Our Lenten Evensong will be the final in our series exploring the Marks of Mission, welcoming Archdeacon Rod Bower as our preacher.

Finally, this week's poem, Annunciation, is Muriel Stuart. Stuart draws on the experience of Moses' encounter with God "While He spake things that only one man heard,/ Face down before that glory manifest?" in her wondering of Mary's experience of the incarnation. This is a deeply sensual poem, as is much poetry about the Annunciation. It is tempting to dehumanise this moment, by removing the senses, and yet God has gifted us as sensual beings. Stuart's poem (first published in 1922) challenges our sensate engagement with God.

Annunciation

"The Lord appeared in a flame of fire out of the midst of a bush and behold, the bush burned with fire and the bush was not consumed."—EXODUS iii. 2.

When to your virgin heart, unstirred, ungiven, Upon the quiet mountain side untrod, The sudden naked fire came down from heaven, Burning you with the very breath of God,

Was the sun lost? Were all the sweet stars dim While God raised round your head those walls of light? Were you locked dumbly, terribly with Him, Within that burning temple day and night?

What was it to have God there like a bird—God like a great, gold flower upon your breast—While He spake things that only one man heard, Face down before that glory manifest?

When that strange flame went up the mountain side, Were your forsaken lips so burned with gold That the creatures of the wild stood off and cried, And in your breast no blossom dared unfold?

Did you call back the startled birds to build, And put forth all your simple buds again, Forgetting how your branches once were filled, In sweet embrace of passing sun and rain?

Or were all other birds forbidden sing
After those great, gold plumes had made their nest?
Was, in its strange and awful blossoming,
That great, gold flower the last upon your breast? Muriel Stuart 1885-1967

About the music...


This week we break our Lenten fast for the Feast of the Annunciation, and celebrate with the rich sounds of Darke's Communion Service in E, Noble's Magnificat and Nunc dimittis in b minor, and Rachmaninoff's exquisite anthem Bogoroditsye dyevo, celebrating Mary's response to God's call: Rejoice, virgin mother of God, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, for you have borne the Savior of our souls.

Continuing our series exploring why we do what we do in our music, today we examine the final part of the Ordinary of the Mass - the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God). The gospels tell us that John the Baptist greeted Jesus with the words 'Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world', and it is from this text that the liturgical 'Agus Dei' is drawn. A lamb is a gentle and beautiful thing, but John's description of Jesus as the Lamb of God has a very different meaning. Ritual sacrifice was part and parcel of Old Testament Jewish life, and for the most important rituals, only a perfect lamb or kid was acceptable. I don't know about you, but I would not be thrilled to have a prophet describe me as the Lamb of God - it surely won't end well! In this description of Jesus, John pointed to the events of Easter, in which Jesus' death would be the sacrifice to end all sacrifices. And so it is that, at the last moment before we take communion, we hear these words, reminding us that the Eucharist is a memorial of Jesus' redemptive act, transformed in the resurrection.

Composers through the centuries have been especially inspired by this text and its place in the liturgy. As you listen to the Agnus Dei, ponder the devastating meaning of the words. This is no genteel tradition, but a matter of utmost importance, resolved for us in gruesome fashion. A 'good' musical setting of the text captures the mystery and solemnity of the words.

Outstanding organist Lukas Hasler will give a recital on the Christ Church Cathedral organ, with a rich variety of popular classics including Bach's Toccata and Fugue, Hasler's own arrangement of Beethoven's Moonlight Sonata, and music of Mozart, Mendelssohn and Saint-Saëns.




