## **Music notes**

Today we celebrate the Feast of Mary, Mother of the Lord, and this is reflected in the hymns and in Rachmaninoff's extraordinary Bogoroditsye dyevo:

*Rejoice, virgin mother of God,  
Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you.  
Blessed are you among women,  
and blessed is the fruit of your womb,  
for you have borne the Savior of our souls.*

For those who know Rachmaninoff's music from his Piano Concertos, this music has all of the same passion, but is also clearly in the tradition of Russian Orthodox church music. Our anthem for the Eucharist is the last part of an organ by Siegfried Karg-Elert, an outstanding German composer of the late 1800s, best known for his vast output of organ music. This work begins with the organ, but after an enormous climax we join the music with the entry of a solo violin, and before long the entry of a four-part ladies choir, first singing the opening text of the Creed, and then a glorious series of Amens.
