ATTENDING WORSHIP: I am very aware of rising COVID-19 infection rates as we come into winter. Finally, this week's poem, is by Malcolm Guite, an English priest and poet, whose work I have quoted many times before. One of the beautiful images, and understandings, of the Trinity, is as dance in relationship. The Greek word, "Perichoresis (from Greek: περιχώρησις perikhōrēsis, "rotation") is a term referring to the relationship of the three persons of the triune God (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) to one another."¹ Guite's poem captures this beautiful sense of music and fluidity and connection and dance.

In the Beginning, not in time or space,
But in the quick before both space and time,
In Life, in Love, in co-inherent Grace,
In three in one and one in three, in rhyme,
In music, in the whole creation story,
In His own image, His imagination,
The Triune Poet makes us for His glory,
And makes us each the other's inspiration.
He calls us out of darkness, chaos, chance,
To improvise a music of our own,
To sing the chord that calls us to the dance,
Three notes resounding from a single tone,
To sing the End in whom we all begin;
Our God beyond, beside us and within.

Music notes

We celebrate Trinity Sunday with colourful and brilliant music of Haydn - his 'Little Organ Mass'. The origin of the title is obscure - the Mass is not especially little, and apart from an organ solo in the Benedictus, the organ is heard only as background to a string trio. To further complicate matters, we sing an alternative Benedictus - in the time of Haydn, the text of the Benedictus was associated with a long series of liturgical actions by the priest, meaning that the musical setting of this text was always very long - much longer than is suitable for our liturgy.

In the month of June each of our communion anthems during the Choral Eucharist is a setting of the text *Tantum ergo*, an ancient text that makes up the last two verses of the hymn *Pange lingua* ('Sing my tongue, the Saviour's glory'). The *Tantum ergo* text is rich in eucharist symbolism:

*Down in adoration falling,
Lo, the sacred Host we hail,
Lo, o'er ancient forms departing
Newer rites of grace prevail:
Faith for all defects supplying,
When the feeble senses fail.*

*To the Everlasting Father
And the Son who comes on high
With the Holy Ghost proceeding
Forth from each eternally,
Be salvation, honor, blessing,
Might and endless majesty.
Amen. Alleluia.*



Latest news from Newton Theological College in Papua New Guinea **Newton Theological College Project** **Update May 2023**

ABM has recently received a report from Acting Principal of Newton College, Bishop Jeffrey Driver, with an update on how things are going at the College.

There is now a full complement of lecturers, so that the students are in good hands. Fr Luscomb Bera returned to the College after completing his Bachelor of Theology and the Catholic Institute in Port Moresby. And Fr Newton Ekoda, whom many ABM supporters will remember as a youth minister, has also joined the College from the Christian Leaders Training College at Mt Hagen.

Currently there are 21 students – 14 final year students and seven students in their first year. These seven (pictured) are already ordained and will complete one year of studies to obtain a Diploma of Ministry.

The long journey to government registration and accreditation continues. As well as working hard to repair buildings and operational infrastructure, the College is in conversation with the Northern Provincial government regarding possible co-location of nursing and teaching colleges on the Newton site. Such a move would make for a much larger and more viable institution which could involve sharing a library, information technology and administration.

The long slow job of building renovation also continues. This year a portable sawmill was purchased by the College, enabling the milling of some of the on-site trees to be used in building. Using material available on-site will significantly reduce the cost of the building renovations. Four carpenters are currently employed for this purpose.

We thank all our supporters who have given so generously over the years to this project, and those who continue to give. Your donations fund vital infrastructure and operating costs, including staff salaries. Please continue to support Newton College, its staff, and students in your prayers as it meets its many challenges in faith, hope and hard work.
