In some sad news, we had a break in at the cathedral this week, and a small amount of cash was taken. The police attended and are investigating further. Please be mindful of personal safety when in our church buildings and grounds. In some happier news, however, Fire and Rescue attended the Cathedral and rescued a kookaburra from the tower. Kookaburra and rescuers are all well!

There's lots of information in the pewslip this week. Part of the advantage of an emailed pewslip is we are able to include more information about events which connect with different members of our community, such as Families@Five, the Police Remembrance Service and the Prayer Morning for Health Practitioners. Our media continues to be dominated by talk about the forthcoming referendum. As a Diocese, we have twice affirmed our support for The Voice. As a Parish Community we are committed to the ongoing work of being a safe, welcoming, inclusive, and affirming place for all. We are committed to the journey of *Makarrata* – reconciliation with First Nations peoples. Thank you also for your ongoing prayers for our LGBTQIA+ community, whose validity and identity continues to be challenged and questioned.

Join us at Evensong through September to celebrate the Season of Creation.



As you say each line, slide the bead along the string.

When you end all the beads and the cross are held in your hand, as you meditate.


