Missions 2018 - ABM has announced that the 2018 Prayer Diary will only be available now via download at www.admission.org/resources to reduce cost and enable this saving to go directly to ABM Partners. Each year ABM produces a Project Book and our monthly envelopes highlight some of these projects. The Project Book and ABM Annual Report are also available on the website. A regular e-letter can be signed up for there also which enables us to stay in touch with the work that ABM is doing with its Partners.

Missions - January's Project - Northern Territory Discipleship Track

This project seeks to help remote Aboriginal Christians who want to be intentional in their faith, especially those in leadership, to access much-needed training and support as they seek to witness to Christ in their communities. In May 2017, 25 Indigenous church leaders gathered from nine remote communities around the Northern Territory for one of the Discipleship Track events – the Pre-Synod workshop. Each day commenced with studies from the Epistle to the Ephesians, with participants from each community able to read the Bible and talk in their own language. *Envelopes are inserted in the pew sheet or can be found at the back of the church.*
