Without doubt times are tough at present and one session would be included about the rather complex reality of abuse, recovery and the way we are working to bring healing and wholeness in our relationships. ## A YEAR OF ANNIVERSARIES & MILESTONES at Christ Church Cathedral Newcastle

- The Governor of NSW will be present for a **4pm Evensong on Sunday 28 May** to commemorate the **BICENTENARY** of the building of the first permanent Church on what is now the Cathedral site. On New Year's Day 1817 the foundation stone was laid and the first service was on Christmas Day of the same year. This church replaced a slab building.
- The **Cathedral Tower** will also be formally reopened and rededicated at the **28 May** service.
- The 100 years old **Birdwood Flag** is presently undergoing conservation and restoration and will be rededicated and displayed in the Cathedral during this year.
- **12 October 2017** will mark the anniversary of the death of **Captain Clarence Jeffries VC** whose medals are displayed in the Cathedral. Capt. Jeffries was killed in the Battle of Passchendaele, 1917.
