Being a people of prayer and action is part of our commitment as a Parish Community to the ongoing work of being a safe, welcoming, inclusive, and affirming place for all. We are committed to the journey of *Makarrata* – reconciliation with First Nations peoples. Thank you also for your ongoing prayers for our LGBTQIA+ community, at this time when their validity and identity continues to be challenged and questioned.

CATHEDRAL DAILY EUCHARISTS continue, and it has been lovely to be joined by visitors to the Cathedral over these days. Why not join us one morning too? Monday-Friday, 8,30am, except on Public Holidays.

BLESSING OF THE BACKPACKS: Families@Five returns for 2024 on Saturday 3rd February at 5.00pm, with our annual Blessing of the Backpacks. Each year, we bless those beginning or returning to school or education, and we collect donations for Samaritans to distribute to families in need. *Can't make it to the service?* Don't worry – you can still contribute back-to-school supplies – please bring them to the office (during office hours) or leave in the container in the St Christopher Chapel.

SHROVE TUESDAY: It's an 'early' Lent this year, with Ash Wednesday on Wednesday 14th February. This means that Shrove Tuesday will soon be here too! Information is in the pewslip – please mark the date now! Tickets available from the office, or after services.

ASH WEDNESDAY: There will be three Ash Wednesday Eucharists in the parish on Wednesday 14th February. Please see the service times in the pewslip.

LENTEN STUDIES: I said last Sunday that Lent is a time for enrichment. There will be many opportunities for growth this Lent. There is information in the pewslip about a Lenten Study Group, and an online retreat, and more information will be coming as we come closer to Ash Wednesday. Plan now to set aside time to grow in faith.

VOLUNTEERS: Would you be willing to assist in welcoming people to worship? Nothing says welcome more than a smile and a friendly greeting. We need welcomers for all our Services. COVID AND ATTENDING WORSHIP: COVID is on the rise again! Please continue to be mindful of COVIDSafe practices as we gather, and to be mindful of our own health and vulnerabilities as well as those in our community. Please strongly consider wearing a mask in places, including church, where you feel you are not able to adequately maintain physical distancing.

The Fish



Music notes

A very Happy New Year from all of the musicians, as we look forward to a year of musical riches in 2024. The choir will return in full swing at the beginning of February, but next week the choir will sing at the Eucharist, which will be the last Sunday for our beloved chorister and Family Ministry Coordinator, Veronica Butcher.

This week the music at the 10am service will give the congregation an unusual chance to reflect deeply on the texts of the Mass. Instead of singing the Mass, it will be a Mass for Violin and Piano, and you are encouraged to use the music as a guide to focus on the meaning of the texts that we sing every week. With a focus on Australian composers, the music for the Censing of the Altar comes from Peter Sculthorpe's 'Quamby' Quartet, named after Quamby Bluff in Tasmania, close to Sculthorpe's family home, and the scene of a massacre of indigenous people many years ago. During communion we hear 'The Innocents', a work dedicated to all survivors and victims of sexual abuse within a religious context and commissioned as a collaboration between Elizabeth Seysener - Clergy Abused Network, and Zimmerman Service Healing and Support - Catholic Diocese of Maitland Newcastle through the Bishops Healing Fund'. What's been happening in January...?

Well, quite a lot, actually!

At Christmas, you may have noticed that access to the path to the Cathedral Office was blocked. This was because a wall alongside the path was in danger of collapse.


Early in January, builders demolished and made safe the leaning wall, uncovering the Deanery coal store, from a time when heating and cooking was coal fired, in the process. You can see the remnants on your way to the office.

Stage two will involve assessment of the existing footings, and stage three rebuilding the wall. We are thankful that it appears that insurance may cover most of the cost.



The choir vestry has been repainted, as part of a project to enhance it as a rehearsal and preparation space. One of the challenges was that the light in the vestry was often very dim. Additional lights have also been installed, and the next step is to replace the amber glass with clear glass to enhance natural light.



80th Anniversary of the Ordination of the Reverend Florence Li Tim-Oi

Join us at the 8.30am Eucharist on Thursday 25th January to celebrate the 80th anniversary of the ordination of the Reverend Florence Li Tim-Oi, the first woman to be ordained in the Anglican Communion. Refreshments afterwards.



About Florence Li Tim-Oi: "When a priest could no longer travel from Japanese-occupied territory to preside for her at the eucharist, for three years Tim-Oi was licensed to do so as a deacon. Bishop R O Hall of Hong Kong then asked her to meet him in Free China, where on 25th January 1944 he ordained her 'a priest in the Church of God'. He felt that this was as momentous a step as when the Apostle Peter baptised the Gentile Cornelius. As St Peter recognised that God had already given Cornelius the Baptismal gift of the Spirit, so Bishop Hall was merely confirming that God had already given Tim-Oi the gift of priestly ministry.

To defuse controversy, in 1946 Tim-Oi surrendered her priest's licence, but not her Holy Orders, the knowledge of which carried her through Maoist persecution." https://www.ltof.org.uk/litimoi-story/
