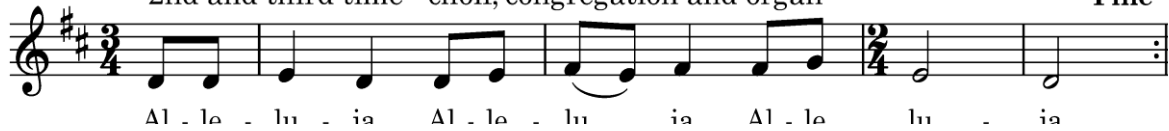

About the music...

The church year is full of important Sundays, but few are more important than Pentecost, when we recall the Holy Spirit coming upon the early apostles - an event that can be thought of in many ways as the birthday of the church.

Our Choral Eucharist begins with an exquisite Introit by the New Zealand composer Donald Mews, capturing the mystery and the magnificence of Pentecost. Before the gospel the choir will sing 'Veni, Creator Spiritus' ('Come, Holy Spirit') - perhaps the oldest Pentecost hymn. In this setting, based on the version sung at Notre Dame Cathedral, the choir and organ take turns in singing and playing the plainsong melody.

At Evensong we welcome the Cathedral's children's choir - the St Nicholas Choir, joining the Cathedral Choir in Noble's magnificent setting of the Magnificat and Nunc dimittis, and Rutter's effervescent setting of 'For the beauty of the earth'. The setting of the Preces and Responses is based on melodies composed as a group effort by the St Nicholas Choir.

I am very excited to announce that the Cathedral Choir has now organised a tour of the United Kingdom for July, 2025, which will include a week in residence at Salisbury Cathedral, four days at Chichester Cathedral, and two days at Coventry Cathedral. Please keep the choir in your prayers as we prepare for this exciting tour - 2025 will come around quickly!

National Reconciliation Week encourages us all to play our part in building relationships and communities that value Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, histories, cultures, and futures.

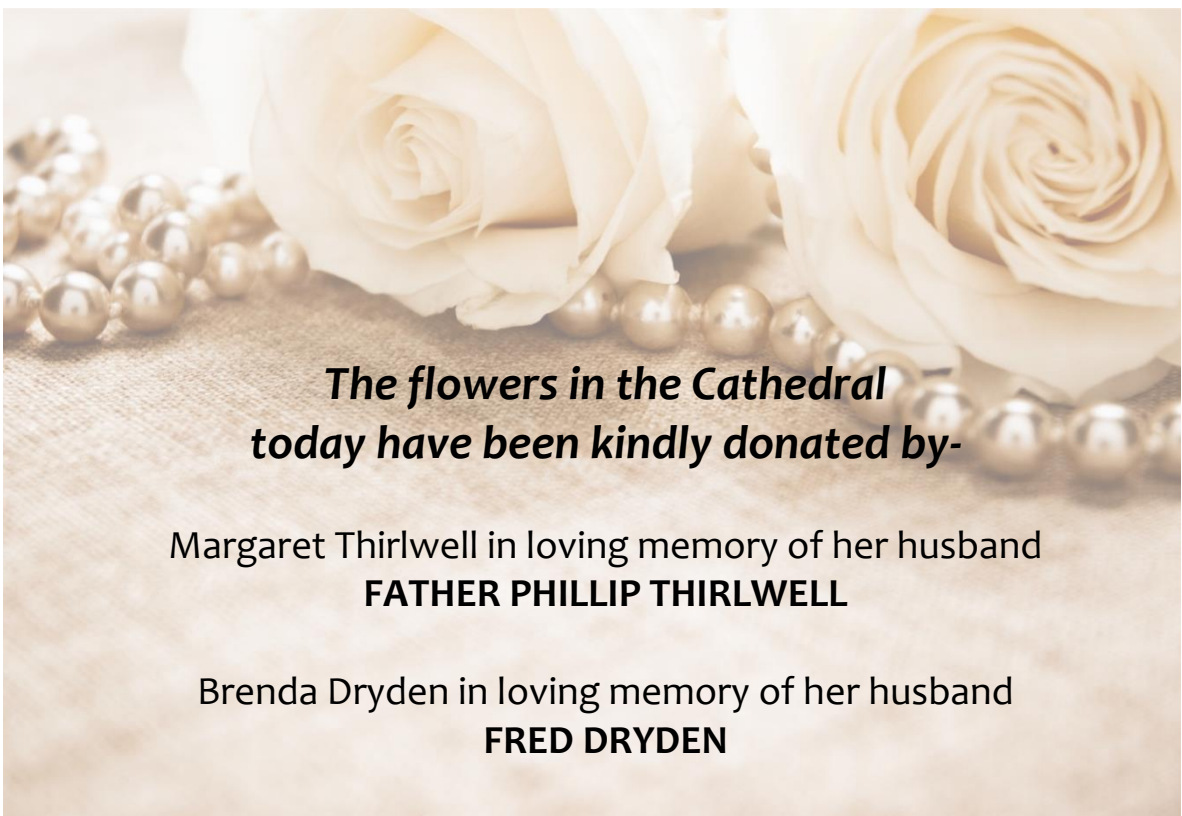

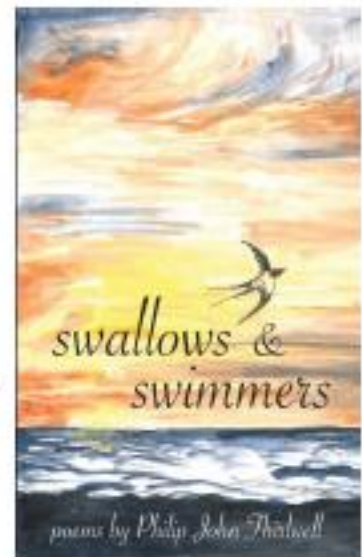
A box can be found near our sock box in the Narthex of the Cathedral or at St Peter's or we can collect from you and these items will be delivered to Belmont for this valuable service.
