Missions - January's Project - Northern Territory Discipleship Track

This project seeks to help remote Aboriginal Christians who want to be intentional in their faith, especially those in leadership, to access much-needed training and support as they seek to witness to Christ in their communities. In May 2017, 25 Indigenous church leaders gathered from nine remote communities around the Northern Territory for one of the



Discipleship Track events – the Pre-Synod workshop. The aim was to enable their full participation in Synod. Each day commenced with studies from the Epistle to the Ephesians, with participants from each community able to read the Bible and talk in their own language. The group prayed together discussed common concerns in church leadership and encouraged one another. These leaders minister in isolated settings, often with little support, which makes gatherings like these very special. Please consider supporting this unique project to help remote Aboriginal Christians as they seek to walk ‘the narrow’ track with God.
