Finally, this week's poem is a reference to our Gaudete Sunday theme. The words " joy is supposed to slither through/ the cracks of your imperfect life/ that's how joy works" were a reminder for me to look for the joy in the everyday. This week I have been blessed with some unexpected moments of pure joy, which have refreshed my soul, at time when there feels to be much brokenness. I love the use of the word "slither', subverting the imagery of the snake in Genesis 3, reminding us that the incarnation is joy for a broken world.

Joy does not arrive with a fanfare on a red carpet strewn with the flowers of a perfect life joy sneaks in as you pour a cup of coffee watching the sun hit your favourite tree just right

and you usher joy away because you are not ready for her your house is not as it should be for such a distinguished guest

you cannot truly invite her you can only be ready when she appears and hug her with meaning because in this very moment joy chose you.



Music notes

Choosing music for a Cathedral is a never-ending job for any Music Director, and the aim is always to amplify and illuminate the message of the scriptures for any given service. Sometimes it's easy, and sometimes it is not. Sometimes the challenge is finding even a single hymn or anthem to match the readings. At other times - even more challenging - the problem is choosing what to leave out! Advent is such a time - like Lent, Easter and Christmas, it is a season that has inspired composers and poets throughout the world and over many centuries to produce words and music of utmost beauty.

Each Sunday in Advent has a special purpose - the first two Sundays prepare us to wait for Christmas, while the fourth Sunday focuses on the role of Mary in the Christmas story. The third Sunday is 'Gaudete' Sunday (='to rejoice'). Unlike Lent, which is a uniformly sombre preparation for Easter, Advent takes us through a wide range of experiences and emotions, and today we 'rejoice' in the knowledge of what is to come - we wait for Christmas not passively, but with excited expectation. To help us, today's music ranges from the brilliant and boisterous to the profound. Our Mass setting is a striking work from 17th century Mexico, following the style of European contemporaries such as Monteverdi. Set for two separate choirs, the music will fill the Cathedral with rich harmony and rhythmic zest. Our introit has a very similar style, also for double choir, and coming from the same era, but from Poland rather than from Mexico.

It is a setting of part of Psalm 96, foreshadowing the coming of Jesus: Sing to the Lord a new song (the Psalms set for Christmas services are Psalm 96, 97 and 98 - it is definitely worth reading these wonderful texts in the leadup to Christmas). Our anthem for morning and evening comes from the Russian Orthodox tradition, composed by a magnificent composer, little known in the west - Pavel Chesnokov (1877-1944). Taken from the Eucharistic liturgy, the text joyfully places us in the company of heaven:

We who mystically represent the Cherubim, and who sing to the Life-Giving Trinity the thrice-holy hymn, let us now lay aside all earthly cares that we may receive the King of all, escorted invisibly by the angelic orders. Alleluia


