On Friday, we hosted the Year 12 Valedictory Service for Newcastle Grammar School. As a parish, and Cathedral, we have a very special relationship with Newcastle Grammar. Please pray for all Year 12 students over these next weeks.

Next Friday (29th September) is the Feast of St Michael. St Michael is the patron saint of the police, and we will host the annual Police Remembrance Day Service at 11.00am. This service is open to the public, and I encourage you to come along and pray for all who work in this service to the community.

Our media continues to be dominated by talk about the forthcoming referendum. As a Diocese, we have twice affirmed our support for The Voice. As a Parish Community we are committed to the ongoing work of being a safe, welcoming, inclusive, and affirming place for all. 
Exalted Manna



As you say each line, slide the bead along the string.

When you end all the beads and the cross are held in your hand, as you meditate.
