A MASS ON UKRAINIAN FOLKSONGS: This week (as I write this, it is day 470 of the Russian invasion), we have been shocked by the scenes of destruction caused by the bombing of the Kherson Dam. Last year, David Banney composed this Mass setting in response to the invasion, and as a way of standing in solidarity with the people of Ukraine. On the first anniversary of its premiere, the Mass will be offered again on Sunday 25th June at 10.00am. Please invite others to come and pray with the people of Ukraine.

ATTENDING WORSHIP: I am very aware of rising COVID-19 infection rates as we come into winter. Finally, this week's poem, is by Abdullah Kasem Al Yatim, a refugee. Our first reading speaks to us about the importance of welcoming the stranger. It's often a challenge for us, to set aside prejudices and preconceptions, and be open to welcoming the stranger, for as we hear in the first reading, and as we read in the letter to the Hebrews, "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it." (Hebrews 13.2)

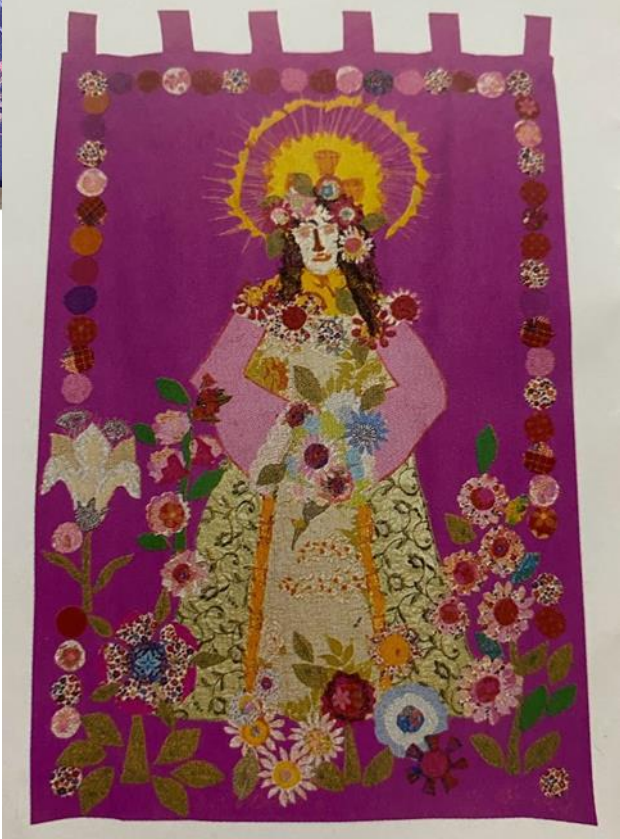

Madonna and Child

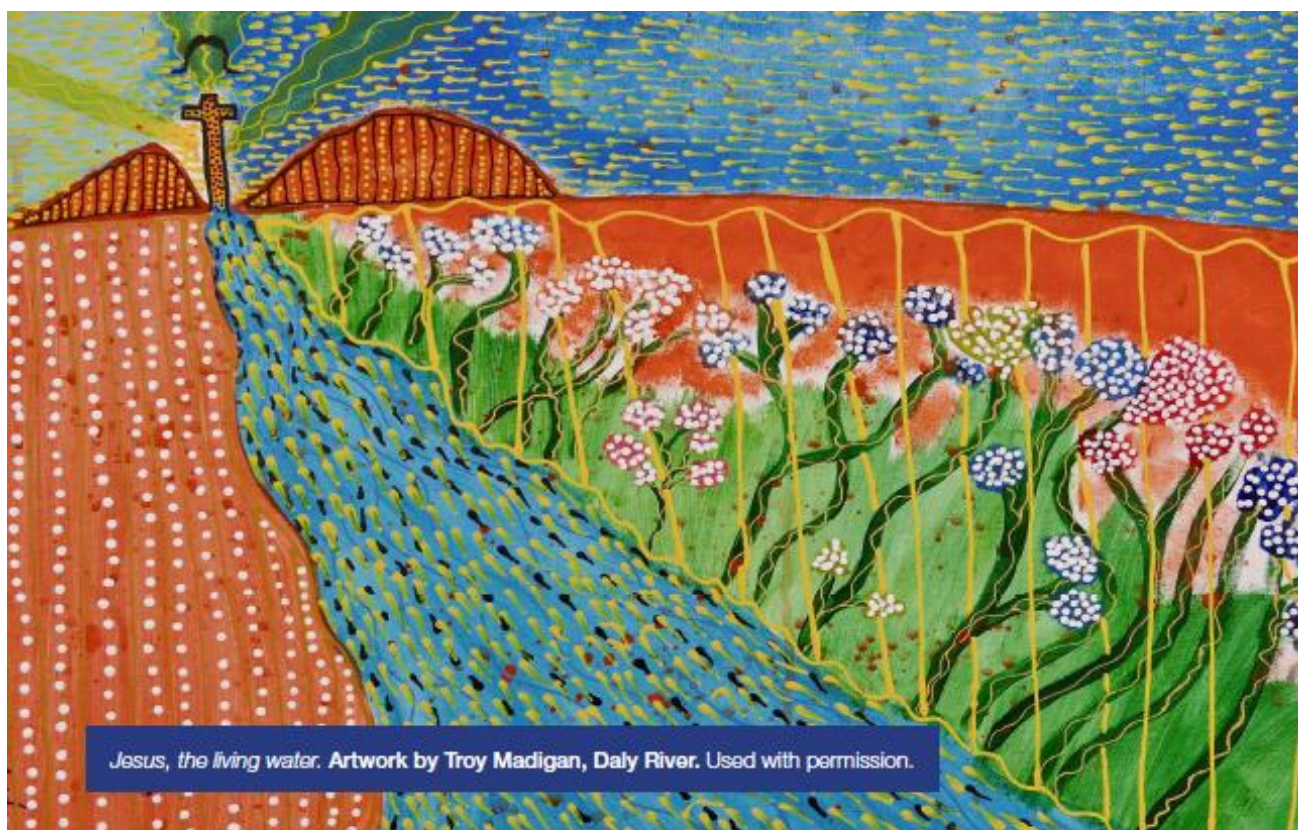
is shown in a garden enclosed and on the reverse are symbols of **purity and nativity.**

St Dorothea

is the patron saint of gardens and orchards, and by extrapolation, the environment. The **torch** symbolises her

zeal for the faith and the **roses and apples** are symbols of her patronage. According to her apocryphal tradition, she was a resident of Caesarea, Cappadocia, who when she refused to sacrifice to the gods during Emperor Diocletian's persecution of the Christians, was tortured by the governor and ordered executed. On the way to the place of execution, she met a young lawyer, Theophilus, who mockingly asked her to send him fruits from 'the garden' she had joyously announced she would soon be in.

When she knelt for her execution, she prayed. When she finished the prayer, an angel appeared before her in the form of a handsome child presenting her three apples and three roses on a pure linen cloth. The saint requested that these be given to Theophilus telling him she would meet him in the garden after which she was beheaded by the sword. **Theophilus** was converted to Christianity and later was martyred. Her **feast day** is February 6th. Saint Dorothy is also patroness of brewers, brides, florists, midwives, newlyweds and of the village of Pescia in Italy.


Restoration Walk Pavers

on The Uluru Statement from the Heart

Listen to Noel's story as he speaks about his connection to Aboriginal Spirituality, his work on the Uluru Statement and the Voice to Parliament referendum, followed by a Q&A panel session.

Noel Pearson comes from the Guugu Yimidhir community of Hope Vale on the south-eastern Cape York Peninsula. Noel was one of 250 delegates who adopted the Uluru Statement from the Heart.

Mr Pearson is a lawyer, Founder and Director of Strategy of the Cape York Partnership and Founder and Co-Chair of Good to Great Schools Australia. He also co-founded the Cape York Land Council, and helped to establish Apunipima Health Council, Balkanu Cape York Development Corporation and Indigenous Enterprise Partnerships.



Mr Pearson served as a member of the Expert Panel on Constitutional Recognition of Indigenous Australians and the Referendum Council. In 2022 he was appointed by the government to the Referendum Working Group and Referendum Engagement Group.

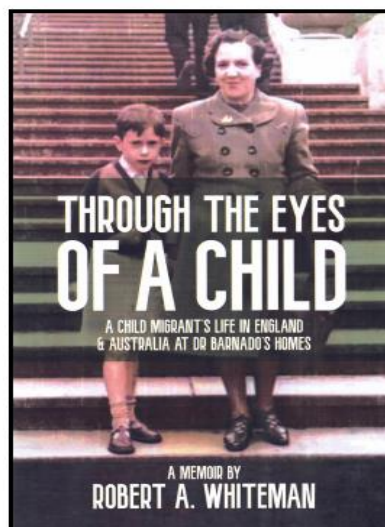

ON A MISSION TO PROTECT OUR ENVIRONMENT



Birds, fish, water, and trees set the scene as three members of Newcastle Anglican's environmental arm sit down for a chat. "We're at the Hunter Wetlands Centre, and scientists tell us that if you cut open a bird or fish there is likely to be microplastics or plastics inside," Anglican EcoCare Chair Reverend Andrew Eaton says. "Part of our mission is to get parishes engaged with all aspects of being ecofriendly and environmentally aware."

"So, we're encouraging parishioners and the Anglican Diocese of Newcastle to make lots of small changes to their lifestyles."

Reverend Andrew is joined by fellow members Robyn Fry and Dr Di Rayson in discussing Anglicans' longstanding concerns about environmental issues and their impact on people and the planet. These concerns can be seen in the Five Marks of Mission – an important statement that describes the Anglican Communion's common commitment, including to protect and conserve the environment and life on Earth.

On World Environment Day (5 June), Anglican EcoCare is renewing calls to reduce the number of plastics we consume in our everyday lives.

"We want our parishes to think about going plastic free with everything they do," Reverend Robyn Fry says.

"That means no more plastic cups. Try instead to get things in paper or cardboard and buy products that don't come in plastic."

World Environment Day is a timely reminder that people's actions on plastic pollution matters. It also highlights the steps governments, businesses, and organisations are taking to tackle the issue.

"A number of our parishes will take the opportunity to plant trees on the day," Reverend Andrew says.

"Dioceses all over the world will do the same and they are responding to the climate crisis, in line with the fifth mark of the Anglican Communion."

"We'd love our churches and different Diocesan agencies to take World Environment Day as a springboard into a greater focus on what we do."

Apart from making small changes within its own parishes, the Diocese of Newcastle has also been leading the way on the world stage.

The Diocese was the first in Australia to make an official commitment to stop investing in fossil fuel companies. This means its assets will be permanently off limits.

The Global Divestment Commitment, which included 30 other faith institutions from the USA, UK, Canada, Italy, and France, represented more than \$2 billion in assets under management.

"It's about creating systemic change," Dr Rayson says.

"We are happy to support local church communities in making small changes to their everyday lives, but it's those massive policy changes that we, as a Diocese, want to be involved in."
