Day

Pancake Day or Shrove Tuesday is the traditional feast day before the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday. Lent

 the 40 days up to Easter – was traditionally a time of fasting and on Shrove Tuesday, Anglo-Saxon
 Christians went to confession and were "shriven" (absolved from their sins). A bell would be rung to call
 people to confession. This came to be called the "Pancake Bell" and is still rung today.

Shrove Tuesday always falls 47 days before Easter Sunday and was the last opportunity to use up eggs and fats before embarking on the Lenten fast and pancakes are the perfect way of using up these ingredients Shrove Tuesday falls on the 21st February this year.

A pancake is a thin flat cake, made of batter and fried in a frying pan. A traditional pancake is very thin and is served immediately. Golden Syrup or lemon juice and caster sugar are the usual toppings for pancakes.

The pancake has a very long history and featured in cookery books as far back as 1439. The tradition of tossing or "flipping" them is almost as old. "And every man and maide doe take their turne, And toss their Pancakes up for feare they burne" (Pasquil's Palin, 1619)


