This weekend we celebrate the great feast of All Saints, and on Thursday 2nd November, we remember before God those holy people who are precious for us, at our annual All Souls Mass. 

Who are we, and what is the Top End Music project?

In October 2023, three musicians from Newcastle, NSW travelled to Bamaga, QLD, to bring and make music with the community. David Banney (violist, composer, educator and Director of Music at Christ Church Cathedral, Newcastle), Rosemary Ponnekanti (flute, piano) and Bianca Ponnekanti (violin) spent five days supported by the Northern Regional Area council, art gallery and College (K-12), and welcomed by the Bamaga community. As we tell the story of our trip, Rosemary will write the words, Bianca will create this site and we'll all contribute to the images. We are grateful to the Islander and Aboriginal people of the Northern Peninsula Area for their welcome, support, music-making and care for country.

We are devastated by the result of the referendum. It is a major disappointment to our communities.

We believe that Australia has lost a great opportunity to share the gift of our culture.

This is a familiar story historically for us. We pay respects to our Elders, Leaders and families for their courage and example.

The fight for justice and the rights of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people will continue.

We need time to heal, time to reassess, time to think and time to talk about our next steps.

As a Diocesan community, we need to support our First Nations employees, clients and people in our Diocese with love and care.

The National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Anglican Council will be meeting this week (24th – 26th October).

We will be sharing our Australia-wide Diocesan experiences and reassessing who we are. We need to plan what we believe should be the Anglican Churches' future directions.

We thank all those who supported the Yes vote.

Always was and always will be Aboriginal land.

ABM EMERGENCY APPEAL - Al Ahli Arab Hospital



AID has launched an emergency appeal for the Al Ahli Hospital in Gaza. **Devastating news. Hundreds killed in strike on the Al-Ahli Hospital in Gaza.** Having already dealt with being hit by rockets on Saturday evening leaving four people injured, there has now been a fatal strike on the Al Ahli Arab Hospital. Initial estimates suggest the death toll is at least 200 people, but possibly more than 500 people have been killed.

The hospital has recently served as a shelter for thousands of residents who fled their homes in northern Gaza seeking safety from Israeli airstrikes. Stranded residents are running out of medicine, food, water and power. ABM asks you to join with us in prayer. We pray for an immediate ceasefire and for a resolution of the longer-term conflict that has caused so much suffering. We pray for the staff who continue to serve those in need despite danger to their own lives. We pray for all those who mourn.






Operarté is a marriage of the genius of ARC Living Master Artist, Mr Gordon Hanley, and The Underground Opera Company ...and it's all Gold!

"For art lovers it is an incredible exhibition with an exceptional, live soundtrack; for the Opera lovers it's an exceptional concert of Opera greats (with a dash of




