

important city in Mexico at that time. His music is a spicy mix of Renaissance and Baroque styles (excuse the jargon again – think somewhere between Palestrina and Vivaldi), with many hints of indigenous rhythms. His command of compositional technique and his liturgical awareness is superb. This is great music, and how extraordinary that music from a Spanish composer working in Mexico is sung in Newcastle four centuries later, with a string ensemble that represents an international organisation (the Australia New Zealand Viola Society)! The music was composed for two choirs, but following the practice of Padilla's own time, we will perform it this morning with the voices of our cathedral choir as the first choir, and instruments as the second choir, resulting in a rich interplay between the two groups.

There is an enticing connection between Padilla's Mass and the Australian New Zealand Viola Society. Vaughan Williams composed a beautiful, large-scale work entitled *Flos Campi*, for solo viola, orchestra and choir. Try as I might, I have not been able to smuggle any of that music into today's service! But we could not go without some Vaughan Williams, and our introit is Vaughan Williams setting of a text that summarises all of today's scripture readings – 'O taste and see how gracious the Lord is'.

Our music for Evensong features two favourites of English church music – Noble's majestic setting of the Magnificat and Nunc dimittis, and Christopher Tye's beautiful anthem, 'Lord, for thy tender mercies' sake'.

FAREWELL PETER GUY

For so long we have all enjoyed the impeccable playing of organist Peter Guy at Christ Church Cathedral. Every year during the Newcastle Music Festival, hundreds have packed the Cathedral to enjoy Peter's lunchtime recitals, and congregations have basked in his music

during many services. Now, Peter is leaving us to take up studies in Hungarian city of Kecskemet, about 80 km from Budapest.

Peter gives his last solo recital on Tuesday, August 2 at 1pm.

Peter takes us on a musical journey from **"Vienna to Budapest"**, performing works by **Liszt, Brahms, Dezso Antalaffy-Zsiross, and Haydn**, then gives the **world premiere performance** of Dr. John Phillips' transcription of the reconstructed last movement of **Anton Bruckner's 9th Symphony**.

Although this will be Peter's last solo recital in the Cathedral, his alter ego jazz player makes a guest appearance in **"Blues in the Night"** on August 4 at 7.30pm at Adamstown Uniting Church. He will also perform in the **"Festival Choir"** concert of Faure's **"Requiem"**, and the world premiere of David Banney's **"Missa Pace"**, on August 7 at 2.30pm. You can hear him one last time in Newcastle, in the **Festival Finale** on August 14.

We are making the most of our opportunities while Peter is still in town! Make sure you get a chance to say Auf Wiedersehen!

PRE-CONCERT TALK

At 12.30 pm on August 2 at the Cathedral, Australian musicologist and composer Dr John Phillips, whose work and publications on this movement extend back thirty years, will give an illustrated pre-concert talk from the piano about his transcription for organ of the reconstructed finale of Anton Bruckner's 9th symphony. The talk is titled **"From the Verge of Eternity"**. All are welcome. Dr. Phillips writes: "Bruckner was himself a cathedral organist; there is something very appropriate about performing this movement on the organ, and in a cathedral that is very nearly contemporaneous with the composition of the Ninth and with which it shares much of its neogothic aesthetic."





Loving God,


You ask us to love our neighbour as we love ourselves.
