Finally, this week's poem is Rabbi Rachel Barenblat, who writes an online blog entitled *Velveteen Rabbi*. I have quoted Rabbi Barenblat's poetry before, for I find in her poetry a wonderful synthesis of scripture, worship, and lyrical beauty and wonder. This week's poem is tangentially connected to our psalm, but echoes far more the opening of Genesis chapter one, where God speaks creation into being. This too is then reflected in the prologue of John's Gospel, which reminds us, that, in the beginning was the word. Do we ponder – or wonder – about ourselves, about others, as part of the good gifts of creation?

This reminds me of the ways in which First Nations peoples speak about Songlines:

"In his 1987 book <u>The Songlines</u>, British novelist and travel writer <u>Bruce</u> <u>Chatwin</u> describes the songlines as:

... the labyrinth of invisible pathways which meander all over Australia and are known to Europeans as "Dreaming-tracks" or "Songlines"; to the Aboriginals as the "Footprints of the Ancestors" or the "Way of the Lore".

Aboriginal Creation myths tell of the legendary totemic being who wandered over the continent in the Dreamtime, singing out the name of everything that crossed their path - birds, animals, plants, rocks, waterholes - and so singing the world into existence."¹

Whilst we marvel at creative power, it is also a salient reminder to we (who are not God) to be aware of the power of our words. When we speak, what do we bring into being? Are our words blessing, lifegiving?



Music Notes....

A highlight of this week's music is our anthem for Evensong - Upon Your Heart, by the Canadian composer Eleanor Daley. A recipient of the Order of Canada for her services to music, Daley is an organist, choral conductor and composer. This beautiful motet is a setting of the text from the Song of Solomon - Set me as a seal upon your heart. It has become part of our repertoire thanks to Emilie Butcher, one our beloved choristers, who has been a member of the choir for more than twenty years, and whose wedding is this weekend. The anthem was chosen for her wedding and is a perfect piece for our Evensong.



Fauré's beautiful Requiem Mass is one of the best-loved works in the choral repertoire, replete with beautiful melodies and lush harmonies, and the rest of the program catches its elegiac mood. Robert Davidson is one of Australia's most important composers, and his beautiful Elegy will set the scene for Vaughan Williams timeless classic *The Lark Ascending*. Composed in 1914, but not premiered until 1920, the 'Lark' is based on a poem of the same name by George Meredith, but is surely imbued with the composer's emotions surrounding the First World War. Lament for Strings was composed in 1946 by the young American composed George Walker (later to win a Pulitzer Prize), and dedicated to his grandmother, who had been an enslaved woman, and died during the composition of the work.



EXHIBITION OF DRAFT NEWCASTLE CITY CENTRE HERITAGE CONSERVATION AREAS REVIEW REPORT

Council at its meeting of 31 October 2023 resolved to exhibit the Draft Newcastle City Centre Heritage Conservation Areas Review Report (draft report). The draft report documents a review of two of our eight heritage conservation areas and input from the community.

Earlier this year we asked for community feedback on which streets, buildings, and places in the Newcastle City Centre and Newcastle East areas have heritage significance and contribute to Newcastle's cultural identity. This feedback is considered and addressed in the draft report.

The cost is \$5 per family – your first session is free! 10:00am to 11:30 every Thursday during school terms in the Cathedral.




