SEA SUNDAY: Sunday 16th July is Sea Sunday, and that evening's Evensong will be our annual service of prayer and thanksgiving for the work of Seafarers, and also the blessing of the Port. There will be supper following the service.

Another Arch Angel – Uriel

A heavenly creature made of light and regent of the Sun


His name means 'the light of God'. Not only light but enlightenment, as he carries a



book (or scroll) indicating his interpreter role as of judgments and prophecies. **Uriel.** in the Jewish and Christian Apocrypha, a leading angel, sometimes ranked as an archangel with Michael. Gabriel, and Raphael. Because his name in Hebrew means "fire of God" or "light of God," been variously he has identified in Jewish traditions as an angel of thunder and earthquake, as the wielder of the fiery sword in driving Adam and Eve from the Garden of Eden, the as destroyer of the hosts of Sennacherib, as the figure who enlightens Ezra with visions, and, generally, as an angel of terror, prophecy, or mystery. The English poet John Milton in Paradise Lost described



Uriel as 'Regent of the Sun' and the 'sharpest sighted spirit of all in Heaven.' (Britannica) Uriel is often depicted carrying either a book or a scroll, both of which represent **wisdom**. Another symbol connected with Uriel is an open hand holding a **flame or the sun**, which represents God's truth. The **Agnus Dei** is a visual representation of Jesus as the Lamb, since the Middle Ages usually carrying a halo and holding a standard or banner with a cross and symbolising the victory.





An evening with Nocl Pearson on The Wenn Statement from the Heart

Listen to Noel's story as he speaks about his connection to Aboriginal Spirituality, his work on the Uluru Statement and the Voice to Parliament referendum, followed by a Q&A panel session.

Noel Pearson comes from the Guugu Yimidhim community of Hope Vale on the south-eastern Cape York Peninsula. Noel was one of 250 delegates who adopted the Uluru Statement from the Heart.

Mr Pearson is a lawyer, Founder and Director of Strategy of the Cape York Partnership and Founder and Co-Chair of Good to Great Schools Australia. He also co-founded the Cape York Land Council, and helped to establish Apunipima Health Council, Balkanu Cape York Development Corporation and Indigenous Enterprise Partnerships.

Mr Pearson served as a member of the Expert Panel on Constitutional Recognition of Indigenous Australians and the Referendum Council. In 2022 he was appointed by the government to the Referendum Working Group and Referendum Engagement Group.
