



Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen indeed! Alleluia!

One thing's for certain: it was an Easter Sunday that we will all remember! I'm looking forward to glorious celebrations when we can all be gathered once more. Over the Great Three Days, I placed a wooden cross on the Cathedral steps as a sign to all who pass by that whilst the doors are closed, the work of prayer and faith continues unabated. I've included a photo of the cross on Easter Sunday morning, and each day throughout this Easter season, the cross and some flowers will be there as a visible witness.



Ministry continues too. On Easter Sunday our Community Lunch ministry distributed takeaway meals, including some Easter eggs, for individuals and households at this time. Thank you to all those who make this ministry possible. The Cathedral Shop has been responding to requests for Bibles and prayer resources. The Spirituality group continues to meet weekly on Zoom. I am thankful to Peter Guy for the musical reflections and resources he provides each week. Please visit the Choir's YouTube channel, as well as the Cathedral YouTube channel. From this Sunday, the Reverend Angela Peverell and I will be alternating leading the Sunday Eucharist. Creativity at the Cathedral continues, and please contact Naomi Johnson with any creative offerings you would like to share.

Thank you also for the ways in which you are sharing in ministry. It's lovely to hear of all the connections being made, and information shared. It's especially important as we continue to ensure that everyone receives emails or mailouts with weekly information. ***When you are speaking with someone from the parish, could you please check that they are receiving these emails, and if not, please ask them to let us know.***

Finally, this Sunday's Gospel reading is one of my (many) favourites. The apostle Thomas has long held a special place for me, and the final words of John 20 "Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his

disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.” are a constant comfort and reminder to me that the work of God is not limited, and that by telling the story of our faith, we encourage others in faith too. Malcolm Guite’s poem captures this beautifully.

### **From the Cathedral's Director of Music, Peter Guy...**

The Sunday after Easter is often referred to as "Low Sunday" - a reflection of the contrast between Easter Sunday and this one. It is a Sunday where the choir would usually have a well-deserved rest after the rigorous demands of Holy Week and Easter Sunday. I always feel sorry for the disciple, Thomas, at this time. Already unfairly maligned in general thought because of his doubt in accepting the risen Lord (despite the fact that he is the first to proclaim Christ's identity: My Lord and My God!), his account from the gospel is always read on Low Sunday.

During this week you may have been reading at Evening Prayer from 1 Peter. I find it difficult to read from that letter without hearing Samuel Sebastian Wesley's famous anthem "Blessed be the God and Father", which takes for its text a number of verses from this letter. The New Testament reading for this Sunday morning is from the same epistle. You will find a recording from 1988 by the choir of St Paul's Cathedral, London, at the link below. It is a live broadcast from Dutch TV, so please forgive the subtitles. I chose this recording not only because it is good, but also as it is accompanied by Dr Christopher Dearnley. Before his death in 2000, Dr Dearnley was a friend of this Cathedral, and many in the choir still remember working with him during the 90s. His widow, Bridget, lives in the Hunter Valley and plays the organ and cello at St Matthias', Denman. Enjoy!
