ATTENDING WORSHIP: Please continue to be mindful of COVIDSafe practices as we gather, and to be mindful of our own health and vulnerabilities as well as those in our community. Please strongly consider wearing a mask in places, including church, where you feel you are not able to adequately maintain physical distancing. ***The sacrament is administered in both kinds. You are welcome to receive in one or both kinds. We ask that you do not intinct (dip) the host.***

Finally, this week's poem, entitled *Emmaus*, draws on the experience of the disciples encountering the risen Christ, which is our Gospel reading for this weekend. The Emmaus Road resurrection appearance is my favourite resurrection appearance. *(The usual favourite disclaimers do not apply in this situation!)* In Spear's poem, she repeats the first two lines at the conclusion – and yet the lines are subtly changed to reflect a new reality. So too it is with the disciples on the road to Emmaus – though their change is perhaps not so subtle. When do our hearts burn within us?

and chase the orange, evanescent sun.
Inhale, exhale (a runner's form of prayer),
I run in oddly warm December air.
A stranger joins me on the asphalt trail.

About the music

After our ‘organ fast’ during Lent, one of the musical joys of Easter is hearing the organ again, and today’s music includes a number of works that put the organ on full display, and as always, be listening for the inspiring improvisation of our Organist-in-Residence, David Drury. In particular, be listening for David’s playing immediately after the Gospel reading, and again during the censing of the altar – how will his playing reflect the text of the gospel, and how will he help us to enter into the mood of the Eucharist during the censing of the altar?

Our Evensong is a tribute to the ANZACs, and features the music of Michael Leighton Jones. It is hard to think of a more appropriate composer – ‘MLJ’ was born in New Zealand, studied in Cambridge where he was a member of the Choir of Kings College Cambridge, and then found his way to Australia, where he has had an illustrious career as a singer, composer, conductor and teacher (one of his students was your own Director of Music!). His setting of the Preces and Responses is a favourite in English cathedrals. His grandfather and his cousin both fought at Gallipoli, and his setting of Ataturk’s words in his motet ‘Gallipoli’ (dedicated to those two men) is truly inspiring.

Your sons are now lying in our bosom and are in peace. After having lost their lives on this land they have become our sons as well. (Ataturk)



Loud Field



On Thursday this week, as part of the *Loud Sky* exhibition at the Lock Up, fields of ribbon flowers were installed at Sacred Heart Cathedral, and Christ Church Cathedral, as a reminder of all who are impacted by sexual abuse, and also as a sign of healing and hope.

Dr Rod Pattenden, one of the curators of the exhibition, is quoted in the Newcastle Herald, saying:

The exhibition is also a celebration of survival, Pattenden says.

"Despite the horror of abuse, these works visualise courage, containing elements of profound and great beauty," he wrote in his essay for the exhibition.

The exhibition's title comes in part from the Loud Fence movement, which began in Ballarat in 2016 and has spread around the world. Ribbons are tied to church fences as statements of protest and they act as visual portals for memory, loss and the celebration of life.

The flowers are the work of volunteers from across the community and the Anglican and Roman Catholic Churches, and will be on display at both Cathedrals until the end of April.




