
Feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary

There are certain days in the church year where the music director's job poses a unique challenge – not what to choose, but what to leave out! Christmas, Advent, Lent and Easter, for example, have inspired so much great music that whatever music is chosen, someone will be disappointed that their favourite was not included! The Feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary is certainly one such occasion, and in our services today we do our best to sample the massive repertoire of great music written for this celebration. Our morning service includes Plainsong and Palestrina, and a beautiful Renaissance setting by Leo Hassler of the text *Dixit Maria* - “Mary said to the Angel: Behold I am the handmaid of the Lord, let it be

done to me according to your word.” And our hymns celebrate the story of Mary, as well as her place in the story of Jesus’ incarnation redemptive act – in v. 2 of our epic opening hymn, the poet writes “Oh, that birth forever blessed, when the virgin, full of grace, by the Holy Ghost conceiving, bore the Saviour of our Race”. But perhaps most wonderful of all is our Introit – “Rejoice, virgin mother of God, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you” – in the setting by Rachmaninoff from his Vespers for the Virgin Mary. Rachmaninoff’s music stands in the rich tradition of Russian Orthodox music, and we sing it in Russian, grateful for the tutelage of one of our wonderful choristers, Nataliya Derevyanko.

At Evensong we retrace a fascinating part of music and church history. The early church prohibited the use of any music with a beat – think of any music that could be danced to – for fear that it may inspire licentious thoughts. Plainsong ruled the day until the early years of the Renaissance, when the church began to allow certain dance songs to be sung, but only on feast days. The dances were, as they say these days, already ‘a thing’, known as carols. The ‘carollers’ danced in a circle, and usually the music included a text, either secular or sacred, and always in a skipping rhythm. This evening’s anthem, ‘The Seven Joys’, is an old English carol, either for Christmas or for feast days associated with Mary. The text traces the life of Jesus through the eyes of his mother Mary – his birth, childhood, miracles, death and resurrection.

THE MARTYRS APPEAL 2022

As we think about the sacrifices made for the people they loved by the New Guinea Martyrs – 80 years ago this year – our thoughts may turn to what their priorities might be if they were alive today.

As nurses, teachers, priests and administrators, I believe that they would be horrified at the fact that the people of modern Papua New Guinea are among those with the least access to clean water in the world. And the already disastrous impact of this situation on the health of Papua New Guineans is further heightened at this time when COVID-19 is still silently killing or debilitating so many.

The Martyrs would have been passionate in their response and committed to do something about it.

Fortunately, the indigenous church they served and helped to build up, has a widely networked health system which, with funds from our Australian church supporters, is committed to providing clean water access and hygiene training to communities, schools and health centres in the remote rural areas they serve. With new rainwater tanks, people are less likely to use dirty water for daily drinking and handwashing needs.

Simon, a Community Health Worker in charge of the remote Topura Community Health Post in Dogura Diocese, says this about the water problem... “Water is really a problem in our community especially during dry season.” With a population of 600-700 people, the villagers obtain their drinking water from a creek which collects rubbish and becomes muddy when it rains. However, following installation of a 5000-litre rainwater tank at the health post, Simon can say with gratitude, “Now that the tank is installed, every patient that enters the health post [about 100 each month] has access to clean drinking water and daily washing of hands”.

Your generous support will help us to help the church in Papua New Guinea to provide rainwater tanks to many more villages, health centres and schools, thus reducing the burden of waterborne diseases, which hit small children particularly hard. It will also provide a means of improving hand hygiene and will contribute to stopping the spread of other diseases such as COVID-19. All gifts to this appeal over \$2 are tax deductible. Chamber Music at the Cathedral

Spring into Chamber Music at the Cathedral with an optimistic program of chamber music for flute, strings and piano. An energetic pastoral theme ties together a series of works from the Baroque to the 21st century. Starting with a bouncy Italian baroque trio by Giordani, we move to a set of neo-classical miniature dances by Shostakovich. At the centrepiece of the program are four Slavonic Dances by Dvorak: a Sousedská, a Furiant, a Starodávny and a Kolo, in their original sonorous format of piano 4-hands. A virtuosic trio by Edgar Girtain continues the dance theme in quintessential American style. The concert ends with Haydn's "Gypsy" Piano Trio, so-named because its beautiful early movements are followed by a mad-cap finale incorporating a series of rustic Hungarian dances. A highlight of the concert is our cellist's own composition, "Wind in the Pines".
