Ordway's poem connected with me (see what I did there?) as many of you know, I am never far from my phone. Access to the myriad of distractions on our devices is both the new temptation and the new wilderness, where we scroll from one thing to another, thirsting for that which will satisfy, but never finding it. Maybe I need a digital detox this Lent...

Temptation in the Wired Wilderness

Our Lord spent forty days and forty nights
Resisting Satan in the wilderness.
We picture barren rocks and sand; we might
Add in a scrubby tree or two. I guess
That's where temptation ought to come, so we
Can see it from at least a mile away,
And be prepared, with Bibles, church retreats,
And exhortations to stand firm.

Instead it wounds with cuts too small to see, In this our wired wilderness. We play And work in deserts of the digital: Abuzz with locust-noise of clicks and tweets And filled with lonely crowds. Our enemy Is faced and fought right here, or not at all.

About the Music...

As we come to the season of Lent we enter one of the richest musical periods of the year. Poets and composers have been inspired over many centuries by the range of theological ideas and liturgical events in Lent to create music that plunges the depths of despair at one end and the glorious heights of the resurrection at the other.

It is a tradition for many people to give something up for Lent, and we will embrace that idea in our music, making the music intentionally devoid of some of its most comforting aspects, in particular the rich sound of the organ in full flight, and luscious harmonies. Our music will still be extraordinarily beautiful, but most of the choir's singing will be unaccompanied rather than with the organ, and plainsong will make more appearances than usual. There will be music by many of the greatest composers in church history - Byrd, Palestrina, Bach, Chesnokov and Gibbons, for example. And there will be some exceptions. On the fifth Sunday in Lent we celebrate the Annunciation, with rich music aplenty, and Palm Sunday will begin with loudness!

A special feature will be the Maundy Thursday service - the beginning of the 'Great Three Days'. The organ will be used at the beginning of that service, but midway through the service, as we turn from the washing of feet to the Last Supper and the beginning of the Passion journey, the doors of the organ will be closed, not to be opened again until the singing of the Gloria on Easter Eve, at which point David Drury will regale us with sounds that will leave us in no doubt about the joy of the Resurrection.

ABM Lent Appeal 2023

The 2023 Lent and Good Friday Appeal supports the work of the Anglican Diocese of Jerusalem via the outreach of the Ahli Hospital in Gaza and a new youth empowerment project.

Shorouq is a young mother, who lives in one of the most marginalised parts of Gaza City. Her two-year-old daughter, Hala, was screened and selected to be part of the Ahli's child nutrition program to address her malnutrition.

In Shorouq's words, "My husband is unemployed, and we are living in deplorable conditions. We are unable to meet our fundamental demands. We are completely reliant on [United Nations] food assistance, which is insufficient because we also require medicine and cash to purchase other necessities.

"I heard about the free nutrition program that Ahli Arab Hospital implemented... The Ahli was a compassionate and delightful place for us as they cared for my daughter and provided us with the necessary medications, vitamins, and biscuits that supported her quick recovery."

As well as being good news for little Hala, the Ahli's program was also good news for Shorouq on a more personal level, as she received health and nutrition training both in her home and her community from women community trainers (mobilisers) who have been especially trained by the Ahli.

Shorouq continues: "I acquired more and more knowledge; my health awareness increased through the Ahli's 'woman-to-woman approach'. Their community mobiliser visited me twice a month, correcting my misconceptions and wrong health behaviours, and improving my communication skills, and gender and protection concepts. All of this knowledge and skills positively impacted my life.

"After participating in the individual awareness workshops, I became stronger, I can face the injustice that may occur, and I can protect myself alone. My awareness of my rights and responsibilities was raised; I am capable of solving my problems alone now. I have good communication channels and dialogue with my husband... And I succeeded to change some negative behaviours for myself and my husband such as helping me in the home, since I have a risky pregnancy.

"Many thanks to the Ahli Hospital and to AID, and to all the people who care for vulnerable groups and provide assistance to the needy," Shorouq remarks graciously.

Your support of this appeal will empower many vulnerable women like Shorouq, and will give their children a much greater chance of a healthy life.
