Dear Parish Family

This weekend is one of great **CELEBRATION!** This weekend we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, the Patronal Festival of our Cathedral. The St Nicholas Choir will be singing with us on that day, and we will be celebrating a baptism and some confirmations. Bishop Peter Stuart will be with us, and Bishop Chris Jones, Assistant Bishop in Tasmania, will be our guest preacher. If you are able to help with morning tea on that Sunday, please contact Justina Gabriel.

DON'T FORGET: On Sunday 26th November there will be a combined Eucharist celebration at 9.00am.

To continue our celebrations on 26th November, the final Camerata Concert is at 2.30pm that day. Details about the programme and how to purchase tickets are in the pewslip.

BLESSING OF THE WATERCRAFT: Thank you to those who have contacted me re the blessing of the watercraft and those who will be in them, as part of the environmental action on Newcastle Harbour this weekend. I am aware that this is a sensitive issue for many. On the one hand, I have received much positive feedback and support for voicing concerns about the environment, and how we, in this region, advocate for a just transition for all impacted by moves to renewable energy sources.

On the other hand, I have received approaches questioning why I would be involved in such activity, hosting it in the cathedral grounds and lending my voice.

I am thankful for all who have engaged with me.

A few statements:

- Before I engaged in any action, I sought confirmation that this was a legal protest. The action with which I was involved concerned legal action. I do not support nor bless illegal activity.
- I was clear that that my prayers were for a peaceful protest, and the *safety of all.*
- If you read the Newcastle Herald article, or saw the NBN News, you will have heard me talking about the need to be good stewards of the environment, and work towards a just transition, mindful of environmental and economic impact.
- Newcastle Anglican supports environmental activism but has made the decision to withdraw its involvement in a Rising Tide blockade this weekend, due to concerns about unauthorised protesting. Hunter ARRCC-Australian Religious Response to Climate Change and Anglican EcoCare Newcastle will no longer be participating.

I am always happy to discuss this further. Please contact the office to make a time to meet with me.

As a Parish Community we are committed to the ongoing work of being a safe, welcoming, inclusive, and affirming place for all. We are committed to the journey of *Makarrata* – reconciliation with First Nations peoples. Thank you also for your ongoing prayers for our LGBTQIA+ community, at this time when their validity and identity continues to be challenged and questioned.

I encourage you to spend sometime in the St Michael/Warrior Chapel gazing at the magnificent window of Christ the King which is above the altar. This window, like this poem, encapsulates all the paradoxes of this reign, and how we are called to follow in this radical, risky way.

A POEM FOR THE FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING

See how this infant boy lifted himself down into his humble crèche and laid his tender glove of skin against splintered wood found refuge in a rack of straw—home that chilly dawn, in sweetest silage, those shriven stalks. This outcast king lifted himself high upon his savage cross, extended the regal banner of his bones, draping himself upon his throne—his battered feet, his wounded hands not fastened there by nails but sewn by the strictest thorn of love.



Music notes

On Sunday morning we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King with music spanning 800 years, from the lively Introit Alle psallite ('With devoted hearts let us sing loud praises to the Lord), to the music of living composers in our Gloria and anthems. The Introit consists of a bass line in which a simple phrase is repeated, extended in length each time, while the sopranos and altos sing a lively duet above it. At this service we will hear the St Nicholas Choir, and recognise their great work with the presentation of Royal School of Music medals and certificates. The success of the St Nicholas Choir would not be possible without the wonderful work of Veronica Butcher and Rosie Murree-Allen, and it is with sad hearts that we farewell Veronica at the end of this year as she leaves Newcastle to take up a new job in a very exciting phase of her career. At Evensong our anthem picks the text of our scripture readings: 'Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.'



Fauré's beautiful Requiem Mass is one of the best-loved works in the choral repertoire, replete with beautiful melodies and lush harmonies, and the rest of the program catches its elegiac mood. Robert Davidson is one of Australia's most important composers, and his beautiful Elegy will set the scene for Vaughan Williams timeless classic *The Lark Ascending*. Composed in 1914, but not premiered until 1920, the 'Lark' is based on a poem of the same name by George Meredith, but is surely imbued with the composer's emotions surrounding the First World War. Lament for Strings was composed in 1946 by the young American composed George Walker (later to win a Pulitzer Prize), and dedicated to his grandmother, who had been an enslaved woman, and died during the composition of the work.

EXHIBITION OF DRAFT NEWCASTLE CITY CENTRE HERITAGE CONSERVATION AREAS REVIEW REPORT

Council at its meeting of 31 October 2023 resolved to exhibit the Draft Newcastle City Centre Heritage Conservation Areas Review Report (draft report). The draft report documents a review of two of our eight heritage conservation areas and input from the community.

Earlier this year we asked for community feedback on which streets, buildings, and places in the Newcastle City Centre and Newcastle East areas have heritage significance and contribute to Newcastle's cultural identity. This feedback is considered and addressed in the draft report.

ITEMS FOR LOST NEWCASTLE RE CHRIST CHURCH CATHEDRAL Provided by Ian Eckford

1. 20 NOVEMBER 2023

40 years ago, on 20 November 1983, the new Tower and Transepts to Christ Church Cathedral, Newcastle were consecrated by Bishop Alfred Holland.The new structures were designed by Newcastle architects Castleden and Sara (John Sara) and were constructed by Newcastle builders W. Stronach Pty. Limited. The Transepts had been effectively completed by May 1978 and the Tower by May 1979.



2.1 DECEMBER 2023

155 years ago, on 1 December 1868, design submissions were made by architects for the new Christ Church Cathedral, Newcastle. 14 entries were received by the Parochial Council and the winners were Melbourne architects Leonard Terry and Robert Speechley. They received £75 (about \$12,000 in 2023) but did not wish to proceed. Sydney architect John Horbury Hunt was ultimately engaged and his design, completed by Newcastle architects Castleden and Sara, stands in Church Street today.
