ATTENDING WORSHIP: COVID-19 continues to spread through our communities, especially as we move into colder weather. Please continue to be mindful of COVIDSafe practices as we gather, and to be mindful of our own health and vulnerabilities as well as those in our community. Please strongly consider wearing a mask in places, including church, where you feel you are not able to adequately maintain physical distancing.

Finally, this week's poem, is by Denise Levertov. I'm finding myself, at the moment, returning to favourite poets. Part of what makes them my favourites, is that their words never cease to challenge and move me. Levertov's beautiful poem on the Ascension invites us to consider the cost of the Acension: "Can Ascension/ not have been/ arduous, almost, / as the return/ from Sheol, and/ back through the tomb/ into breath?" Another dying and rising to new life perhaps? Levertov challenges us with life and death woven together – the pain and joy of our being. This poem bears reading slowly, and perhaps a number of times.

Ascension

Stretching Himself as if again, through downpress of dust upward, soil giving way to thread of white, that reaches for daylight, to open as green leaf that it is... Can Ascension not have been arduous, almost, as the return from Sheol, and back through the tomb into breath? Matter reanimate now must relinquish itself, its human cells, molecules, five senses, linear

vision endured as Man the sole all-encompassing gaze resumed now, Eye of Eternity. Relinquished, earth's broken Eden. Expulsion, liberation, last self-enjoined task of Incarnation. He again Fathering Himself. Seed-case splitting. He again Mothering His birth: torture and bliss.





About the music...

At our Choral Eucharist this Sunday morning we welcome back Chris Duncan and Catherine Strutt, ARIA-Award-winning musicians, and at the very top of Scottish fiddle music, both in Australia and internationally. Apart from the beauty that they will bring to our worship, this is a kind of musical ecumenism: the Golden Age of the Scottish fiddle was a time when all instruments were banned in worship in the Church of Scotland and consequently, there is very little religious music composed for the instrument. This Celtic Mass is based on a mix of Scottish and Irish folksongs - Scottish for the Gloria and Sanctus, and Irish for the Kyrie and Agnus Dei.

Continuing our discussions of why we sing what we sing in worship, some of the most important moments of music are also some of the shortest - the Gospel Alleluia, and the Acclamations ('Christ has died' and 'Blessing and honour') during the Great Thanksgiving - the long prayer said by the priest in preparation for communion. These come at high moments in the liturgy. The Gospel Alleluia prepares us for the reading of the gospel, which is the high point of the first section of our service (referred to as the Liturgy of the Word). The Gospels are not 'nice words about Jesus', but texts that are at once demanding, challenging and comforting - words that go to the centre of our faith. The Alleluia that we sing should majestic, inspiring and disturbing, preparing us to hear the reading.

The Acclamations come at high points in the Liturgy of the Eucharist. As we prepare for communion, the priest offers prayers of adoration and praise, including text that reminds us of what the Eucharist is all about. 'Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again' is the most concise creed that we could imagine, and should be sung with gusto. 'Blessing and honour' crowns the Thanksgiving prayer, and the 'Amen' with which it concludes marks the end of the prayer. The ringing of bells at this moment adds certain intensity and busyness. This is serious and wonderful, and, like all of the responses, let us sing it loudly!

A box can be found near our sock box in the Narthex of the Cathedral or at St Peter's or we can collect from you and these items will be delivered to Belmont for this valuable service.


