# Dear Parish Family

I am writing this on the Feast of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, 29<sup>th</sup> June. On 29<sup>th</sup> June 1847, William Tyrrell was consecrated bishop, and became the First Bishop of the Diocese of Newcastle, Australia. It's a special day for us as a Diocese, and for us as a Cathedral, as Tyrrell's consecration and the creation of the Diocese of Newcastle, meant that the then Christ Church Newcastle became a Cathedral. Next time you are in the Cathedral, you might like to spend some time in the Tyrrell chapel, behind the High Altar.

NAIDOC week begins on Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> July. At 12.00pm, Canon Auntie Di Langham will be raising the Aboriginal Flag in the Cathedral grounds. For the past few weeks, the pewslip has contained lots of notices about upcoming events for NAIDOC week. As a Parish Community we are committed to the ongoing work of being a safe, welcoming, inclusive, and affirming place for all. We are committed to the journey of *Makarrata* – reconciliation with First Nations peoples.

Thank you also for your ongoing prayers for our LGBTQIA+ community, at this time when their validity and identity continues to be challenged and questioned.

The leader of the retreat is the Reverend Janet Killen, who will also be the preacher at the ordination. Please pray for them all over these days. You are very welcome to attend the ordination as well. If you are able to help with being a sidesperson on the morning, please contact Graham Vimpani as soon as possible.

**ATTENDING WORSHIP:** Please continue to be mindful of COVIDSafe practices as we gather, and to be mindful of our own health and vulnerabilities as well as those in our community. Please strongly consider wearing a mask in places, including church, where you feel you are not able to adequately maintain physical distancing.

The sacrament is administered in both kinds. You are welcome to receive in one or both kinds. We ask that you do not intinct (dip) the host.

Finally, this week's poem, is by Rabbi Rachel Barenblat, who has an online blog called *The Velveteen Rabbi*. Over the past few weeks, we have heard, at Sunday Eucharists and Evensongs, stories from Genesis telling of Abraham and Sarah and Hagar. Many of these readings are confronting. Such is the case with our first reading this Sunday, of the almost sacrifice of Isaac. Rabbi Rachel Barenblat reframed this story for me, this week. The opening stanza, placing Abraham's actions in a wider context which we often lose, reading and hearing the stories as we do in Lectionary bite-sized snippets, challenges our often Sunday Schoolesque sanitised understandings of this story. Make no mistake, this story is horrific, and Barenblat's poem captures the horror, and the ramifications (no pun intended with *ram*-ificiations).

## Silence

Abraham failed the test. For Sodom and Gomorrah he argued but when it came to his son no protest crossed his lips.

God was mute with horror. Abraham, smasher of idols and digger of wells was meant to talk back.

Sarah would have been wiser but Abraham avoided her tent, didn't lay his head in her lap to unburden his secret heart.

In stricken silence God watched as Abraham saddled his ass and took Isaac on their final hike to the place God would show him.

The angel had to call him twice.

Abraham's eyes were red, his voice hoarse
he wept like a man pardoned
but God never spoke to him again.

# About the music

Today's music is a celebration of the long history of English Church Music, from the 1500s in 'If ye love me' of Thomas Tallis and John Blitheman's exquisite In Pace ('In peace' - our Evensong anthem), through the music of Byrd (published in 1603), to rich colourful music of the twentieth century, in the music of Sumsion, Neary and Grayston Ives. Every one of these composers has an interesting story - Thomas Tallis was arguably the first really great English composer, and, William Byrd, a generation younger, held the reigns of English music through the turbulence of Tudor England - a period when the English church's allegiance to Rome vacillated, and the personal safety of creative people depended on their ability to navigate the changing times. Herbert Sumsion was the organist of Gloucester Cathedral, and along with Herbert Howells and Harold Darke, one of the best-loved composers for the English church in the last century. Grayston Ives was organist and choir director at Magdalen College Oxford until his retirement in 2009, while Martin Neary held positions of organist and choir master at both Westminster Abbey and Westminster Cathedral. This great tradition continues in the St Nicholas Mass - a Mass composed for the choirs of Christ Church Cathedral.

# **Banners - Arch-Angel Michael**



Michael's name means 'like unto God'. He is Captain of the heavenly hosts and protector of the Church Militant. He is guardian of the Redeemed and is shown as a warrior in perpetual battle with the Prince of Hell. It is Michael who will sound the

# last Trumpet. (Brochure) Pommee Cross

The defining attribute of the Pomme Cross is the circular terminus of each arm. The circle was a simplification of an apple, which in turn represented the fruits and rewards of a life spent being a good Christian.



#### **Botonee Cross**

Botonee is a word from the middle-French language

meaning button. The Botonee Cross has a cluster of three balls, knobs, or buttons at the end of each arm. The Botonee Cross originated with heraldry.



St Michael appears four times in the Bible, two of them in the book of Daniel. In the first, Daniel has a vision of a powerful man or angel who tells him, "The prince of the kingdom of Persia withstood me twenty-one days; but Michael, one of the chief princes, came to help me, so I left him there with the prince of the kingdom of Persia and came to make you understand what is to befall your people in the latter days... There is none who contends by my side against these except Michael, your prince" (Dan 10:13, 21).

# Walking from Nazareth to Galilee, then on to Jerusalem and beyond... A Pilgrimage led by Rev'd Michael Armstrong

There is something special and sacred about the Holy Land – stepping in the places where Jesus trod, touching the places he touched.

In 2024 I am planning to take a pilgrimage with a difference – a walk from Nazareth to Galilee, then on to Jerusalem. It is a Pilgrimage with a difference including a trek, before a tour by bus and foot around Jerusalem.

We will visit sacred sites that are part of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. We will also visit sites and places linked with other parts of the scriptures. Importantly we will also be visiting the amazing work of the Anglican Diocese of Jerusalem, supported through the Sustainable Communities Program of the Anglican Board of Mission Anglicans in Development (ABM AID).

This tour is led by myself through Olive Tree Travel and Keshet Tours. It is with a small group – deliberately as that is part of the experience that is offered. Pilgrims who attend will be expected to raise funds for ABM AID's Sustainable Communities Program, which includes projects in the Holy Land, prior to departure, and resources will be provided to assist with this.

Pilgrims will also need to be able to walk over several days up to 20km's on trails of various terrain with a day pack (our large bags are transported to our hotel each day), and so need a reasonable level of fitness.





on The Wenru Statement from the Heart

Listen to Noel's story as he speaks about his connection to Aboriginal Spirituality, his work on the Uluru Statement and the Voice to Parliament referendum, followed by a Q&A panel session.

Noel Pearson comes from the Guugu Yimidhim community of Hope Vale on the south-eastern Cape York Peninsula. Noel was one of 250 delegates who adopted the Uluru Statement from the Heart.

Mr Pearson is a lawyer, Founder and Director of Strategy of the Cape York Partnership and Founder and Co-Chair of Good to Great Schools Australia. He also co-founded the Cape York Land Council, and helped to establish Apunipima Health Council, Balkanu Cape York Development Corporation and Indigenous Enterprise Partnerships.

Mr Pearson served as a member of the Expert Panel on Constitutional Recognition of Indigenous Australians and the Referendum Council. In 2022 he was appointed by the government to the Referendum Working Group and Referendum Engagement Group.
